- E. Slide4 Prayer:

II. Slide5 Intro: CAS – Close Air Support

- A. In military tactics, *Close Air Support* (CAS) refers to air strikes by aircraft against hostile targets that are in close proximity to friendly forces.
 - 1. Spiritual application: It's like calling in "air strikes" from above against a hostile enemy close to <u>us</u> or our <u>allies</u>.
 - 2. Prayer is our direct transmission to our General's headquarters.
- B. Did you know: According to new data from Pew Research Center's Religious Landscape Study, 44% of U.S. adults say they pray at least once a day, and another 23% say they pray weekly or a few times a month. That means two-thirds of the country still turns to prayer with some regularity.

- C. But prayer is not ...
 - A civilian device like a home intercom system. Or ...
 A bell you ring when you want God to do something for you.
- D. Prayer is communication used in battle conditions.
 - 1. "Armor and weapons are not sufficient to win a battle; there must be energy to do the job. Our energy comes from prayer." Wiersbe
- E. We use *the sword of the Spirit* and *here praying at all times in the Spirit* the Holy Spirit **empowers** us to win the battle. The **Word** and **prayer** are the **2 resources** God gives the church to overcome the enemy and gain ground for God's glory.
 - 1. Example: When Moses and Joshua fought Amalek (Ex.17), **Moses** prayed on the hill with the rod of God, *while* **Joshua** fought with the sword in the valley. It took both **prayer** and **action** to win.
 - a) **Prayer** is the <u>power</u> for victory <u>but not just any kind</u> of prayer ...
- F. Let's look at **6 aspects** of *prayer's battle strategy*:

III. Slide6a 1. PRAY AT ALL TIMES (18a)

- A.18 **praying at all times** in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,
- B. The command to stand (3 x's) is now joined with the command to pray.
 - 1. Slide6b But we can't truly **stand** *until* we've learned to **kneel**.
- C. Praying at all times/pray w/o ceasing doesn't mean *always <u>saying prayers</u>*; it means *staying in communion with God*. [How else say that? have an *ongoing* conversation].
- D. We must *pray at all times* because we are always under threat from temptation and attack. Prayer keeps us ready for surprise assaults. (Eg. Pete in Gethsemane) It should be our 1st line of strength, not our last resort. [1 hour? Watch and pray that *you* may not enter into temptation]

IV. Slide7a 2. PRAY WITH ALL PRAYERS (18b) with all kinds of prayer

A.18 **praying** at all times in the Spirit, **with all prayer and supplication**. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,

- B. Slide7b The military analogy continues We are at war! Its seriousness is seen in the repeated "alls": all times, all prayers, all perseverance, for all the saints.
- C. Slide7c *All prayer* = *all/each kind of prayer* includes: *adoration* (which means? Ask), *confession, thanksgiving, and supplication. also Intercession.*
 - 1. Another tool: Fasting it adds intensity and focus to prayer.
 - 2. "The believer who prays <u>only</u> to ask for things is missing out on the blessings of **intercession** and **thanksgiving**." Wiersbe
 - a) **Intercession** is a powerful weapon Eg. Job 42:10, *The Lord restored Job's fortunes when he prayed for his friends*. Interceding for others often brings victory in our own lives.
 - b) **Thanksgiving** is a powerful weapon *praise* changes things as much as *prayer* does.

V. Slide8a 3. PRAY IN THE SPIRIT (18c)

- A. 18 **praying** at all times **in the Spirit**, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,
- B. Slide8b You can't just decide to be a warrior; you must be prepared to do so.
- C. We pray to the Father, through the Son, and in the Spirit. (biblical formula)
- D. In the Spirit doesn't necessarily mean *praying in tongues*. It means praying with the energy and alignment of the Holy Spirit praying in harmony with *God's will*.
 - 1. I'm not excluding *praying in tongues*, but if it meant <u>only</u> that, then only those w/the gift could pray this.
- E. In Scripture, **incense** represents prayer we know it had to be made *exactly* as God prescribed. The fire on the altar symbolizes the Holy Spirit, who ignites our prayers/incense according to God's will.
 - 1. Slide8c It's possible to *pray fervently* in the flesh and never reach God, but It's possible to *pray quietly* in the Spirit & see Him do great things.

VI.Slide9 4. PRAY WITH YOUR EYES OPEN (18d) keep alert (tarsier monkey - P.I.)

