Our Pentecost worship series | **Say it out loud!**

The Season after Pentecost features what Christ teaches, and Christians in every vocation are encouraged to say it out loud. The truths of God's Word are good for the soul, useful for life, and more reliable than anything else in the world. Watch out for false teachers who come with wise sounding words and pious promises, but who do not base everything on the Word of God! Give thanks to the Lord for faithful servants in the ministry of the gospel and those who support them!

Today's worship theme | **Keep the Faith**

Believers in God and their ministers have always been persecuted. Religious leaders in Jerusalem tried to muzzle the truth, but they only succeeded in sending people to preach the Word throughout the land. The Roman Empire persecuted Christians with stakes and lions, but God's Church exploded with growth. In Martin Luther's day, both pope and emperor tried to limit the gospel movement that was spreading from Germany, but God led many people to speak his truth. God wants his people to keep the faith and preach the Word even in the face of opposition.

Our prayer before worship | **to keep the faith in the face of worldly opposition and pressures**

O Triune God, your threefold name was placed upon us when we were baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. And this day we worship you, three divine persons in one God. Grant us the grace to continue in this faith until we join the hosts of heaven that cry, "Holy, holy, holy," before your heavenly throne. 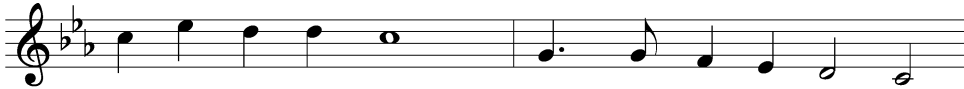

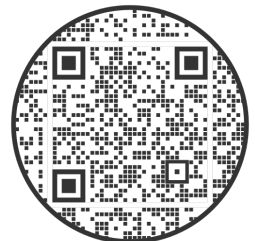

District Convention Notes

Last week (June 9-11), several representatives from our congregation attended the South Atlantic District Convention. In addition to the worship services and fellowship opportunities there were reports and discussions concerning the synod's ministry plan (both reviewing the previous year and looking ahead to the future). Here are some notes:

- The financial situation for the synod overall is healthy and stable, but has not kept up with inflation. The more that we are able to support not only our local ministry but also the synod at-large, the more that we will be able to share God's Word.
- The 100-in-10 initiative begun by Home Missions in 2023 is still going well, but may have to 'pump the brakes' a bit. While there are still many opportunities to start new mission congregations (and enhance existing ones), the numerical limits of ministry candidates and financial resources makes a slower pace the wiser option.
- After a survey that widely sampled WELS leadership, a judicious use of AI is being pursued at the synod level. We are not "all-in" nor are we avoiding it completely, but recognizing the tool that AI can provide while also valuing and centering human input, involvement, and leading WELS seeks to use this new tool well and faithfully.
- President Charles "Chuck" Westra did not seek reelection as our District President, and so our 1st Vice President, Jon Schroeder was elected to take his place.
- Thank you for the privilege of serving our congregation and district!
