"LIVING ON THE EDGE OF TOMORROW" | MARK 13: 28-37 | PASTOR BRIAN BELL

WARM-UP QUESTION:

Who or what comes to mind when you think of someone on the lookout for someone else?

"Parable of the Fig Tree" Mark 13: 28-31

Jesus reminds His followers that the signs of the end times will show Jesus' return is near, and that His word endures forever. **How does knowing Jesus returns in the end help people endure tough times?**

"The Parable of the Watchman" Mark 13: 32-37

Jesus shares a parable of a master leaving and telling servants to stay awake to wait for his return, not knowing when he'll come. What does it mean to look for Jesus and not focus on the signs of end times? What's your reaction to Jesus sharing only the Father knows when the end will happen?

Jesus repeats the command to "stay awake" at least 3 times in different ways as He shares about His second coming. **How can a**Christ-follower live in a way that shows they are being watchful like Jesus commands?

REFLECTION QUESTION:

Jesus shares two parables to teach His return will be swift and sudden, so His followers should be watchful, living faithfully, serving and anticipating His glory, trusting in His word. If Jesus came back today, how would you react? What does that reveal about your heart? How can you live with a more watchful focus this week? Ask God to live through you to increase your faithfulness and hope.

Mark 13:28-37 8-24-25

Living on the Edge of Tomorrow

I. Announce:

- A. Welcome to those joining us online 2nd Service.
- B. Slide1-5 Cam: Baptism. CG. Women's. CK. FPU.
- C. Slide Missions Prayer: Today at 1:30pm in the Agape Room.
- D.*Additional Seating: We will be moving our *additional seating* at our **10am service** to the Fellowship Hall beginning Sun, Sept. 7. (Please still use it in-between services, & 1st & 3rd)
- E. Slide7 Tomorrow marks "Rohingya Genocide Remembrance Day" 8 years later.

 On Aug. 25, 2017, the Rohingya people faced unspeakable violence and mass displacement, leaving hundreds of thousands without home or country.

 Many remain stateless today, living in refugee camps or scattered across nations, including Nepal, where we have the privilege of walking alongside them.

 As a church, we pause to remember their suffering, to honor their resilience, and to recommit ourselves to prayer and action. We remember that every Rohingya man, woman, and child bears the image of God, and we long for the day when justice rolls down like waters and righteousness like a mighty stream (Amos 5:24).
- F. Prayer: Lord, we pray for **healing**, for **hope**, and for **the day** when the Rohingya will **know** *You*, *peace*, *dignity*, *and a secure home*.

II. Slide8 Intro: Living on the Edge of Tomorrow

- A.Illust: Remember on Thanksgiving day 2003, President George W. Bush flew to Iraq under the cover of darkness to dine with U.S. forces at a Baghdad International Airport mess hall. Bush's surprise trip delighted troops and stunned the nation.
 - 1. Sometimes our *Commander and Chief* shares his schedule with us ... other times it is <u>Top Secret</u>.
 - 2. Sometimes our *Heavenly Commander & Chief* shares His schedule with us other times it is *Top Secret, classified, confidential, hush-hush*.

- a) When we study the End Times we notice with **Israel** He <u>shares</u> His schedule; Regarding **The Church**, it's *Classified*, *confidential*, *hush-hush*.
- B. Here, Jesus winds down the Olivet discourse with 2 parables:
 - 1. The 1st parable of the fig tree emphasize knowing that His coming is near.
 - a) The 2nd parable of the watchman emphasizes not knowing the time of His return
 - 2. The 1st seems to wrap up speaking to the 7 yr Tribulation folks.
 - a) The 2nd is to All believers of Every age.

