These questions are designed to help you talk about God's word and Pastor Brian's message with friends and family. "THE ALREADY AND THE NOT YET" | LUKE 17: 20-37 | PASTOR BRIAN BELL

WARM-UP QUESTION: If there was a flood or fire threatening your home, what would you probably try to save?

"The Already" (Luke 17: 20-21)

Jesus tells the Jews looking for the kingdom of God that it won't come in ways that can be observed, hinting at the fact that he wasn't the type of king they were looking for. What type of king do many people look for? How is Jesus different?

"The Not Yet" (Luke 17: 22-37)

Jesus tells his disciples that when Judgment comes, many people will be going about their lives, pursuing their goals and desires. What about daily life makes it hard to prepare for Jesus coming again? How should people prepare?

Jesus warns his disciples that when Judgement does come, the people too attached to their stuff and lives will suffer. How can followers of Jesus be focused on Him and less attached to their lives?

REFLECTION QUESTION:

Jesus' warning here is about Hope. People who Hope for Him and His Return will not fear losing their stuff, routines, connections or experiences. But people who look back and try to save their earthly lives show their hope is in all those things and not in King Jesus. Where do you place your Hope? How would Hoping for Jesus affect how you lived today? Pray that God will help you let go of earthly things that would hold you back and to run towards Him.

Luke 17:20-37

II. Slide13 Intro: The Already and The Not Yet

A. MLK*Jr* said, *Our lives <u>begin to end</u>*, *the day we become silent about things that matter*. Here Jesus reminds us all of *the things that matter* regarding His kingdom.

B. Title: The Already and the Not Yet.

- 1. The kingdom has been inaugurated, yet has not yet been consummated.
- 2. The kingdom has come (1st coming) and is coming (2nd coming).
 - a) And we *live in-between* the already and the not yet.
 - b) Jesus will 1st speak about *the already* in vs.21,22 w/the Pharisees, Then He will speak about the *not yet* w/the disciples vs.22-37.
 - (1) Then ch.18 begins w/until then, what are we supposed to do?We are always to pray and not lose heart.
- C. Slide14 3 months ago, Eli Manning had a *team of makeup artist* disguise himself, and then went as a walk-on at Penn State, as a quarterback. Chad Powers (or *Fast Chad*, speaking to himself in the 3rd person)
 - 1. They did not know that *Eli Manning* was in the midst of them.

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2. We step on the field today, and the Pharisees did not know it was The King of The Kingdom of God, standing in their midst.

III. Slide15 THE ALREADY (20,21)

A. PHARISEES ASK WHEN? (20)1

- B. They knew Jesus was *on His way to Jerusalem* and of course *were looking for a political, military, and materialistic earthly kingdom now.* see 19:11
- C. The kingdom of God is not coming in ways that can be **observed** (*observed* only time in NT) means "*to lie in wait, to spy*." (TDNT)
 - 1. Jesus cautions us not to devote our time to *spying on the future* and *trying to second-guess God*.
 - 2. They misunderstood *the nature of the kingdom,* and thus missed its present reality.

D. JESUS ANSWERS WHERE (21)

- E. Jesus said, *Don't look at <u>when</u> but where*. It was in their midst, within their reach.
 - 1. Jesus was saying, if you're looking for a **kingdom**, then you must desire to be with the **King**. I'm the King, thus My kingdom is right here!
- F. The term kingdom used by Jesus means **reign**, *not realm*. [reign = where he rules]
 - a) Thus he seeks to rule where? ... within you, or in your heart!
 - 2. If He doesn't reign in your heart now, you won't live in His realm later.

IV. Slide16 THE NOT YET (22-37)

- A. Slide17 RUMORS ABOUT THE 2ND COMING (22-24)
 - FICTION (22,23) False reports will say, *he had returned to this place or another place*. The days are coming when I won't be here among you. When I'm away ... don't be seduced.

- 2. FACTS (24)
- 3. Unlike *the already*, which was quiet and humble, the *not yet* will be as obvious as lightning.
- B. Slide18 PREREQUISITE BEFORE THE 2ND COMING (25)
- C. He will 1st be rejected and crucified. *The cross is the heart of God's purpose, & the key to His kingdom.*
- D. Slide19a CONDITIONS EXISTING AT THE 2ND COMING (26-30)
- E. When He returns he **won't** find everybody ready & waiting for Him.
 - 1. Nope, things will be going on just as they were before 2 OT judgments were about to take place.
- F. Ps: I do not believe He is speaking about the Rapture here, but about judgment before entering the kingdom (2nd Coming).²
 - 1. Both men lived just before great judgments.
 - 2. Slide19b SIMILAR TO CONDITIONS IN DAYS OF NOAH (26-27)
 - 3. In the days of Noah it was business as usual.
 - a) Today Jesus would say, they were going down to the park, meeting up at coffee shops, going into the office, and no one was prepared.
 - 4. Lots wife she had every warning to flee Sodom, her family was with her, yet she still looks back. It was more than *the physical act* of just looking back. She looked back because of what she loved.
 - a) She could get out of Sodom, but she couldn't get Sodom out of her.
 - b) Her feet were running, but her heart was staying. Alistair Begg
 - 5. When the Son of Man returns, it will be like a rerun of Noah and Lot. People will be absorbed in daily life, absorbed in things, not looking for the Savior and Judge to appear.

