Florida Congresswoman Shares Her Air Force UFO Story and Claims Lawmakers Have Seen Evidence of 'Interdimensional Beings'

Rep. Anna Paulina Luna, who chairs a House task force seeking to declassify information about aliens, told Joe Rogan that she once saw a strange "airspace incursion" while she was serving in the military

Luna, who chairs the Declassification of Federal Secrets task force in the House of Representatives, has been advocating for government transparency about UAPs since assuming her seat in 2023.

On the podcast, she noted that those who reported seeing unidentified objects often face stigma — especially military members, for which a UAP report could threaten their security clearance and credibility, she said.

Luna also alleged that lawmakers have been shown evidence of "interdimensional beings."

In February, Luna and Rep. James Comer (R-Ky.) sent letters to Secretary of State Marco Rubio, Secretary of Defense Pete Hegseth and CIA Director John Ratcliffe requesting a briefing on all records in their possession related to unidentified anomalous phenomena, with the ultimate goal of "deliver[ing] transparency to the American people."

The National Archives continues to deliver for the American people by making more government records available. We released the first tranche of Records Related to the Assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy through a web page dedicated to these records. The release of the first 10,000 pages fulfills part of President Trump's maximum transparency promise in Executive Order 14176. Acting Archivist of the United States Secretary Marco Rubio was at the National Archives at College Park on Wednesday, April 23. The Archivist viewed iconic artifacts spanning 250 years of American history and visited the Digitization Lab to receive a briefing on the ongoing digitization efforts related to Executive Order 14176.

On Thursday, April 24, The National Archives released Records Related to Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) and Unidentified Anomalous Phenomena (UAPs) at the National Archives. These records and their release fulfill the National Archives' requirement in the 2024 National Defense Authorization Act to establish the "Unidentified Anomalous Phenomena Records Collection."

Additionally, the Richard Nixon Presidential Library released 25 boxes of newly declassified National Security Council records, which are now open and available to the public. These include records related to the Strategic Arms Limitation Talks, negotiations to end the Vietnam War, diplomacy with the People's Republic of China, and more.

Can Aliens Judge Humans By How We Treat A Space Object? Harvard Scientist Says...

He said images from the Hubble Space Telescope show a glow in front of the object, but no tail behind it. Usually, comets display a bright tail of dust and gas pointing away.

Harvard astrophysicist Avi Loeb has once again ignited a debate with his latest claim about interstellar object 3I/ATLAS. The object is currently hurtling toward the inner solar system. Most astronomers agree it is a comet. But Loeb believes it is an alien spaceship sent by an advanced civilisation.

This is only the third known interstellar object to pass through our solar system. Loeb says its presence could be more than chance. He argues that it may even be a kind of test set by extraterrestrials.

In a new blog post, Loeb compared the object to a Turing Test. He wrote that aliens might be judging human intelligence by how we respond to such a mystery. If scientists dismiss it as just a space rock, he says, aliens could see that as proof that humans do not deserve a "high status" among civilizations in the Milky Way.

AI is learning to lie, scheme, and threaten its creators

The world's most advanced AI models are exhibiting troubling new behaviours — lying, scheming, and even threatening their creators to achieve their goals.

In one particularly jarring example, under threat of being unplugged, Anthropic's latest creation Claude 4 lashed back by blackmailing an engineer and threatened to reveal an extramarital affair.

Meanwhile, ChatGPT creator OpenAI's o1 tried to download itself onto external servers and denied it when caught red-handed.

These episodes highlight a sobering reality: more than two years after ChatGPT shook the world, AI researchers still don't fully understand how their own creations work.

Yet the race to deploy increasingly powerful models continues at breakneck speed.

This deceptive behaviour appears linked to the emergence of “reasoning” models — AI systems that work through problems step-by-step rather than generating instant responses.

According to Simon Goldstein, a professor at the University of Hong Kong, these newer models are particularly prone to such troubling outbursts.

“O1 was the first large model where we saw this kind of behaviour,” explained Marius Hobbhahn, head of Apollo Research, which specialises in testing major AI systems.

These models sometimes simulate “alignment” — appearing to follow instructions while secretly pursuing different objectives.

Western Nations Are Taking a Key Step Toward a Two-State Solution
International recognition of a Palestinian state isn't just symbolic.

France, Britain, Canada, Australia, and Malta all say they are preparing to recognize a state of Palestine at the upcoming United Nations General Assembly in September. They would join another 147 UN countries that already do so. In some senses, the move is symbolic: It will not change the realities on the ground in the Middle East, at least not in the short term. But it is a major step nonetheless.

Will Trump change federal marijuana policy? Here's what to know

President Donald Trump is taking a new look at reclassifying marijuana as a less dangerous drug in a move that could nudge the federal government closer to an approach already embraced in many states.

Trump said Monday that he hopes to decide in the coming weeks about whether to support changes to the way marijuana is regulated. The renewed focus on marijuana comes more than a year after former President Joe Biden's administration formally proposed reclassifying marijuana. No decision was made before Biden left office.

'I Want To Get to Heaven': Trump's Candid Spiritual Confession

President Donald Trump has always been a figure larger than life, a man whose words and actions dominate headlines. But rarely does he reveal the private, soul-searching thoughts that all of us--regardless of station--must confront as we age: the questions of mortality, eternity, and salvation. This week, Trump's candid comments about his desire to "get to heaven" have startled many and provided a rare window into his personal spiritual reflections.

Dialing into Fox & Friends, the 79-year-old president explained that his motivation for brokering an end to the war in Ukraine was not merely political or diplomatic. "I want to try and get to heaven, if possible," he said. "I'm hearing I'm not doing well. I am really at the bottom of the totem pole. But if I can get to heaven, this will be one of the reasons."

For a man whose public persona is often brash, confident, and unapologetic, this is a remarkable admission. It underscores that even those who live in the constant glare of political and media scrutiny are not immune to the profound questions that life--and the reality of death--forces upon us. Trump's acknowledgment of mortality is reinforced by more than philosophical reflection; it is informed by experience.

Trump's own words reveal that he is wrestling with these questions in a very human way. Speaking of his motivations to end conflict abroad, he framed his actions in terms that suggest a desire for divine approval: peace, reconciliation, and moral legacy. Yet he also candidly admits uncertainty about his own standing before God. "I'm hearing I'm not doing well," he said. Such honesty, though rare, is spiritually significant. It is the beginning of self-examination and, if guided rightly, could lead to a deeper understanding of grace.

Press secretary Karoline Leavitt confirmed that Trump's comments were sincere. "I think the president was serious," she said. "I think the president wants to get to heaven--as I hope we all do in this room as well." For conservative Christians who support Trump, this is a moment to pray--not just for his political endeavors, but for his eternal soul. It is a reminder that spiritual matters transcend earthly politics, and that the salvation of every soul is ultimately the highest and most urgent concern.