- A. 18 **praying** at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, **keep alert** with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,
- B. Christian soldiers pray with eyes open. Keep alert/watch and pray is God's formula for overcoming *the world*, *the flesh*, *and the devil*.
 - 1. Eg. Nehemiah 4:9 (nlt), But we **prayed** to our God and **guarded** the city day and night to protect ourselves.
 - 2. Illustration: Sleeping birds have a built-in grip. They lock their claws when their legs are bent. Their claws release only when their knees straighten.
 *Our bent knees in prayer give us a firm grip on the values that make life worth living. When we hold firmly to God in prayer, rest assured He is and has been holding firmly to us.

VII.Slide10a 5. PRAY WITH PERSISTENCE (18e)

- A. 18 **praying** at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert **with all perseverance**, making supplication for all the saints,
- B. Perseverance means sticking to it, continuing, not quitting. It's *an ongoing, unbroken action* in prayer.
- C. Persistence in prayer *isn't* twisting God's arm; it's being burdened enough not to rest until we hear His <u>answer</u>.
 - Slide10b "Prayer is not getting <u>man's will</u> done in heaven; it's getting <u>God's</u> will done on earth." – Robert Law

VIII.Slide11 6. PRAY FOR ALL BELIEVERS (18f-20) making supplication

- A. 18 **praying** at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, **making supplication for all the saints**, 19 and also <u>for me</u>, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, 20 for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.
- B. Notice in the Lord's Prayer: Our Father, not <u>my</u> Father. We pray as part of a great family, all speaking with God together.

- 1. So Paul asks for prayer support from his Ephesian family.
- C. Christian, soldiers don't go it alone.
 - 1. Eg. Moses didn't fight alone. While **Joshua** battled Amalek, **Moses** went up the hill with *Aaron and Hur* to hold up his hands (Ex. 17:9-10).
 - 2. We live in an individualistic culture, but the Christian life isn't meant to be <u>isolated</u>. We need others to **lift our arms**, **share our burdens**, and **pray** beside us.
 - 3. There are no isolated believers in the NT. Like sheep: we need to *Flock together. Stand together. Fight together. Pray together, and Worship together.*
- D. Slide12 Irina Ratu-shin-skaya, a Russian poet and believer, was only 28 when she was arrested for her faith and sentenced to 7 years of hard labor in the Soviet gulag at Baryshevo. She endured freezing temperatures, starvation, brutal interrogations, and months in solitary confinement.
 - 1. Yet **her faith never broke**. In that icy cell, she had no Bible, no pen, no paper only her memory and her faith. She began to compose poetry in her mind verses about God's presence, about hope, about unseen strength. (match stick soap)
 - 2. When she was finally released, Irina said that what <u>sustained</u> her through those dark nights was not only her **faith** but **the prayers of believers** around the world. She said she could **feel** them. In one of her poems, later published in her memoir *Grey Is the Colour of Hope*, she wrote: "Believe me, it was often thus: In solitary cells, on winter nights A sudden sense of joy and warmth, And a resounding note of love. And then, unsleeping, I would know, A-huddle by an icy wall: **Someone is thinking of me now, Petitioning the Lord for me.**"
 - a) She felt the warmth of **intercession** in the coldest place on earth.
- E. Paul asked prayer for: What to say, the boldness to say it, and the wisdom to say it at the right time.

F. Comfortable saints don't fight. The gates of hell won't prevail against the church.

Not a carefree crowd at Disneyland, but a disciplined army on mission.

IX.Slide13 GRACIOUS GREETING (21-24)

- A.21 So that you also may know how I am and what I am doing, **Tychicus** the beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord will tell you everything. 22 I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know how we are, and that he may encourage your hearts. 23 Peace be to the brothers, and love with faith, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. 24 Grace be with all who love our Lord Jesus Christ with love incorruptible.
- B. Tychicus A Gentile believer from Asia, companion of Paul, and courier for this letter (also Colossians, and *likely* Philemon).
 - 1. Mail was carried by travelers, since Rome had no postal system for private use
- C. God's covenant love now extends to all who *love the Lord Jesus Christ*.
- D. Conclusion: Our spiritual armor is used in a war that's already been won.
- E. Illustration: Napoleon once pointed to the British Isles on a map and said, "If it were not for that red spot, I could conquer the world."

 When Satan looks at the world, he says the same of Calvary ... if it were not for that red hilltop where Christ's blood was spilled, I would rule the world.
 - 1. That red spot makes all the difference. The battle is won!
 - 2. We are more than conquerors through **Him** who loved us. Rom. 8:37
- F. Keywords: prayer, persistence, supplication.