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- a) The same problem will exist when Jesus ushers in *His Kingdom*. People will <u>ignore</u> the warnings and will just keep living life up to the time of destruction.
- 6. SIMILAR TO CONDITIONS IN DAYS OF LOT (28-30)
- 7 In the same way with the materialistic, indifferent people of Sodom (eating, drinking, buying, selling, planting, & building) were also not prepared for God's judgment (Gen.19).
 - a) They were living in sin, and oblivious to God.
 - b) What will the world be like just before the final judgment and the coming of the Lord? It will be *business as usual*.
- 8. They lost the **best** by living for the **good**.
 - a) It's a dangerous thing to *get so absorbed in the pursuits of life* that we forget Jesus is Coming!
- 9. Jesus consistently taught the **certainty** of the fact of <u>His Coming</u>, but the **uncertainty** of the <u>time</u>.³
- G. Slide20a WARNING CONCERNING THE 2ND COMING (31-33)
 - 1. Let me again say, this section is not talking about the Rapture. It is talking about the middle of the tribulation.
 - a) They were told *not to linger* (people of Jerusalem). Don't go downstairs and get anything, *not even your photo albums*, get out quick.
 - b) See during the tribulation, the antichrist will oppress the <u>earth</u>, <u>but especially</u> *Jerusalem*, which becomes Ground-Zero.
 - c) Zechariah 13 people try to flee Jerusalem. Only 1/3 make it, 2/3 or destroyed. The 1/3 will be *kept secure* in a place Rev.12:6-17 tells us.
 - d) The word taken is not referring to *the rapture*, but will be taken in judgment.
 - (1) As the reference he gave with <u>both</u> Noah & Lot, the people were *taking away in judgment*.

- 2. RUN FOR YOUR LIFE ... or for Salvation!
- 3. Don't wait, don't hesitate; make the decision now before it's too late. Delay could be fatal!
 - a) Whoever tries to keep his life, by going back for his goods, will lose it.4
- 4. (32) Remember Lot's wife 1 of the shortest vss in the Bible.
 - a) Jesus is commanding us to remember someone whose <u>name</u> we never knew! Nor anything she ever <u>said</u> or <u>did</u> is recorded in Scripture, and yet the Lord wants us to *remember her*.
 - b) The only thing to remember about her is that she was the one who "looked back!" [Looking back i.e. grieving over the imminent loss of her material comforts and high social position among her ungodly neighbors]
 - c) Slide20b 2 Cor.5:15 And He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for <u>Him</u> who died for them and was raised again.
- 5. (33) Brian how does this help me today? Slide20c The hope of The Future Coming affects present actions and values.
 - a) *The life you save is the life you lose*. The life you, *clutch, hoard, guard, and play safe with* is in the end, *a life worth little to anybody, including yourself*; and only a life **given away** for love's sake is a life **worth living**.
 - b) If we genuinely embrace His sacrifice, *you will joyfully embrace a sacrificial life*. (Erwin McManus)
 - (1) God's will for us is less about our <u>comfort</u> than it is about our **contribution**.
 - (2) God would never choose for us <u>safety</u> at the cost of **significance**.
 - (3) God created you so that your life would **count**, not so that you could <u>count the days of your life</u>.

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H. Slide21 JUDGMENT FOLLOWING THE 2ND COMING (34-37)

- 1. THE SEPARATION (34-36)
 - a) 2 in a bed: 1 taken the other left (34). 2 grinding grain: 1 taken the other lft (35)2 working in a field: 1 taken, the other left (36).
 - (1) You could be so close to someone and yet there will be *an eternity of separation between you*. [whether family members or coworkers]
- 2. Some will be *taken* into judgment.
 - a) In some parts of the world it will be nighttime (they'll be in bed).In other parts of the world it will be daytime (they'll be doing daily tasks).
 - b) The taken away means taken away to Judgment. Not taken up in the Rapture.
 - (1) The ones left are those who will enter into the kingdom.
 - (2) The sheep were told, *Come* you blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.
 - (3) The goats were told, *depart from Me you cursed*.
- 3. THE SLAUGHTER (37)
- 4. (37) The disciples then ask, Where Lord? ... where what?
 - a) And then we're hoping that Jesus clears it all up, and he says *where the corpse is there the vultures will gather*. Thank you Jesus. I appreciate that.
 - (1) I'm just gonna start saying that when I want to end a conversation, Where the corpse is, there the vultures will gather ... praying for your brother.
- 5. When I was driving through San Luis Obispo this week, I saw a whole committee of *turkey vultures* (a dozen) sitting by the road side. Which meant what? There is a dead carcass somewhere nearby. (yep, deer)
 - a) The question is where does his judgment take place? Answer is everywhere. His **judgment** can come at *anytime, anyplace, any day or night, while you are at home or school or at the office.*

- I. There is a big difference between *the marriage supper of the Lamb & the supper of the Great God*. Rev.19:17,18 where an angel summons all birds to come eat of the carnage.
- J. End: In our country we are innocent, until proven ... guilty. But not so with God.
 - 1. Because of the **fall**, because of **sin**, because we are **sinners by nature**, and **by choice**, we are all guilty until proclaimed innocent.
 - 2. When you trust in Christ, that's all it takes. He proclaims you free and innocent.
 - 3. So *the righteousness of religion* never cuts it, but trusting in Jesus does.
 - 4. Only 1 reason Jesus has not returned yet, *so you would be ready!* Respond accordingly! Then you won't face Him as judge, but will welcome Him as Savior.

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
