These questions are designed to help you talk about God's word and Pastor Brian's message with friends and family. You of course can use your own questions, but we'd like to give you this tool to encourage Biblical fellowship and discipleship in your circle of relationships. *Enjoy discovering more about Him!*

"HOW DOES YOUR GARDEN GROW?" | 1 COR 3 | PASTOR BRIAN BELL

WARM-UP QUESTION:

When you think of famous buildings, what comes to mind first?

"Maturing" (1 Cor 3:1-4)

Paul rebukes the people for not maturing and still acting from the "flesh". What does it mean to live in the "flesh" How can believers have a more mature faith?

"Harvesting" (1 Cor 3:5-9)

Paul tells them that arguing over church leaders is silly because they are just servants and God is the one who gives growth. Why do some believers get so attached to certain leaders? How can they keep their true loyalty to God?

"Building" (1 Cor 3:10-15)

Paul explains that what we do may be remembered forever or may burn up at judgment. It all depends on if it was guided by Jesus. What does this show about Jesus? What does that mean for His followers?

"Indwelling" (1 Cor 3: 16-23)

Paul encourages the people by sharing God's glory dwells in them like it did in the temple because they are in Christ. **What is your reaction to hearing God's glory is inside believers?**

REFLECTION QUESTION:

Paul wants the people to stop the jealousy and arguing over human leaders and to trust God as He is guiding and building His people because they are His dwelling place. Have you struggled with jealousy and petty arguments lately? Have you been looking to God to build you up instead of other sources? Ask God to build you and use you so that His glory may live in you.

How does Your Garden Grow?

I. Announce:

A. Slide1-4 BoF: Jen

B. Slide5 IDOP: Welcome to those Online and in our Additional Seating in the Fellowship Hall.

- 1. The number of Christians facing **high to extreme levels** of persecution worldwide has <u>doubled</u> over those years. However, Christians who have been **actually killed** for their faith, has <u>decreased</u>.
- 2. 1 in 7 Christians are persecuted worldwide. North Korea remains the most dangerous country in the world for Christians.
- 3. Just like in the book of Acts, persecution is **expanding** the Church, with the fastest growth in **Nigeria**, **China**, and **Iran** all heavily persecuted.
- 4. Our church is blessed to be connected w/workers in Asian countries who minister under governments that have made Christian work <u>largely illegal</u>.
- 5. Heb.13:3 *tells us to remember our imprisoned brothers and sisters as though* **we** *were in prison with them.* What can you do? (2 things:)
 - a) Persecuted Church Prayer meets here at CM, Sat's 7:30a-8:30a in LC2.
 - b) 7 Days for 7 Countries. <u>Check social media daily</u> for a new country to pray for each day this week. It will profile of the top 7 most dangerous countries for <u>Christians</u>. With ways to <u>pray</u>, the <u>plight</u> of a specific believer, & <u>websites</u> to get more info, or to <u>write a letter</u> to an imprisoned believer or foreign gov.

C. Slide6 Prayer:

II. Slide7a Intro: How does Your Garden Grow?

- A. Are you a carnal Christian? Are you a spiritual Christian? What's the difference?
 - 1. Do you think you can **fluctuate** between both? When you fall into **carnal** Christian mode, <u>what</u> can you hold onto for <u>hope</u>? When you are in **spiritual** Christian mode, <u>what</u> can become its <u>demise</u>?
- B. We can divide up the humans into 2 groups: Christians and non-Christians (2:14,15)

- 1. But in ch.3 we see 2 classes of Christian people: spiritual & fleshly.
 - a) Paul already discussed the natural person (2:14). They are lost/unsaved.
 - (1) For now at least, as Chuck Swindoll said, They have pulled in the welcome mat from the door of their hearts, locked the dead bolt, and turned a deaf ear to Jesus' knocking.
- 2. As of the 2 class of believers: Both are believers, both are babes/infants in Christ, both are born in the spirit (2:12), yet one is fleshly and one is Spiritual.
- C. Slide7b Outline: Maturing. Harvesting. Building. Indwelling.

