Jesus Intercedes

I. Slide1 Announce:

II. Slide10 Intro: Jesus Intercedes

- A. *Flannery O'Connor*, the famous *southern writer*, at 20 years old, was studying writing in Iowa, and she wanted to deepen her prayer life. She had to. *She wrote*...
 - 1. Dear God, I cannot love the the way I want to. You are the slim crescent of the moon that I see and **my self** is the earth's shadow that keeps me from seeing all the moon... What I am afraid of, dear God, is that **my self shadow** will grow so large that it <u>blocks</u> the whole moon, and that I will judge myself by the shadow that is nothing. I do not know you God because I am in the way.
- B. Prayer: God, we don't want to speak towards You, but with You. We realize when we fail to pray it's not breaking a rule, it is a failure to treat You as God. It's a sin against Your glory.
- C. Slide11 **The Diving Bell Spider** or *the water spider* is an amazing little creature. It lives in rivers and streams. How does this species survive in its watery environment? It spins a tough basket-like web of silk, a kind of **diving bell**, and anchors it under water to plants or other objects. Then it captures a surface air bubble, which it pulls down and ejects into its underwater house, filling it with air. This combination of **web building** and **bubble trapping** allows the water spider to live in an environment that normally would destroy it
 - As Christians, we too live in an environment that could <u>destroy</u> us. The world's values, attitudes, and practices threaten to <u>drown</u> us unless we are able to protect ourselves from them. How are we to survive spiritually in this hostile worldly environment? We must build a *bubble* of protection around ourselves by trusting God, studying the Scriptures, praying, fellowshipping with believers, communing with the Holy Spirit, and obeying His Word.

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- These activities will insulate our mind & heart and help to keep us safe and secure in Christ. As the water spider lives in the water but is not of the water, so we must live in but not be of the world.
- D. Slide12 Ch Outline: Jesus prayed for Himself (1-5/last week). Jesus prayed for His present disciples (6-19). Jesus prayed for His future disciples (20-26/next week).
 - 1. I know I separated out *present* & *future* disciples...but we are His disciples so this relates to us also. Here we have *what Jesus did for us, what Jesus prays for us*
- E. Outline: Prayer & Scripture. Kept & Guarded. Unified not Uniform. Sanctified & Sent.

III. Slide13a PRAYER and SCRIPTURE

- A. Jesus is praying for you Wow.
 - 1. Rom.8:34 Christ Jesus is the one who died more than that, who was raised who is at the right hand of God, <u>who indeed is</u> **interceding** for us.
 - 2. Heb.7:25 since he always lives to make intercession for them.
- B. I have manifested your name To the Jewish people, **a name** represented *a persons whole personality, his character.*
- C. What a great promise ALL Mine are Yours & Yours are Mine.
 - 1. What if we really believed that & lived as children in our Fathers house?
- D. Slide13b Note: Prayer & Scripture always go together.
 - 1. This wedding of the *bible and prayer* anchors our lives down in the real God.
 - 2. I'm reading Timothy Keller's book on Prayer. He quotes the Scottish theologian *John Murray* who says, that in prayer we are call to an *intelligent mysticism*.
 - a) It's an encounter with God that involves not only of the affections of the heart but also the convictions of the mind. We are not called to *choose between* a Christian life based on truth and doctrine or a life filled with spiritual power and experience. They go together.
- E. (9) I do not pray for *the God-rejecting world*.
 - 1. The world a fallen corrupt system. God creates, *then* satan counterfeits.
 - a) God creates this wonderful planet & satan corrupts it w/sin.

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- b) God creates truth & satan corrupts it w/lies.
- c) God creates life & satan corrupts it w/death.
- d) God creates light & satan corrupts it w/moral darkness.

IV. Slide14a **KEPT and GUARDED**

- A. (12) Not one has lost *except* the son of destruction, **that** the scripture might be fulfilled.
 - 1. Judas was not a saved man, even though he was one of the 12.
 - 2. He was **never washed** from his sins 13:11. He was **not chosen** by Christ 13:18. He was **not kept** (17:12). *He wore the uniform but wasn't part of the team*.
 - a) He's a frightening example of how near one can get to the kingdom & still be lost.
- B. Slide14b Now, in contrast to Judas...the Holy Father kept them in His name (11). Jesus kept & guarded them, and not one was lost.
 - 1. So Jesus intercedes, keeps & guards us.
 - 2. Good News: Jesus finds the *wanderers* & chases the *runners*.
- C. Jude 24 Now to him who is able to *keep you* from <u>stumbling</u> and to <u>present you</u> <u>blameless</u> before the presence of his glory with great joy.

V. Slide15a UNIFIED not UNIFORMED

- A. Unity 100 pianos all tuned to the same fork are automatically tuned to *each other*. They are of *one accord* by being tuned, **not** to *each other*, **but** to another standard.
- B. That they may be one Unity
 - Unity was no small request. These were tough-minded, independent, strongwilled men. Yet He wasn't after organizational unity, but interpersonal, relational unity.
- C. Slide15b Jesus wasn't after *uniformity*. He *recognized & valued* their diversity.
 - 1. He didn't *copy/paste* disciples. Nor churches for that matter.
 - 2. He uses our **individuality** to achieve a variety of purposes. [To fight on *different battle fields*, to wage different wars, to wield different weapons]
 - a) We're all in the battle, fighting for the same King.

