'The People's Qur'an': Mamdani announces NYC Quran exhibit with book belonging to revolutionary activist

According to the New York Public Library, the Quran is part of its collection retained by the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture

Socialist Mayor Zohran Mamdani announced Tuesday that one of the Qurans he used to be sworn in as the city's first Muslim leader will be kept on display at the main branch of the New York Public Library.

In an X post, Mamdani wrote the Quran belonged to an 18th-century Black scholar and revolutionary activist named Arturo Schomburg.

"When I swore in at midnight at the old City Hall subway station last week, I had the honor of doing so on Arturo Schomburg's 18th-century Qur'an," said Mamdani.

He said that "this manuscript was copied in Ottoman Syria, and is written in black ink with red highlighting the text's divisions — no ornate decoration, it belonged to the everyday reader, and it now belongs to all New Yorkers as part of our City's next chapter."

The new mayor shared a photo of the library display, which features slogans such as "The People's Qur'an" and "Making history at City Hall."

In addition to the book, the display features an image of Mamdani and his wife, Rama Duwaji, at his private New Year's midnight oath-of-office ceremony, in which he was sworn in by New York State Attorney General Letitia James. The display also

features a close-up of the Quran with Mamdani's hand on it as well as an image of Schomburg.

According to the New York Public Library, the Quran is part of its collection retained by the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture.

New York Mayor Mamdani Vows to Enact Democratic Socialist Agenda
Zohran Mamdani signed executive orders, including one establishing a deputy mayor for economic justice.

New York City Mayor Zohran Mamdani quickly advanced his democratic socialist agenda on Jan. 1, passing a series of executive orders and using his inauguration speech to promote collectivism.

“We will replace the frigidity of rugged individualism with the warmth of collectivism,” he said after a swearing-in ceremony in front of City Hall.

After speeches from fellow democratic socialists Sen. Bernie Sanders (I-Vt.) and Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D-N.Y.), Mamdani advocated universal childcare, freezing rents, and making “buses fast and free.”

Hours into his new administration, Mamdani launched a series of changes, such as establishing a deputy mayor for economic justice, a new Office to Combat Antisemitism, and an advisory Commission on Universal After-School. Other developments included a new Office of Community Hiring and Workforce Development, designed to help prepare New Yorkers for “career success and

economic security,” and multiple task forces aimed at catalyzing housing development.

Mamdani, 34, beat out former Democratic Gov. Andrew Cuomo, who ran as an independent, in the mayoral election last year amid intense scrutiny of his socialist ideology. He’s replacing another Democrat, Eric Adams, who has criticized socialism and stood in the crowd as Mamdani suggested the city had left residents behind.

“I stand alongside countless more New Yorkers watching from cramped kitchens in Flushing and barbershops in East New York, from cell phones propped against the dashboards of parked taxi cabs at LaGuardia, from hospitals in Mott Haven and libraries in El Barrio that have too long known only neglect,” he said.

Boos could be heard from the audience after Mamdani mentioned Adams, who ended his 4-year tenure. Adams was indicted in 2024 for alleged bribery, which he has denied, and federal prosecutors later dropped the case under the Trump administration. Despite calls for his resignation, Adams stayed in office and sought reelection before dropping out of the race in late September.

One of Mamdani’s first executive orders rescinded executive orders Adams issued on or after Sept. 26, 2024, the date of his indictment. During his speech on Jan. 1, Mamdani positioned his administration as following in the footsteps of former Mayor Bill de Blasio and his goal of ending inequality.

“I was elected as a democratic socialist, and I will govern as a democratic socialist,” he said. “I will not abandon my principles for fear of being deemed radical.”

Mamdani has called for city-owned grocery stores, taxing the city’s most wealthy, and “Trump-proofing NYC” by keeping U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement officers out of city facilities and increasing legal support for illegal immigrants.

Iran rights NGO says at least 45 protesters killed since start of movement

Iranian security forces have killed at least 45 protesters, including eight minors, in a crackdown on demonstrations that began in late December, the Norway-based NGO Iran Human Rights said on Thursday.

The NGO said Wednesday was the bloodiest day of the now 12-day movement, with 13 protesters confirmed to have been killed. “The evidence shows that the scope of crackdown is becoming more violent and more extensive every day,” said IHR director Mahmood Amiry-Moghaddam, adding hundreds more have been wounded and over 2,000 arrested.

Media inside Iran and official statements have reported at least 21 people killed, including security forces, since the protests began, according to an AFP tally

White House Deputy Chief of Staff says the World must be governed by “Force”

Stephen Miller — once best known as the architect of the Trump administration’s hardline immigration agenda — has emerged as a central figure shaping U.S. foreign policy in the second Trump administration, unsettling diplomats, allies and lawmakers alike.

Long a controversial adviser in domestic policy, Miller's role has expanded well beyond immigration, positioning him as a key voice in strategic debates that would once have been dominated by the State Department and Pentagon.

According to the NY Times, Miller recently made headlines for asserting that Greenland "rightfully belonged" to the United States, a statement that underscores his increasingly assertive and unconventional approach to international affairs.

Miller's comments on Greenland reflect a dramatic escalation in rhetoric from a senior White House official. In an interview, he questioned Denmark's authority over the Arctic territory and suggested that the U.S. could — and should — consider options to acquire it, arguing that "nobody's going to fight the United States militarily" over Greenland's future.

The vast majority of Israelis are worried about declining US support for Israel, survey finds

Four in ten Israelis said they expected support for Israel among younger American Jews to decline.

The vast majority of Israelis — nearly eight in ten — say they are concerned about a decline in support for Israel among the American public, according to a new survey.

The poll of 1,000 Jewish Israeli adults, conducted Dec. 11 by the Ruderman Family Foundation, comes amid a notable decline in support for Israel across the American political spectrum over the course of the war in Gaza.

In September, a poll conducted by The New York Times and Siena University found that, for the first time, American voters sympathized more with Palestinians than Israelis. While support for Israel has long been a hallmark of the Republican party, a June poll also found that sympathy for Israelis had dropped within the GOP over the previous year.

Among younger Republicans, criticism of U.S. support for Israel has risen in the wake of the Gaza war alongside a growth of antisemitic influence, raising alarm among Jewish GOP leadership.

Trumps Board Of Peace Reveal Is Coming Soon - Kings Without Kingdoms?

US said to pitch 'Project Sunrise' — \$112B plan to rebuild Gaza as luxury destination
Reported proposal drafted by top Trump officials Kushner and Witkoff to be completed over 10 years; imagines 'New Rafah' as seat of government, Gaza City as hi-tech 'smart city'

A US proposal to rebuild war-torn Gaza into a high-tech, luxurious coastal destination over the next two decades has been pitched to possible donor countries, according to a report on Friday.

The project, which would cost \$112 billion over the first 10 years, was developed by a team led by US President Donald Trump's son-in-law Jared Kushner and Middle East envoy Steve Witkoff over the past 45 days, the Wall Street Journal reported, citing US officials.

Initially, the US would commit to "anchor" the program by providing \$60 billion, while envisioning Gaza being able to self-fund parts of the proposal as it gets underway, according to the report.
