"SPIRITUAL AFTERCARE" | 1 THESSALONIANS 3 | PASTOR BRIAN BELL

WARM-UP QUESTION: How have you seen believers support and pray for other believers from far away? "Spiritual Aftercare" (1 Thess 3: 1-8) Paul worried about new believers because some were suffering, and temptation can be especially strong in those moments. Why is it that when someone is new in the faith or suffering temptation is strong? What types of temptation usually come? Paul sent Timothy to encourage and strengthen the Thessalonians. How can visiting pastors and guest speakers be encouraging to a group of believers? What does that look like in churches today? "Divine Care" (1 Thess 3: 9-13) Paul shares that his group, though far away, prays "earnestly" for the Thessalonians and then he writes a quick prayer, asking that God increases their love and holiness. How is prayer from people far away encouraging? How would more love and holiness help a group that is inexperienced and suffering?

REFLECTION QUESTION:

Paul sent both help and prayer to the Thessalonians because of his love and sense of responsibility towards them. Has God put people in your life you sense you are to love and support like that? How can you intentionally pray and send help to these people? Ask God to give you ideas and opportunities to help others grow in love and holiness.

I. Slide1 Announce:

II. Slide8a Intro: Spiritual Aftercare

- A. Illust: One of the most wonderful joys in life is *the birth of a child*. Then, when all things are settled, the proud parents bring their little bundle of joy home. **But** that's not the end! It's only the <u>beginning</u> of a long and tedious process, as the infant needs <u>much care</u> in order to grow and develop *physically and emotionally*.
 - 1. So this involves regular feeding, diaper-changing, bathing, and keeping it safe from all harm and danger. When the new-born cries, it needs comfort. When it is tired, it needs to be rocked to sleep. When it has a fever, it needs medicine. When it develops rashes, it needs special cream [endearingly called Butt Paste, or Brazillians call Boom Boom Cream].
 - Such great care and attention usually puts great demands on the parents who may not have much rest and sleep for many days.
 Being a parent is not for the faint of heart. It's not easy to provide all the after-care that a new-born infant needs.
 - 3. Well, in the same way, it is not easy to provide all the spiritual after-care that a new Christian needs. It is one thing to rejoice when one is saved, but it is another thing altogether to provide the spiritual care they need after that in order to grow into full Christian maturity.
 - a) They need plenty of *loving encouragement, instruction, guidance and help* from other Christians. That's our chapter 3.
- B. Slide8b Big Idea: We are to make disciples and not just make converts.
- C. Ch.3: Timothy's Mission (1-5). Timothy's Report (6-8). Paul's Prayers (9-13).

D. Outline: Spiritual Aftercare (1-8). Divine Care (9-13).

III. Slide9 SPIRITUAL AFTERCARE (1-8) READ

- A. Slide 10 Feeling the Weight of Discipleship.
- B. I can bear it no longer (2x's). Hear the **weight** on Paul's shoulders? How did he make ministry choices about staffing and travels?
 - He thought about the Thessalonians.
 This is simply sanctified reflection and thinking.
 - 2. He assessed the needs in Thessalonica and in Athens.
 - 3. He felt ... he was feeling pressure, he could *bear it no longer*. He was uncertain of how they would fare (5).
- C. We all need to *learn to live with messiness* in <u>discerning</u> the will of God and meeting people's needs.
 - 1. Here are 4 things: Pray earnestly. Think hard. Feel the pressure. And be discerning of the Holy Spirit.
- D. Slide11 We were willing to be left behind in Athens alone (1b) Alone, not normally a good thing.
 - 1. Paul, Timothy, Silas were in Berea (after Thes). He dispatches **Silas** most likely to Philippi. **Timothy** goes back to Thes. **Paul** heads to Athens *alone*
 - 2. Sometimes <u>ministry</u> is lonely. Sometimes <u>life</u> is lonely. Sometimes God calls us to *Go it Alone*.
 - a) What situation do you feel totally alone in right now? We've all experienced a time when we wonder why our spouse, or family, or church friends just aren't there for us. But just maybe, that's when *God wants you all to Himself*?
 - b) Maybe the feeling is like, remember Sandra Bullock & George Clooney in the space drama called **Gravity**? She was floating out into space alone, and she whispered, "anybody please call me."
 - 3. Loneliness can be a tough road. Think of the value then Paul placed on *partnership* in gospel ministry.

- 4. *Paul on pins and needles*, wondering about the spiritual well-being of his children in the faith. Like **parents** waiting to hear any word from their children living at college, or out of state.
- E. Slide12 That no one be **moved** by these afflictions (3) (*saino*) *To wag like a dogs tail*. Only time used. Picture it methodically slowly swinging back/forth. (emotional swings)
 - 1. Or maybe you're like my dog Sully's short tail (which moves fast like this).
- F. Slide13 The tempter (5) refers to *Satan*. Paul likely considered the Thessalonians to be especially vulnerable to temptation *because* they had converted to faith in Christ <u>only recently</u>.
 - 1. The NT frequently describes Satan's attempts to take advantage of people who are either *young in the faith* or *in a weakened state*.
 - 2. Note: Paul was not ignorant of Satan's **schemes** (2 Cor. 2:11), nor vulnerable to his **methods** (Eph.6:11), nor naïve about his **intent** (1 Pet.5:8), so he takes decisive action by sending Timothy to <u>block</u> Satan's expected attack.

