Dear Beloved Community,

Why do we do what we do at Sierra Vista United Methodist Church? Everything we do is to "Spread the Love of Jesus"! We do this through our many ministries, which are the product of your time, talents, treasures, testimony, and prayers. Numerous ways exist to be a steward of what our church does. In Matthew 25:40, Jesus told us "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Therefore, we are challenged to "Be The Light!"

Our ministries provide security for many in our community. Our food security ministries serve others through our food pantry, our produce ministry, our partnership with the Southern Arizona Food Bank, and our cooking support to Good Neighbor Alliance. r health security ministries include exercise classes, as well as one designed for Parkinsons sufferers, hosting blood drives for the American Red Cross, an Alcoholics Anonymous support group, grief support groups, a medical equipment lending closet, building ramps for low-income, permanently disabled neighbors, and comfort shawls and protheses provided by our KnitWits. We provide financial security through the Pastor's Discretionary Fund and community partners like St. Vincent DePaul and Good Neighbor Alliance. We provide educational security through Helping Hands Tutoring and plan to re-start English as a Second Language and Citizenship classes. We have opportunities throughout the year to partner with Huachuca Mountain Elementary School and support our very own Village Christian Pre-School. We financially support monthly special causes worldwide through additional offering opportunities.

2 Peter 3:18 tells us to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." Our Worship ministries extend well beyond in person and online services, including regular worship and special services throughout the year and outreach to Mountain View Gardens. Many hands are involved in every service. We have Christian education opportunities, music ministries, and small group ministries for a wide range of interests. Food is a key component to fellowship, and we sponsor regular opportunities to break bread together.

Dear Friends,

On Friday, your US Residential Bishops received an internal memo from the chair of the Council of Bishops (COB) Immigration Task Force sharing important urgent information regarding "the tragic saga of the current approach to immigration enforcement that especially targets children." The memo contained information from the National Immigration Litigation Alliance as well as advise on action items.

Here are the salient points of that memo:

Beginning October 3, 2025, ICE launched an operation reportedly named "Freaky Friday," targeting unaccompanied children aged 14 and older of all nationalities.

Children detained and released will be sent a "threat" letter from ICE threatening indefinite detention and immediate transfer to ICE upon age-out if they do not waive jurisdiction under the TVPRA and withdraw applications for relief.

Children will be offered \$2,500 to return to their countries of origin.

If children do not comply with the "offer", the letter intimates their parents in the US will be arrested.

ICE plans to detain all children who reach the age of 14 and are ready to be released from detention, and they anticipate legal challenges.

There are indications that the age threshold for this threat letter may be lowered to 10 years old.

We understand they plan to first target detained children but will also target children released from custody.

Given this alarming information, the following actions are strongly encouraged, especially for those who have and/or work with immigrant families in their congregations:

Provide Know Your Rights presentations to the families of children in ICE custody advising them of this plan and their right to not sign anything document without consulting their attorney.

Consider advising the families of immigrant children out of ICE custody about the possibility of receiving an ICE letter.

If a child receives a letter, please consider helping them to prepare an affidavit that particularly highlights the manner in which this ICE letter was delivered (was counsel present and able to advise, were youth able to ask questions), evidence of coercion or intimidation, underlying fear of being returned to the country they immigrated from. Litigators are coordinating and the COB Immigration Task Force will provide more information shortly on who to direct these affidavits to.
