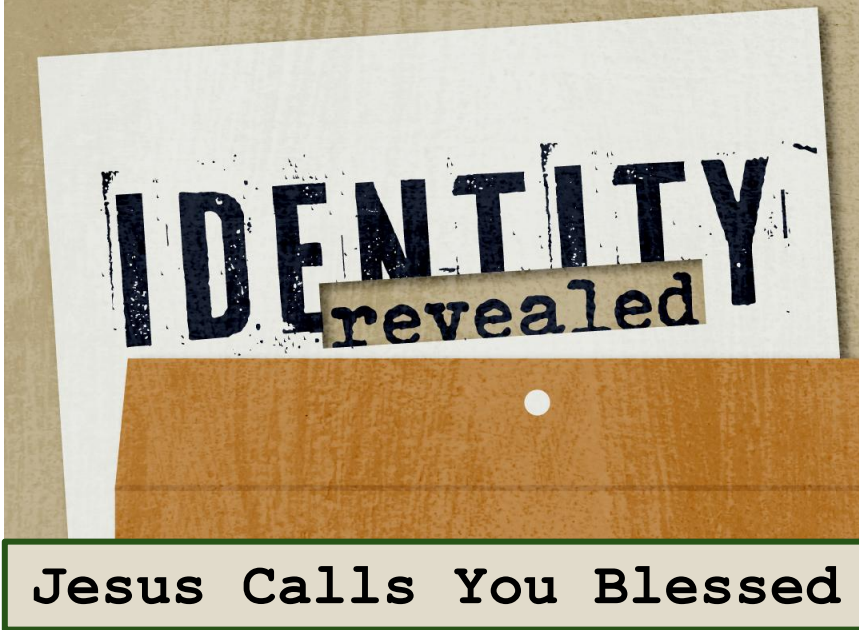




St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church