III. Slide8a MATURING (1-4) Read

- A. This has to do with pigpen-christianity or craby-christians.
- B. When we see a *carnal Christian* we often **judge** them as ... never knowing the Lord. They never had a relationship. They believed in their heads but not in their hearts. But praise God that's not how He sees them.
 - 1. I calls these *pigpen Christians*. So Brian its ok to stay that way? No, Paul *pleads here* that these carnal *Corinthian* or carnal *Murrieta'n* Christians, should be challenged to *come out of the pigpen of their lives*. [God doesn't run & yank you out of the pigpen. But as soon as you *repent* & *start heading home*, He'll run so fast to meet you] i.e. prodigal son story.
- C. (2) Even now you're not ready Paul is not upset that they <u>began</u> as <u>babes</u>/infants, but <u>that</u> they *haven't grown out of it*.
 - I still love a cold glass of milk, but it isn't the only thing in my diet (I've added cookies:) But Paul warns against a steady diet of "milk only"!
 - 2. On one hand, we never outgrow the nourishing milk of God's Word. Like when we get **awestruck** w/a basic concept in God's word again.
- D.(3,4) What kind of solid food? How about Jesus' meal plan of the clean eating *Mediterranean, anti-inflammatory, heart-healthy diet* of *love, peace, and humility*? And detoxing the carb's of *jealousy and strife, self-confidence and self-exaltation*.

- 1. It's craby-christianity. Charles L. Allen in, *The Miracle of Love*, writes of a fisherman friend who told him that **one never needs** <u>a top</u> **for his crab basket**. If one of the crabs starts to climb up the sides of the basket, the other crabs will reach up and pull it back down. craby-christianity:(
- E. It just might be that *the Carnal-Christians* are the greatest threat to Christianity. To Jesus's precious name. To the Corinthian churches name. To <u>our</u> churches name.
 - 1. How? With they're bad example, their bad lifestyle, their lack of holiness.
 - 2. They just continue to *root around* in the pigpens of their own natures. They *rebel* against the control of the Holy Spirit.
- F. Pause: If you just thought, I'm glad I'm not a carnal Christian this is for you!
 - 1. See Paul was honest to admit he struggled with it. He wrote a whole chapter on his struggles w/carnality.
 - a) Slide8b Rom.7:21-25 So I find it to be <u>a law</u> (a principle in life) that when I want to do right, evil lies close at hand. 22 For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being, 23 but I see in my members another law waging <u>war</u> against the law of my mind and making me <u>captive</u> to the law of sin that dwells in my members. 24 Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? 25 (answer) Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!
 - 2. The whole chapter is a portrait of the *Carnal-Conflict*, a *constant conflict*, a *moment by moment battle* between 2 natures.
 - a) Slide The Carnal Christian is a child of God, born again and on his way to heaven, but he is traveling 3rd class. Alan Redpath
- G.Brian give me some Good News: Jesus gives us the great story of *the Prodigal son*, *His Father, and his older brother*. Both brothers were a type of *carnal-christians* (1 son who doesn't mask his rebellion w/a false loyalty. The other who masks his rebellious heart w/a false loyalty). The father reaches out to **both** boys. To the repentant 1 *he throws him a party*. To the other *he begs him to come into the party*.

IV. Slide10a HARVESTING (5-9) Read How does Your Garden Grow?

A. Slide 10b This has to do with Salvation and the Christian life is always about HIM!

- 1. **We** are servants *God alone is Lord*. We have an *important*, but *subordinate* role in the work of the gospel.
- B. Servants/workers have different tasks. Some prepare the soil, others sow seeds, some pull weeds, and still others reap the harvest.
 - 1. But all share in the harvest. And all receive wages.
 - 2. The point? How foolish to *compare* one servant to another.
 - a) Slide10c Our motto & motive should simply be: <u>We</u> are nothing, but God is everything. And, Laboring Together.

C. Examples:

- 1. Paul planted the church in Corinth, while Apollo later came & watered it.
- 2. Bob C planted CM, I took over 5 years later and have been watering it
- 3. Ron Armstrong planted Cornerstone, while Andy Deane later came & watered it. [in all of those churches ... God has given the increase]
- D. Here is why we know its true. [if you don't have sunlight or air, you don't have a plant]
 - 1. Years ago, I cut down a tree at my house. That stump has been decomposing for years in the middle of my grass. I finally tackled its removal. Filled the hole with good soil. Planted grass seed. Allowing my sprinkler system to water it. Look what I did! Nope. No sunlight, no air, no life.
 - 2. Planters and waterers are nothing w/o Him. Only God has the power to cause *the seed of the gospel message* to **grow**.
- E. God's field another agricultural lesson: The church is the field. God **germinates** the seed, He helps it to **sprout**. Then He ultimately helps it to bring forth **fruit**.
 - If we have ability, it is Christ's ability. If we have \$, it is Christ's \$.
 It's Christ's building. Christ's lambs. Christ's mission. Christ's gospel.
 Everything is Christ's.

