### Prayer Word: Belonging (Week 3) by Pastor Carl



Some people join groups with the purpose of undermining them. Sometimes this is good when those persons reveal the hidden motives of people in the group or the hidden agendas. Sometimes those persons undermine good groups to point out the shortcomings of a few people or perhaps only one. Judas was a disciple, a close friend, of Jesus. He belonged to Jesus' inner circle, as it were. Judas understood the Messiah to be the one who would overthrow the conquering and oppressive government to restore the people of Israel to independent rule, but Jesus did not take that path. Jesus sought for each of us to overthrow the things, the beliefs, the lies that govern our hearts and interfere with our relationships with God and with other people. When we belong to God, the suffering of people becomes clearer and we are moved by God to do something about it. When we act differently, when we align ourselves with groups that assert power or authority over other groups, we have betrayed Jesus, just the same as Judas did. Judas placed power and position of worldly affairs ahead of the power and authority of God in his heart. To whom does your heart belong? Where have you placed your allegiance?



# Better Meals



"Better Meals" is a program that pays off the school meal debt that kids and their families have accrued over the past years. The schools still offer kids the meals they need to eat, but the schools are carrying the overdue payments from families that cannot afford to pay for the meals. We all know that inflation has been tough on people to afford groceries and pay bills. Here is a chance for us to lend a hand in our community.

Joe McDermott, who helped establish the Better Bucks and now the Better Meals programs, provides this list of schools and the outstanding debts each one is carrying (as of February 1st, 2024):

Village Meadows: \$3,554.85 Town & Country: \$2,278.85 Joyce Clark MS: \$991,95 Pueblo Del Sol: \$2,278.85 Huachuca Mountain: \$2,351.19 Carmichael: \$152.19

Bella Vista: \$760.88 Buena HS: \$338.85


