



Dear Church Family,

I've been reflecting lately on the beauty of worship throughout Scripture, and I wanted to share a simple encouragement with you. One of the amazing things we see from Genesis to Revelation is how God's people have always worshiped through both depth and repetition.

In Psalm 136, the people of God repeat the same joyful declaration twenty-six times:

"His steadfast loves endures forever."

In Isaiah 6 and Revelation 4, the heavenly beings continually cry, "Holy, holy, holy."

Repetition has always been a natural part of worship—not because God's people lacked words, but because some truths are worth lingering over.

Another beautiful reminder from Scripture is how it describes worship itself. The Bible uses the word "hymn" simply to mean a sacred song offered in praise to God. That's a wide and wonderful umbrella— a reminder that God receives the worship of His people in many expressions, across many generations.

From the song of Moses after the Red Sea.....

To David's psalms......

To the hymns of the early church......

To the songs we lift up today......

We are part of the same great, ongoing story of worship.

What a privilege it is to join our voices with the people of God across centuries and cultures, offering our praise to the same faithful Lord. My heart is grateful for the way our church family worships together with sincerity, joy, and love for Jesus.

Let's continue to lift His name high—united in purpose, thankful inspirit, and eager to glorify the One who is worthy of every song we sing.



### Wandi's Corner

Real Good Pound Cake From Audrey Best



1 cup of Crisco

4 whole eggs

1 cup of sweet milk

1 1/2 cup self-rising flour

2 1/2 cups of cake flour 1/2 teaspoon of vanilla

2 cups of sugar

Cream Crisco, sugar, milk, and eggs one at a time. Add one cup of flour and beat for 1 minute. Add the other 1/2 cup of flour and the cup of milk and mix well. Add in flavoring. Bake at 325 degrees for 1 hour.
