The Apostle Paul's Salvation Story Acts 9:3 – 9

- 1. Deserted by all his lifelong friends. Mistrusted by the group he wanted to join.
- 2. Escaped from death threats.
- 3. Stoned, and drug out of town, and left for dead.
- 4. Strong enough to walk thousands of miles.
- 5. Able to survive an assassination plot by 40 men.
- 6. Five times he was whipped with 39 lashes each time.
- 7. Stripped naked and left in the cold.
- 8. Repeatedly escaping bandits.
- 9. Shipwrecked 3 times.
- 10. Lost in the open sea for a day and a night.
- 11. Beaten publicly with rods 3 times.

- 12. Bitten by a poisonous snake, which he shook off into the fire.
- 13. Repeatedly questioned, threatened, and chased out of different towns.
- 14. Often deprived of food, water, and sleep.
- 15. Falsely arrested numerous times.
- 16. Imprisoned without fair trials.
- 17. Chained to a prison wall for 2 years.
- 18. Isolated in Roman jails and condemned to be executed.