V. Slide11a BUILDING (10-15) Read

A. Slide11b This has to do with the believers works. Key: Importance of the *genuineness* of one's building materials for the work of the kingdom.

- 1. Adequacy or integrity of any building material depends upon **the test** it will have to meet (fire, earthquake, etc).
- 2. **That test** for the Christian's building is fire on the day of works/judgment. Showing it for what it is.
- B. No other **foundation** no other **redemption**, no other **salvation**, no other **Savior**, no other **Christ**.
 - 1. Cement = water, cement, aggregate. The Romans had figured it out and we're still using it for our foundations today. Slide11c Hadrian's Pantheon in Rome is made of concrete, still stands. [Pantheon's dome is still the world's largest unreinforced concrete dome]
- C. Some building materials are combustible (wood, hay, straw) and they will be burned up completely. [not sin, that's already burned up ... but our *works*]
- D. Others will use noncombustible materials such as *gold*, *silver*, *or precious stones* (granite, marble) and they will find their labor will stand the test. And they will receive a reward (@ bema seat).
 - 1. Those who build poorly *will suffer loss* of reward, but they themselves will be saved as a person who is rescued from a fire.
 - 2. Picture a man escaping a burning building, he has his life ... but no possessions.
 - a) There is a legend of a wealthy woman who, when she reached heaven, was shown a very plain mansion. She objected. "Well," she was told, "that is the house prepared for you." "Whose is that fine mansion across the way?" she asked. "It belongs to your gardener." "How is it that he has one so much better than mine?" "The houses here are prepared from the materials that are sent up. Slide11d We do not choose them, you do that by your earthly faithfulness."
- E. Examples of Brian's wood, hay, & straw type works?
 - 1. Wood When I became a sound man cc beliffower as a new believer, to be seen by others ... POOF!

- 2. Hay myself and a friend sharing the gospel. I was more interested in showing off my *apologetic prowess* than caring for the soul of the individual I was talking to ... POOF!
- 3. Straw every time I have served the Lord with a wrong heart ... POOF!
- F. (10) Take care how he builds upon it wasn't that the story of the 3 little pigs?
 - 1. That which was made of *shoddy building materials* (straw & wood) blew down, but that which was of sturdy material (brick) withstood the fierce winds. [not by the hair of my *chiny*, *chin*, *chin*. Then I'll huff & puff ...]
 - 2. Instead of blowing, Jesus will simply look at it with *His eyes like a flame of fire*, at the judgment seat of Christ. Take care how you build! (10)
- G. What helped Kelly & I, more than anything, as we laid our 1st course of block?
 - 1. Friends <u>plugged us in right away</u>. We <u>never neglected</u> the <u>gathering</u> together of the brethren (when they met, we were there). We got <u>involved</u> in small groups, in serving, in fellowship. [and been doing it that ever since]

VI. Slide12a INDWELLING (16-23) Read

- A. Slide12b This has to do with all believers, anytime and anywhere.
- B. Key: Importance, the temple does not refer to *the structure* in which believers meet to worship. Rather, Christians themselves are the temple. (or the church)
- C. We are God's temple: but wait, there are 2 words in Greek for Temple: ναός NaOS and ἰερόν HieROn.
 - a) *Hieron* means the Temple building itself. *Naos* means the Sanctuary, the Holy of Holies, where the glory of God dwells (naos is used here).
 - 2. Now, how do you read it? We are God's sanctuary the place of His holy, radical, awesome presence!
 - 3. Slide13 You are not simply *the structure* in which He lives. You are the dwelling place of the Shekinah glory of God :)
- D. Note: God's Spirit dwells in you (pl.) not an *influence* of the Spirit, but the 3rd person of the Trinity Himself.

- 1. Christian, no matter how weak, feeble, poor, helpless, or frustrated you feel; or how inadequate, incapable, incompetent, or ineffective you feel ... The Spirit of God dwells in you.
- 2. Why does He dwell in us? That we might develop *character, the fruit of the Spirit, good works,* and reproduce *the character* of Jesus Christ.
- E. Communion: This is what God chose to celebrate the mystery of God becoming flesh. We struggle to figure everything out. This morning can you enjoy *the mystery of communion*, where **reality** and **mystery** are fused.
 - 1. Just as ordinary food, nourishes our physical bodies, so the bread and the wine of the Lord's Supper, give *spiritual nourishment* and *refreshment* from Christ, to our souls.
 - 2. **The cup** of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? **The bread** that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? 1 Cor.10:16 [participation / koinonia]
