Bob Stecher

My name is Bob Stecher. My wife Deb and I have lived in Canton GA., for the past 12 years. We were married in St. Martin in the Fields in Atlanta before moving to Rome, GA. While in Rome, I was received into the Episcopal church. I began my service in the Episcopal church while at St. Peters in youth ministry and working on the only men's breakfast team. We moved a few times and landed in Naperville, IL in 1989 where we attended St. John's Episcopal Church. Deb and I served as Youth ministers for our first few years there and I started the men's breakfast ministry.

I began my vestry career at St John's. I was on vestry 3 times and held positions of Jr. and Sr. Warden on each of those vestry terms. My Sr. Warden position was extended for a 2nd year through all three of my vestry assignments, one of which was for transition and Rector search and another for building campaign.

We moved to Canton in 2008 and began attending St. Aidan's immediately. Deb and I were youth ministers for the junior high students until a "Youth Minister" was hired. I was on a men's breakfast team, served as a vergier, lector and Eucharistic minister. I returned to vestry life and was asked in my second year to serve as Sr. Warden. After vestry I was asked to be treasurer temporarily as our previous treasurer had left. I left St. Aidan's November of 2017. Ministry: Founding Editor of Advent Meditation booklet, Stephen Minister, Assisted Children's Ministry, Unidad Kitchen Ministry

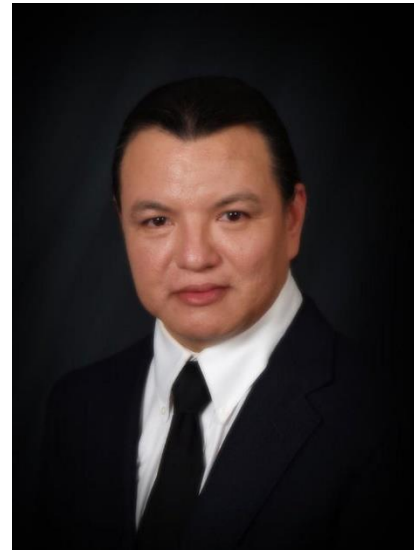
