## Jesus Is The Question Why Did Jesus Ask So Many Questions?

I. Slide1 Announce:

#### A. Welcome those online.

- B. Slide2 At Risk Meeting: Join us Sunday, 3-5pm in the Agape Room. Kelly will be sharing some *very practical ways* to get involved in the fight against HT.
- C. Slide3 Community Groups: are <u>starting soon</u>, so sign up today. Community Groups are co-ed groups grow closer to God and each other. Check out the time/day/eve options and sign up online for one that fits your schedule.
- D. Slide4 R&R Study: Fall Reasons to Rejoice Bible Study. The book is \$5.00 that you pay online when you register and you'll receive the first night. Either Mon nite 7pm or Tues morn at 9am (childcare provided Tues). Online registration begins today.
- E. Slide5 MOM's Group: Online registration for MOM's begins tomorrow. 1st mtg will be on Thurs, Sept14th. We meet twice a month on Thursdays throughout the school year.

#### II. Slide8a Intro: Why Did Jesus Ask So Many Questions?

- A. A Bumper Sticker reads, Jesus is the Answer. But Might He also be the Question?
  - Slide8b Remember Walter Martin? The Bible Answer Man on the radio. We esteem <u>answers</u> (which are important) but can we esteem <u>questions</u>? Would you listen to The Bible Question Man? (we should)

- 2. We love <u>answers</u> in our culture. <u>Answers</u> mean that we have *knowledge*.
  - a) Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 8:1-3 that *knowledge puffs us up*. It makes us feel better about <u>ourselves</u>, <u>superior</u> to those around us. And we <u>eat that up</u>. We love having knowledge and showing others what we know.
    - (1) Here's the reality. *Knowledge by itself* just causes us to think we are <u>better</u> than others, *it puffs us up*. *Knowledge puffs up*, *love builds up*.
- 3. Slide8c Will you ponder with me the implications of the *all-knowing-Savior* who approaches the world, *and us*, with <u>questions</u>?
- You realize, Jesus doesn't just offer spiritual tips, or give us a bullet point list of 10 ways to be closer to God. Nor does he provide *easy* answers. Instead, he has *hard* questions.
- B. Slide8d Book: Jesus Is the Question: The **307** Questions Jesus Asked and the **3** He Answered. *Martin Copenhaver* 
  - 1. By contrast Jesus is <u>asked</u> **183** questions.
  - 2. Back to the **3** He answers (some say **8**) that still means, *Jesus is* **40** *x*'s *more likely to ask you a <u>question</u> than He is to give you a <u>direct answer</u>.*

# III. Slide9a WHY QUESTIONS IN GENERAL?

- A. Linguists tell us that questions have many different functions in conversation:1
  - 1. Questions elicit information.
    - a) Why do you not understand what I am saying? Where is your faith? Why could you not watch with me one hour?
  - 2. Slide9b Questions directly challenge the listener.
    - a) Why do you not understand what I am saying? Where is your faith? Why could you not watch with me one hour?
  - 3. Slide9c Questions inspire people to **discover** something new, to unearth new knowledge.

- a) The goal is not to communicate knowledge, but to elicit new <u>understanding</u> in the listener. **Information** is not the goal. **Transformation** is.
- 4. <u>Slide9d</u> Questions also persuade. this is what's happening when courtroom attorneys win their cases.
  - a) They ask questions of a witness, but those questions make an argument, and ultimately *the chain of questions* persuades the jury.
- 5. Slide9e Questions stimulate thought. That's why good teachers ask questions of their students rather than just *lecture <u>at</u> them*.
  - a) What are you looking for? Who do you say that I am?
  - b) **Answers** can be offered as a **conclusion**, **Questions** are an invitation to further **reflection**. For the most part, *answers close and questions open*.
    - Notice the word *question* contains the word *quest*. He sending us on a journey in search of something *valuable*.
- 6. Slide9f Questions forge intimacy. Imagine here not an *interrogation*, but the questions you exchange over coffee with a new friend.
  - a) So questions build closeness.