G. Slide 14 Faithfulness For Today.

- H. Supply what is lacking in your faith (10) This phrase refers to their need for *further instruction*, **not** to a failure to have genuine faith in Christ.
 - 1. Paul evangelized them. Tim strengthened them (not to survey them but support em)
 - 2. Paul probably is anticipating their need to be instructed on questions about *Christ's return and those who have died* (ch.4).
- I. Note your faith in (2,5,6,7,10) all pointing to their afflictions & suffering.

J. Slide15 Continued Spiritual Growth.

- K. Paul's great concern was not their *comfort and safety* but their **faith** (2,5,6,7,10), their **love** (12), and their **holiness** (13).
 - 1. Holiness: the quality of being personally **dedicated** to God; **either by** being **set apart**, by being **morally pure**, or by being **devoted** to God.

L. Standing fast (8) - Paul's favorite expression for staying faithful to God and His gospel message.

M.Slide16a Forewarned is Forearmed. (4)

- N. The Latin phrase, praemonitus, praemonitus, means Forewarned is Forearmed.
 - 1. Being warned or cautioned about something before it happens can be the best form of preparation. We <u>kept</u> telling you beforehand that we were to suffer affliction (and it happened). [kept imp.tense, repeated warnings]
 - a) Wow, how imp is follow up w/young believers, to leave converts on warrant of the possible adverse personal consequences of their acceptance of the gospel is to do them a serious injustice. [Inigo Montoya, prepare to die]
 - b) Yes, *God loves you and has a wonderful plan for your life*, but that plan will always include **suffering** *for the gospel*. We must *forewarn* disciples, so they are *forearmed*. [through many tribulations, we must enter the kingdom of God Acts14:22]
- O. Slide 16b We are **destined**/appointed for this (for what? afflictions) Paul reminds the new believers that persecution is not a sign of *God's wrath*; *rather*, faith and suffering are both part of the Christian life.
 - 1. Slide16c Phil 1:29 For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should <u>not only</u> believe in him <u>but also</u> **suffer for His sake**.
 - 2. Also remember that *Messiah*, the prophets, and the apostles all suffered persecution, so the *Thessalonians* shouldn't be discouraged by their experience
 - 3. Slide16d So please know, God has *Affliction Appointments* for all of us (on His day planner on <u>your</u> day planner)
- P. So what do we do with all this information? *Try harder, do better?*
 - 1. No, what we look for in our text is the road that leads to Jesus.
 - 2. There are 2 types of messages: man centered or Christ centered.
 - 3. Do we make Paul (or Tim) *the hero of the message* or Jesus? Let's turn our aim to our God.

IV. Slide17auto18 DIVINE CARE (9-13) READ [emphasize God in red]

- A. Slide19 God's Coworker. (2)
- B. Not Paul's coworker, though he was. Such a lofty & unusual title. Paul unfolds this
 - 1. 1 Corinth 3:5-9 NLT After all, who is Apollos? Who is Paul? We are only God's servants through whom you believed the Good News. Each of us did the work the Lord gave us. 6 I planted the seed in your hearts, and Apollos watered it, but it was God who made it grow. 7 It's not important who does the planting, or who does the watering. What's important is that God makes the seed grow. 8 The one who plants and the one who waters work together with the same purpose. And both will be rewarded for their own hard work. 9 For we are both God's workers. And you are God's field. You are God's building.

C. Slide 20 Our Security Is In God Alone. (1)

- D. Left behind in Athens alone ... yet never alone
 - 1. Paul might have been thinking about what David said (alone 6x's Ps.62).
- E. Ps.62 1 For God alone my soul waits in silence; from him comes my salvation.

 2 He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be greatly shaken

 ... 5 For God alone, O my soul, wait in silence, for my hope is from him. 6 He only
 is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken. (Heb. אַב ak)
- F. Slide21a Prayers To God. (9-13) [prayers for himself 9-11; prayers for them 12,13]
- G. What do you do when people you love, need your help, but you can't go to them?
 - 1. Many friends in our church experienced this during **Covid**, *regarding trying to visit love ones in hospitals*. The family members and friends were **alone**, **hurting alone**, and even some **died alone**.
 - 2. Paul couldn't go back and seem his new friends/new believers in Thes, though he tried. In this case he could send someone qualified on his behalf. And one more thing, he could Pray. We can always pray for them,

because prayer is not limited to time or place. [4 prayers:]

- H. Slide21b Thanksgiving to God (9) what thanksgiving can we return to God for you
 - 1. Paul knows <u>he cannot</u> take credit for the believers' perseverance through suffering *he was not there with them*. He gives thanks that **God** strengthened them to endure the persecution.
- I. Leading of God (10) Paul was *praying day/night* to see them again.
- J. Love from God (12) Paul already <u>commended</u> the believers for their love (1:3). Now he prays that their love will *increase*. This love should extend not only to *persecuted believers*, but also to their *persecutors*.
- K. Holy before God (13) which He expounds on in the next chapter.
- L. Prayer: Ty for those you sent into our lives to provide us *Spiritual Aftercare* & *Your Divine Care*.
