Start Talking. Find a conversation starter for your group.

- What are you looking forward to?
- Who is the most famous person you have ever met?

Head: Start Thinking. Ask a question to get your group thinking.

Read Luke 8:4-15. Can you think of people you've met that fit the four categories described? Have you ever felt like you're one of the first three, instead of the last?

Heart: Start Sharing. Choose a question to create openness.

- Use a question from N.T. Wright's "Luke: For Everyone" (pg. 53-54).
- Does a normal farmer sow seed on paths, rocks, or thorns? What does it tell you about God that He sows the seed everywhere? Is he picking and choosing who to try to save?
- In Luke 8:4-15, Jesus quotes Isaiah 6:9. What does this tell us about different people's openness to the word of God? Why do some people not perceive or understand?
- How can we help people move out of the first three categories in Luke 8:4-15 and be transformed into the last?

Hands: Start Doing. Commit to a step and live it out this week.

- What is one thing I can do this week to make sure I'm "Good soil" for God's Word?
- What's something I can do this week to help clear some of the obstacles that get in the way of non-believers in my life receiving Jesus?
- What's one thing I can do this week to help other believers grow and mature in their faith?

Start Praying. Be bold and pray with power.

"Father God, help me to cling to your Word and allow it to bear fruit in my life and those around me. Make my discipleship and witness fruitful soil for those on my journey whom Jesus is seeking. Please give me a bountiful harvest and steadfast endurance." Amen.