VI. Slide16a SANCTIFIED and SENT

- A. Sanctifying doesn't mean growing a halo, or glowing with spirituality.
 - 1. It means, to set apart for a certain purpose or for an intended use.
 - 2. It's when Kelly says, don't eat those chocolate chip cookies, I made them for so & so. In the biblical sense she **sanctified** that food, **set it apart** for a specific use.
 - 3. How are you to be sanctified? By the truth. And, Why are we to be sanctified? To become useful.
- B. If *His Word* is not working in us in a life-changing way, *the World* will be.
 - 1. If we are not becoming conformed to the image of Christ, we will be squeezed into the mold of the world.
- C. (14) Not of the world John gives us the biblical definition later in his 1st epistle 1Jn 2:16
 - 1. Slide16b 1Jn 2:16 For all that is **in the world** the desires of the **flesh**, the desires of the **eyes**, and the **pride** of life is not from the Father but is **from the world**.
 - a) The 3 offsprings don't *originate* or *proceed* from the Father.
 - b) This *spirit of the world* permeates all society. All its plans, aims & activities belong to the present passing show. Eccl. calls it *under the sun*. (Ernie & the Sat morn men)
 - c) The world has always been on a collision course with **Christ**, because His teachings reverses everything that **the world prizes**.
 - 2. Slide16c Paul strikes a good balance in Phil.2:15 *that you may be <u>blameless</u>* and <u>innocent</u>, children of God <u>without blemish</u> **in the midst of** a <u>crooked</u> and <u>twisted generation</u>, among whom you <u>shine as lights</u> **in the world**.
- D. Slide17a (15) I do not ask that you take them *out of* the world Do you over-identify w/ the world till no one knows you're a Christian? Or, do you separate yourself so far from the world playing it safe w/little contact with them? [Isolation or Assimilation]
- E. First, the Christians attitude towards the world should not be one of *withdrawal*.¹

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- 1. Withdrawal has always been a temptation for the religious. To be a **Pharisee** was to be a **separatist**. The goal of that group was to escape the *contamination* of fallen Society.
 - a) 3rd century **Christian hermits** fled to the deserts of Egypt. Later there was the rise of **monasticism** in the middle ages. [monastic = *to live alone*]
 - b) We all have been tempted to do the same. Whether it was serving at a summer camp or enjoying a retreat, we tried to find a way to *spend the rest of our lives there*.
 - c) We all have our escape fantasies. A hideaway cabin in the woods. Or sometimes we've all looked at the Rapture the same way...as an escape from this world rather than looking forward to enjoying His presence.
- F. Our lives can become easily *monastic*. Where we have figured out to live our lives only around other groundhog Christians. We pop out of our hole. Look both ways. Run to our car & term on Christian radio. At lunch breaks only sit with Christians. Only hire Christians. Go to Bible studies with only Christians. Only read Christian books. Only speak a special crypto-Christian language.
 - 1. None of these are bad, but can be a form of *isolation* in a bubble of a Christian subculture.
 - 2. Slide17b Kent Hughes said, *It is possible to go womb to tomb in a hermetically sealed container* decorated with fish stickers.
 - 3. Moses, Elijah, and Jonah all asked to be *taken out of the world*, but not one of the requests was granted.
 - a) Ask yourself: have I functionally removed myself from the world? *Christ prays that we will not be.*
- G. Slide17c Secondly, is our temptation to *conform* to this world. This is *assimilation*, where in time there's no distinguishable difference between the church & the world system. It's "*secular-Christianity*" if there were such a thing. (they're the *unicorns* of the church)
 - 1. Romans 12:2 Do not **conform** any longer to the pattern of this world but be <u>transformed</u> by the renewing of your mind.
 - 2. Christ prays for his disciples that we would not go to <u>either</u> of these **extremes:** towards **isolation** or towards **assimilation**. *Both Temptations will be great*.

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- H. Slide17d Which is your greatest struggle? Too far *away from* this world (can't relate to people or culture) Or, Too far *into* the world (*can't* tell any difference between you & your world)
 - 1. Have you removed yourself so far from our world you don't have any influence upon it. Your goal is isolating/protecting/safeguarding yourself or your family & you've forgot your mandate was not to be *monastic* but evangelistic.
 - 2. Jesus would ask, *remember why I left you in this world? Follow my example:* I **ran from** religious sounding people & **ran to** the filthy who needed me.
 - Jesus said to be innocent, He didn't say to be naive. [May we warn our kids of what awaits them at University or out in the world & not just hope they never see anything] [shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves]
- I. Slide17e (18) Msg In the same way that you gave me a mission in the world, I give them a mission in the world.
- J. They are *not of the world* (14,16). They are *not taken out of the world* right away (15).But are *sent into the world*. Be insulated, *not* isolated.
 - 1. Slide17f Our lives are not to be ones of *isolation or assimilation but* of *mission*
 - 2. The **method** of mission goes back to **sanctification**. The 2 ideas: to be made holy and to set apart for service.
 - a) Which are both done by a close examination and application of the word of God.
- K. (19) Jesus choose to set himself apart for service. He entered our world excepting pain in peril, made himself vulnerable to suffering and ultimately death. Mission is dangerous!
 - 1. Hebrews 7:26 says he was, **set apart from** sinners. And Matthew 11:19 says he was, **a friend of** sinners.
- L. Mission takes *purposeful, intentional, decisive action* to meet those *who need Jesus*. But with His help, we can do this.
 - This might mean taking a class in a local college, joining the PTA, playing basketball in the nearby park, being a room mom, taking an active interest in a Starbucks employee, coaching a team, joining a community club, befriending someone who is homeless.
 - 2. How well do you relate to Christians? How well do you relate to the world?
 - 3. Isolation or assimilation or mission?