III. Slide9a THE PARABLE OF THE FIG TREE (28-31) Read

- A. The Fig Tree has special association with Israel. (Mark 11)
 - 1. The people living during the Tribulation will be able to watch these things occur and will know that His coming is near. (you know 2 x's)
 - 2. This assurance will help them endure till the end. vs.13
- B. The fig tree's leaves appear, summer follows. If summer is near, then *the harsh* winter of the Tribulation is <u>past</u>.
 - 1. <u>Just as</u> Daniel prophesied in 12:11, *The end will come 1,290 days after the abomination of desolation* (middle of Trib). In this, Jesus assured that the agonies of the great tribulation *would not continue* <u>indefinitely</u>; they will have <u>an end</u>.
- C. Slide9b (31) **My words** will not pass away we've heard Is.40:8 *The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever.*
 - 1. Here now, Jesus puts *His words* on equal footing w/the OT Scriptures.
- D. We as believers do not depend on <u>signs</u>, we depend on <u>His unchanging Word</u>. Slide9c As Peter said, *We have the prophetic word more fully confirmed*. 2 Pt.1:19
 - 1. The context was the Transfiguration in the preceding few vss. I will sum up 2 Pet.1:16-18. Peter, James/John said, we were eyewitnesses of his majesty (16). Peter said, we ourselves heard this very voice borne from heaven (This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased) (17,18a). Then said, for we were with him on the holy mountain/Transfiguration) (18b).

- E. What was the <u>purpose</u> of the **Transfiguration** any ways?
 - 1. It was an open display *for the disciples* of **the glory** Jesus had *before* the Incarnation.
 - 2. A mountain was often a place of revelation and *Moses, Elijah, & Jesus* all had their *most intimate experiences of God* on a Mountain top.
 - a) Moses met w/God and received the Law on Mnt. Sinai.
 - b) **Elijah** found God on **Mnt. Horeb**, not in the wind, & not in the earthquake, but in the still small voice. It was on **Mnt. Carmel** where Elijah saw God respond *visually w/fire* to defeat his enemy.
 - c) **Jesus** gave the **Beatitudes** on a mnt; Was found **praying** on a mnt; was found **resting** & **healing** on a mnt; after His Res He meets the disciples on a mnt. in Galilee; His 3 famous **discourses** were given on a mnt. (bread of life; sermon on the mnt; Olivet). He also **Ascends** from Mnt Olivet. And His **Return** is to the same.
 - 3. We have Christ's Transfiguration as *another assurance* that His kingdom *is coming*.
 - a) Assuredly, I say to you, there are some standing here who shall not taste death till they see the Son of Man coming in His kingdom (Mt.16:28).

 And then Mt.17 goes right into the Transfiguration (as do Mrk/Lk). And so we see the linkage between the Mount experience & the 2nd coming.
- F. *note the change: They (trib saints) are to watch for Signs We watch for *The Savior*!

IV. Slide10 THE PARABLE OF THE WATCHMAN (32-37) Read

- A. No one knows so far everything has been calc'd out down to the day in dealing w/ Israel. Now in dealing with **the church**, time is *deliberately unspecific*.
- B. Many people have speculated about **the date** of Christ's return and they all have one thing in common ... they have all been **wrong**.
 - 1. So we are not to look for signs but to look for Him.

- 2. Remember, we are on the welcoming committee not on the planning committee.
- 3. We must learn to live in the tension between: *readiness for Jesus return* and *planning for generations to come*.
- C. Slide11 We distinguish: Christ coming for His church & Christ coming with His saints.

Aspect	Rapture arpazo/rapturo/caught up (Christ coming for His church)	Second Coming parousia/coming (Christ coming with His saints)
Who Comes	Jesus comes for His saints (1 Thess. 4:17)	Jesus comes with His saints (Jude 14)
Where We Meet	Saints meet Christ in the air	Saints return with Christ to earth
Change to Saints	Saints are changed	No change to saints
Timing	Imminent (could happen anytime)	Preceded by definite signs, calculated to the day
Focus	Deals with the saved	Deals with saved and unsaved
Satan	Satan not bound	Satan bound
World Impact	World not changed	World radically changed
Visibility	No one sees Jesus	All will see Him

