US Senate panel votes to hold top Covid expert Fauci in contempt

A Republican-led US Senate committee on Thursday voted to hold the country's former top infectious diseases official Anthony Fauci in contempt of Congress, in an escalation of efforts to blame him for potential Covid-19 pandemic missteps.

On the advice of his lawyers, Fauci last week had invoked his constitutional right to stay silent to prevent self-incrimination under antagonistic questioning from Republican senators, as they probed him over unsubstantiated claims that the origins of the pandemic were covered up.

The party-line vote advances the extraordinary effort to prosecute the 85-year-old career government scientist, who spent decades as the nation's top expert in infectious diseases.

FDA approves first mRNA-based flu vaccine

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration on Wednesday approved the United States' first mRNA-based flu vaccine for adults 50 and older, drugmaker Moderna said.

"Flu remains a significant public health challenge, and mFLUSIVA provides an important new option for America's seniors," Moderna CEO Stephane Bancel said in a statement. "This approval also reflects the ongoing potential of our mRNA platform to help address important public health challenges through continued scientific innovation."

The new vaccine was found to be about 27% more effective during the 2024–25 respiratory virus season than standard flu shots in Moderna's study, which enrolled over 40,000 adults 50 and older.

Side effects included injection-site reactions such as pain, tenderness and swollen lymph nodes; fatigue; headache; muscle or joint pain; nausea or vomiting; and fever.

FDA APPROVES MODERNA'S FIRST-EVER mRNA FLU SHOT DESPITE 75.3% ADVERSE REACTION RATE

According to the FDA briefing document, severe systemic reactions were 4× MORE COMMON with the mRNA flu shot than with the traditional flu shot.

In a dark day for MAHA, the FDA has approved Moderna's mFLUSIVA for adults 50 and older, making it the first seasonal mRNA influenza injection authorized in the United States. Adults ages 50–64 received traditional approval, while adults 65 and older received accelerated approval based largely on antibody responses.

The FDA's own briefing document reveals that 75.3% of senior mRNA-vaccine recipients experienced at least one solicited adverse reaction within seven days, compared with 49.3% of those receiving Fluzone High-Dose.

Even more concerning, severe (Grade 3) systemic reactions occurred in 6.7% of mRNA recipients versus 1.7% with the traditional high-dose flu vaccine—nearly four times as frequently.

Even worse, the pivotal efficacy trial contained no placebo group. Instead, Moderna compared mFLUSIVA against traditional flu vaccines.

A novel mRNA injection produced adverse reactions in three out of four recipients, induced severe systemic reactions nearly four times as often as the traditional high-dose vaccine, lacked a placebo-controlled pivotal efficacy trial, and the FDA approved it anyway.

Artificial Intelligence used to design brand new viruses

Artificial Intelligence has been used to design brand new viruses that are fully functional and can replicate in the laboratory, say US researchers.

It is the first time whole genomes have been successfully designed by AI.

The resulting 16 novel viruses were created to infect bacteria and pose no threat to people.

The breakthrough has been labelled a "very significant turning point" in science that could unlock a new era for treating disease. But experts have also warned AI-designed viruses raise "urgent" safety and security concerns.

AI tools are rapidly advancing and have already been used to design new antibiotics.

But that is relatively simple compared with designing a new viable virus from scratch.

"This is a next step in the complexity that's designable by generative AI, this is the first time generative AI has been used to design a complete genome, it's something that can replicate and have other functions inside cells... this was new territory for us," Brian Hie, assistant professor at Stanford University, told the BBC.

Scientists say halving human population could ease pressure on Earth

A gradual decline in the earth's population to about 4 billion people by 2200 could reduce environmental damage and improve long-term living conditions, according to a newly published study.

The research does not advocate removing people from the population or imposing limits on childbirth. Instead, its authors propose allowing the global population to decline naturally over several generations by expanding voluntary family-planning services, improving educational opportunities and empowering women to decide whether and when to have children.

The paper, titled Achieve Sustainability by Easing Population to 4 Billion by 2200, was published in the Wiley journal Sustainable Development. It was written by 11 researchers affiliated with universities and research organizations in the United States, Greece, Australia, Canada, Kenya, Austria, Argentina, Bangladesh, China and India.