# IV. Slide10a WHY DOES JESUS PREFER QUESTIONS OVER DIRECT ANSWERS?

- A. By asking, so many questions, maybe Jesus was reflecting *a Jewish tradition*, particularly a *rabbinic* tradition.
  - 1. There's an old Jewish joke, *Why* **does** *a* Jew always answer a question with a question? Answer: *Why* **shouldn't** *a* Jew always answer a question with a question?
  - 2. How many have attended a Seder Feast? This whole ritual of Jewish tradition, is structured around *5 questions* (dating back to Ex.12:26).
- B. Slide10b The 1st words that Jesus speak are regarding question. He's a preteen, and Mary & Joseph, think that they lost Him in Jerusalem. They finally find Him, *After*

three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and **asking them questions**. Lk 2:46

- 1. When Mary asks, why did you treat us like this, adding, we've been searching for you. What was Jesus's response? 2 questions: Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my fathers house?
- C. Slide10c At the other end of His life, while hanging on the cross, He asks, *My God My God why have You forsaken Me?*
- D. Slide10d Even after His resurrection He's still asking questions: What are you talking about as you walk along?(2 emmaus disciples) Do you have anything here to eat? Do you love me?
- E. Slide10e Some Questions Seem Silly upon 1st Reading.
  - 1. Peter walking on water starts to sink, Jesus asks, O you of little faith, why did you doubt? (I'll tell you why, he was sinking!!!)
  - Slide10f Another time, a blind man calls out to Jesus, as he's passing by on the road to Jericho, Jesus stops and asks him, What do you want me to do for you? (Uh, I'm blind)
    - a) How will <u>you</u> answer that question this evening?
      - (1)What do you want <u>Me</u> to do for you?
    - b) Is there anything deeper than what you just thought of?
      - (1) What we need <u>most</u> from Jesus is what he has **already done** for us.
    - c) I think Jesus is asking them to look deeper? [the questions above weren't silly]
    - d) I think Jesus is also **showing respect** for the blind man. He's not presuming to know what he wants (of course He knows), but He's asking him.
      - (1) Never assume that you know what another person needs or wants.

### V. Slid11a HOW WILL THIS CHANGE MY ENGAGEMENT WITH GOD?

A. How does this translate into our lives?

- B. Ask them: How does this change, How you view God? Your relationship with Him?
  - 1. Slid11b Heb.11:6 And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would <u>draw near</u> to God must believe that <u>he exists</u> and that he rewards those who <u>seek him</u>.
- C. Slid11c Ask them: How might you seek Him more in your prayers?
  - 1. Slid11d Mt.7:7-11 Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. 8 For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. 9 Or which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? 10 Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a serpent? 11 If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!
- D.Slid11e Ask them: How does this change How you view Prayer in general?
  - 1. Will you start **ask**ing more questions?

### VI.Slide12a HOW WILL THIS CHANGE MY ENGAGEMENT WITH PEOPLE?

- A. Think of the people who made the biggest impact in your life. Is it the person who **lectured you** on all things true? Or the person who **listened** and **helped you reflect on life**?
  - 1. For me, the people who've made the biggest impact are the ones who asked the most questions. Slide12b Lectures have given me information, but rarely has that lead to *meaningful change in my life*.
  - 2. <u>Slide12c</u> We communicate love by asking questions. Asking questions convey we care what <u>they think</u>, <u>they feel</u>, <u>they know</u>.
  - 3. Slide12d We cannot *think well* unless we are asked questions.
- B. Last Thoughts:

- God the Father works the same way as Jesus. Remember in the last 5 chapters of Job<sub>(38-42)</sub> Ask: God the Father asks Job how many questions? 70 questions!
  - a) Listen for God asking <u>you</u> questions in your prayer time, and in reading of His Word.
- 2. Ask God questions during your prayer time. Then sit and listen.