- D.Be on your Guard watch carefully, be vigilant, be on the lookout, be careful.
- E. Keep awake & Stay Awake (3 x's) to beware, be on alert, keep awake, to watch.
 - Raise your hand if your name is Gregory? The english name Gregory
 comes from this word γρηγορέω/grēgoreō meaning: be awake, be alert,
 be alive.
 - 2. Why must we be alert? to <u>be ready for</u> *Christ's unpredictable return all the time*. [He <u>will come</u> *suddenly*, *unexpectedly*, but *unmistakably*]
 - 3. 2 reminders: (1) He said, *keep watch* not *keep predicting*. (2) Even Jesus didn't predict His return while on earth.
- F. Slide12 In biblical times, the watches of the night were divided into 4 periods: Roman
 - 1. First Watch (evening watch): 6 PM 9 PM
 - 2. Second Watch (midnight watch): 9 PM 12 AM

- 3. Third Watch (cockcrow watch): 12 AM 3 AM
- 4. Fourth Watch (morning watch): 3 AM 6 AM
- G. Slide13a-e Let's go practical the main practical thought for this chapter is *watchfulness*.
 - 1. Staying Spiritually Awake regular prayer, Scripture reading, and fellowship. Not letting *our faith* drift into autopilot.
 - 2. Living With Eternity in View making decisions about *money, career, and relationships* with the awareness that Christ could return at any time.
 - 3. Moral Alertness guarding against subtle sin and temptation. Watchfulness means saying, "I can't afford to drift, by God's grace I'll walk in holiness today."
 - 4. Mission-Mindedness sharing the gospel with urgency because every day brings us closer to Christ's return.
 - 5. Hopeful Anticipation watchfulness means saying, "This world is groaning, but my King is coming."
- H. Summary: To be watchful **doesn't mean** standing on one of Murrieta's hills *looking* at the sky; **it means** faithfully living, serving, and hoping as though Jesus could come today!
- I. Slide14a-c Illustrations: Being ever watchful like:
 - 1. A Security Guard on duty (his job is to stay alert, not nod off, nor staring at his phone). Tie-in: Watchfulness isn't about constant excitement but faithful readiness, even when things seem quiet.
 - 2. A Pilot on Final Approach (can't look at their phone or glance away for even a moment, hundreds of lives depend on their vigilance). Tie-in: Jesus calls us to *keep our eyes fixed on Him*, because the final approach (His return) is **critical**.
 - 3. A Expectant Parent's Hospital Bag (parents awaiting their baby to arrive often have a Go-Bag packed by the door, ready to go at a moment's notice). Tie-in: Watchfulness means **living ready**, not scrambling at the last minute.
- J. Summary: Eyes open, heart ready, always alert for the coming of Christ.

- K. Don't miss the word ALL in the last vs. This parable warns all of us today.
 - 1. Like the Master of the house, before Jesus went back to heaven, He gave each of us work to do.
 - 2. He expects us to **be faithful** while He is gone; and to **be working** when He returns.
 - 3. The teachings on *the Return of Christ* is not to excite our imagination, but to challenge the way we live here and now.
 - a) It should spur us to live holy lives, and to be <u>actively involved</u> in service and sharing the good news we've been entrusted with. As James Gray famously said, *Who can mind the journey when the road leads home?*
- L. End: Back to that Secret Mission Thanksgiving dinner. With the president standing out of sight, Paul Bremer, the chief U.S. civilian administrator, told the soldiers it was time to read the president's Thanksgiving proclamation and that it was a task for the most senior official present. Then asked, "Is there anybody back there more senior than us?" That was the cue for Bush, to promptly come from behind a curtain, setting off pandemonium among the troops. His 1st words at the mic were, "I was just looking for a warm meal somewhere," Then said, "I can't think of finer folks to have Thanksgiving dinner with than you all."
 - 1. Oh what a Thanksgiving dinner Our Heavenly *Commander in Chief* Jesus has prepared for us, at the Marriage Supper of the Lamb.
 - 2. He might even say, "I can't think of finer folks to have Thanksgiving dinner with than you all". (If Jesus has a southern accent?)
 - 3. How will your heart react if it's today?