Researchers examined eight measures of human impact

The researchers studied global data covering the period from 1970 to 2020. They compared changes in the human population with eight environmental indicators:

Wildlife abundance, measured through the Living Planet Index

Carbon dioxide emissions

Total energy consumption

Humanity's ecological footprint

Freshwater use

Mineral extraction

Plastic production

Agricultural pesticide use

US has used 'virtually all' of its long-range precision missiles during Iran war

The U.S. Army has burned through much of its stockpile of highly accurate long-range missiles during the five-month war with Iran, according to three people familiar with the data, raising concerns about readiness for future conflicts.

The weapons are principally the Army's surface-to-surface systems, ATACMS and the newer Precision Strike Missiles, and two of the sources said the U.S. has used virtually all of them. At more than \$1 million each, the munitions let commanders strike accurately from a safe distance. The drawdown means Trump may have to lean on riskier piloted bombing missions if he relaunches large-scale attacks.

Iran's Hormuz Strait plan reportedly blocks U.S., Israeli ships; U.S. rejects any 'impediments'

U.S. and Israeli ships would be blocked from transiting the Strait of Hormuz under the terms of a draft plan on how to manage the passage, Iranian state news outlet Fars reported. Iran plans to issue penalties of up to 20% of the value of the cargo of those who violate those terms, according to Fars. The U.S. appeared to quickly reject those terms, telling CNBC, “Any temporary routes will be without any impediment.” Iran earlier said a joint statement with Oman on arrangements for the Strait of Hormuz was in the final stages of review and drafting.

Antisemitic assaults in Britain surged by 82% in first six months of 2026 — report

Antisemitic incidents in the United Kingdom rose 21 percent in the first six months of 2026 compared to the same period last year, reaching the second-highest total on record for the first half of a year, according to a new report by the Community Security Trust.

The organization recorded 1,926 anti-Jewish hate incidents between January and June, up from 1,598 during the first half of 2023. The total comes out to an average of 321 monthly incidents, nearly double the figure from before October 7, 2023.

Physical attacks rose sharply, with 135 recorded antisemitic assaults, an 82% increase year-over-year. Incidents in schools jumped 59% to 178, while synagogue-related incidents surged by 31%, CST notes.

Israel Launches ‘Project Nexus’ to Build Homegrown Quantum Platform and Accelerate National AI Push

Israel has launched an ambitious national effort to develop a domestically based quantum computing platform while expanding its push into advanced artificial intelligence.

The Finance Ministry’s Accountant General and the Prime Minister’s Office National AI Directorate issued a tender for “Project Nexus,” which will establish and operate a national

platform providing quantum computing services from within Israel. The government says the project is intended to strengthen Israeli technological sovereignty, reduce dependence on foreign infrastructure and give local researchers and technology companies access to advanced computing capabilities.

Hemispheric says its AI model, trained on EEG data from 100,000 people, can translate a brain's electrical activity to diagnose conditions like PTSD, but tech yet to be proven, expert warns

For over six years, the co-inventor of Apple's FaceID recognition system and an Israeli-American computational neuroscientist pursued this question as their quest to build an artificial intelligence model, which they say promises to decode and understand the complex language of the brain.

Antisemitic conspiracy theories blame Jews for European wildfires, monitor warns

A new wave of antisemitic conspiracy theories is spreading across social media as devastating wildfires burn across Europe, with online users falsely accusing Jews of deliberately starting the blazes for financial and political gain, according to a report released on Monday by the NGO Cyberwell.

The organization warned that the claims are part of what it described as a recurring pattern in which major disasters quickly become vehicles for spreading centuries-old antisemitic myths.

The latest narratives have appeared in multiple languages and across several countries, blaming Jews for wildfires burning this summer in France, Spain, Norway, Greece, Holland, Germany and Italy.

Cyberwell CEO and Founder Tal-Or Cohen Montemayor said that “the same scapegoating stories, once popular in Nazi propaganda during the Third Reich, now trend on every major

social media platform after a crisis. Any major event can become a vehicle for blaming Jews online.”

Pope Leo meets European youth in Assisi visit

Pope Leo XIV was cheered by thousands of young people Thursday before celebrating mass in the Italian city of Assisi, which celebrates this year the 800th anniversary of St Francis’ death.

The US pontiff visited the Basilica of Saint Mary of the Angels, built around the small chapel where Francis of Assisi founded his eponymous order in the 13th century.
