Live updates: Photo of person of interest in Charlie Kirk assassination released, rifle recovered

Authorities say they have recovered a "high-powered, bolt-action rifle" used in the shooting in a wooded area. A footprint was also recovered.

Conservative activist Charlie Kirk, 31, was shot and killed during an event he was hosting at Utah Valley University in Orem, just north of Provo.

A manhunt for the shooter is ongoing — the FBI and the Utah Public Safety Department both said the shooting was a targeted attack. Today, authorities described the shooter as of college age.

The FBI today asked the public for help in identifying a person of interest in the shooting and released photos. It is offering a reward of up to \$100,000 for information leading to the identification and arrest of the individual(s) involved.

Authorities today said they had recovered the firearm used in the shooting in a wooded area, which they described as a "high-powered, bolt-action rifle." A footprint was also recovered.

Nation on edge: Experts warn of 'vicious spiral' in political violence after Kirk killing

The assassination of right-wing influencer Charlie Kirk marks a watershed moment in a surge of U.S. political violence, one that some experts fear will inflame an already-fractured country and inspire more unrest.

"This event is horrifying, alarming, but not necessarily surprising," said Mike Jensen, a researcher at the University of Maryland, which has tracked such violence in a terrorism database since 1970.

Experts in domestic terrorism cite a convergence of factors for increased violence in the U.S.: economic insecurity, anxiety over shifting racial and ethnic demographics, and the increasingly inflammatory tone of political discourse. Traditional ideological divides — once centered on policy disagreements — have morphed into a deeper, more personal animosity. That anger is amplified by a mix of social media, conspiracy theories and personal grievances.

N.C. officials address crime after fatal stabbing of Ukrainian refugee on public transit
Iryna Zarutsky, 23, who recently immigrated to the United States from Ukraine, was killed last month.

North Carolina officials addressed transit safety concerns Wednesday in the wake of the fatal stabbing of a Ukrainian refugee on Charlotte's public transit system.

Iryna Zarutsky, 23, was killed on a Charlotte Area Transit System train last month. Her fatal stabbing has generated national outrage in recent days after video of the killing was released and the suspect was identified as having a history of violent crimes.

Some local lawmakers said Wednesday that the killing called for expanding Charlotte's police force and mental health services and staffing at the district attorney's office. Others blamed Democratic policies and "woke narratives" and called for overhauling the state's criminal justice system.

"Let's be very clear, crime is a choice, and Democrats have chosen to side with criminals," Jason Simmons, the chairman of the North Carolina Republican Party, said at a news conference. "Their policies of appeasement, their weak on crime policies, their open door and revolving door policies in our criminal justice system and jails have allowed murderers back on the streets, time and time again."
