Big Picture: After Violent Attacks on American Jews, the Vast Majority of American Jews Feel Less Safe in the United States.

Key Findings

91% of American Jews say they feel less safe as a Jewish person in the United States due to violent attacks in the past year including the burning of a Jewish governor’s home, the firebombing of Jews in Boulder, CO, and the murders at the Capital Jewish Museum.

78% of American Jews say they feel less safe as a Jewish person in the U.S. because of the October 7, 2023, Hamas terrorist attacks.

More than half (55%) of American Jews say they changed their behavior in the past year out of fear of antisemitism.

86% of American Jews say antisemitism has increased in the U.S. since the Hamas terrorist attacks.

Almost one-third (31%) of American Jews say they have been the personal target of antisemitism—in person or virtually—at least once over the last year.

The vast majority of U.S. Jews (88%) express that seeing or hearing ‘Globalize the Intifada’ would make them feel unsafe as a Jewish person in the U.S. to some degree—ranging from “not too unsafe” (19%) to “somewhat unsafe” (42%) to “very unsafe” (27%). By comparison, just 12% of U.S. Jews say the phrase would not make them feel unsafe at all.

American Jews are Deeply Concerned about Social Media and Artificial Intelligence

73% of American Jews, say they have experienced antisemitism online—either by seeing or hearing it or by being personally targeted. For the first time, this number has risen above seven in 10 in the history of AJC’s State of Antisemitism in America Report.

65% of American Jews say they are concerned that generative AI chatbots such as Grok, ChatGPT, or Claude will spread antisemitism.

69% of American Jews say they are concerned that information and misinformation shared by generative AI chatbots will lead to antisemitic incidents.

Young American Jews’ Experience with Antisemitism

Nearly half (47%) of young American Jews say they were the personal target of antisemitism in the last year, compared to 28% for those age 30 and over.

42% of American Jewish college students report experiencing antisemitism during their time on campus.

One in four (25%) American Jewish college students say they have felt or had been excluded from a group or an event on campus because they are Jewish.

Where the American General Public Stands

70% of U.S. adults say antisemitism is a problem in the U.S. today.

The majority (63%) of U.S. adults say antisemitism in the U.S. has increased since the Hamas terrorist attacks.

45% of U.S. adults reported personally seeing or hearing any antisemitic incidents in the last 12 months, of these respondents, 74% have seen or heard antisemitic incidents online or on social media.

The Nazi drag queen

Cincinnati Pride welcomed Jews back after two fraught years — then featured a performer giving Hitler salutes beside signs saying Zionists did not belong

Then Cincinnati Pride featured drag artist Judith Iscariot as “Schutzstaffel Sam” – a deliberate reference to the Schutzstaffel (SS), who operated the concentration camp system and much of the Nazi regime’s Holocaust. Iscariot fused Uncle Sam with Third Reich iconography: a stars-and-stripes suit, Reich-style cap, swastika armband and gold boots. She later said the character represented the “American Reich.”

For more than 20 minutes, Schutzstaffel Sam marched through the parade repeatedly performing the Sieg Heil with a pointed finger. On the main stage, protesters carried signs reading “Zionism Has No Place at Pride,” “Guardians of Pedophiles” and “One Day This Country Will Wake Up to His Obituary.”

Schutzstaffel Sam then raised a gold pistol and fired into Lady Liberty’s head. As Liberty collapsed, Iscariot twerked over her body, stomped on it and ended with another Nazi salute.

Meet the far-left insurgents waging war on the Democratic establishment in 2026 midterms

DSA-backed candidates in Missouri, Michigan and Wisconsin are riding momentum from socialist wins in New York and Colorado

The high-stakes fight between the left-wing and the center-left establishment for the future of the Democratic Party is moving to a much larger stage.

After victories by far-left and socialist candidates in dark blue congressional districts in New York City and Colorado the past couple of weeks drew plenty of national attention, the spotlight now shifts to Midwestern battlegrounds.

Hours after Democratic Socialists of America (DSA) backed challenger and first-time candidate Melat Kiros toppled 15-term Democratic Rep. Diana DeGette in last week's primary in Denver's deep blue 1st Congressional District, former Rep. Cori Bush of Missouri predicted on social media: "On August 4th, St. Louis will do the same."

A trio of far-left congressional candidates' victories heavily supported by socialist New York City Mayor Zohran Mamdani have emboldened progressives as they try to turn their upsets into a far-left national pressure campaign against the Democratic Party.

Only socialism can solve decades of capitalist mismanagement in the US. Our newly elected leaders will fight for the working class — not for crumbs," the DSA proclaimed in a social media post celebrating the string of primary election victories.
