### What Kind Of Love?

#### I. Slidel Announce:

- A. Slide2 National Day of Prayer.
- B. Prayer: We have all *pulled back curtains* in a dark room. If you do it slowly it lets light in a little at a time. Let's pull back the curtains on our Father's Love towards us

#### II. Slide3 Intro: What Kind Of Love?

- A.St. Augustine said, "There are some so-called, but aren't what they are called."
  - 1. Years ago in Haiti we hired a *watchman* to patrol the compound at night.
  - 2. One night I heard loud snoring, definitely sounded like it was inside our house. I got up early and realize the snoring was coming from the front porch ... it was our *watchmen*.
  - 3. What do you call a *watchman* who <u>sleeps</u> through the night? Well, I had a lot of things I wanted to call him ... but *watchman* was not one of them.
    - a) In the same way many are called *Christians*, but aren't found to be so in their <u>actions</u>. Not in their **lives**, not in their **practices**, their **faith**, their **hope**, or their **love**. [our *actions* are the <u>1st measure</u> that we're in *relationship w/God*]
- B. Our 1st love was *a Parental Love* such an important foundation toward our understanding of love. Yet even if you <u>didn't</u> get to experience this *parental love*, the psalmist says in Ps.27:10, *Even if my father and mother abandon me, the Lord will hold me close*.
  - 1. So even better is **God's Love** who knows everything about you & still loves you anyway.
    - a) Has God's love changed you? I know it has *saved* you, but *transformed* you?
  - 2. Slide4a Human love is *object* oriented. God's love is *subject* oriented.
    - a) It's based on Him (His love). Which begs 2 questions: When did this love begin? And can it ever end?

- (1) Slide4b Begin? Did it start when you received Christ? Did it begin when you decided to be fully in? Nope. Rom.5:8 But God showed his great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners. (b4 the foundations of the world)
- (2) Slide4c End? Rom.8:35 msg Do you think anyone is going to be able to drive a wedge between us and <u>Christ's love for us</u>? There is no way! Not trouble, not hard times, not hatred, not hunger, not homelessness, not bullying threats, not backstabbing, <u>not even the worst sins</u> listed in Scripture.

#### C. So what kind of Love is this?

## III. Slide5a [1] IT'S ADOPTIVE LOVE (1,2a)

- A. What kind of love? (remember singing, *Behold what manner of love* ...)
  - 1. Lit. what foreign kind of love, from what country, race or tribe, what far away realm. (amazement)
  - 2. John's saying, I don't even know what country this love is from.
- B. Here is love ... in that we've been **adopted** into God's family. We're now called *the Kings kids*.
  - 1. And note this privilege (our adoption) is a direct gift of our heavenly Father.
- C. (1b) The reason why <u>the world</u> does not know us of course they don't, our possession of a divine life is altogether <u>hidden</u> from the one who doesn't possess this experience.
- D. It's not only ADOPTIVE Love ...
- IV. Slide5b [2] IT'S LIKENESS LOVE (2b) [1st step in taking a spiritual paternity test]
  - A. We see this gift of **adoption** is really the giving of the gift of Himself, we shall be *like Him*.

- 1. This verse celebrates the accomplishment of God's eternal purpose concerning man. This purpose found its expression way back in Gen.1:26 "Let Us make man in Our image, after Our Likeness."
- 2. He declares his intention of bringing into existence beings like Himself, as like Himself as it is possible for creatures to be like their Creator. (Boice)
- B. In grade school my teacher used to say, *put on your thinking caps*. Let's put on our *dreaming caps*.
  - 1. It is almost beyond our comprehension to think of anything higher than our present privilege of being children of God.
  - 2. Slide5c The difference between the present & future is one of degree *rather than* kind.
  - 3. It will consist in our future **condition** *rather than* any change of **position**.
    - a) Illust: When you go through an International Adoption in a Developing country, the paper work takes place in that country. There the child becomes yours! But now bringing the child home (to the U.S.) their condition changes, but not their position. They cannot become *more* a part of your family ... they are family.
    - b) Now think of the *difference* of going from living in a Developing Country, to moving to a 1st World Country.
    - c) Now compare 1st World living to 1st Heaven living.
  - 4. We shall be like Him ... glory & all! Col.3:4 And when Christ, who is your life, is revealed to the whole world, you will share in all his glory.
- C. It's not only ADOPTIVE Love & LIKENESS Love ...

# V. Slide5d [3] IT'S PURIFYING LOVE (3)

- A. Sonship must of necessity have *a practical result* ... Purity.
- B. Everyone that possesses this hope fixed on **seeing** & **being** like Christ hereafter *will* necessarily purify himself here & now.

C. How pure? - Just as He is pure (again shoot for the bullseye).

### D.It's not only ADOPTIVE Love & LIKENESS Love & PURIFYING Love ...

### VI. Slide5e [4] IT'S RIGHTEOUS LOVE (4-9) Living Rightly

- A. Whoever commits sin (& continues to commit sin) is displayed in the tense (pres act part)
  - 1. Whoever continues to practice sin habitually in their life.
- B. (5) Here is another reason why sin cannot be admitted into the Christian life *Christ* appeared to take away our sins.
  - 1. Slide5f In Jn.1:29 Jesus came to *take away the sin of the world* (the *root* of sin). Here (in vs.5) Jesus came to *take away our sins* (the *fruit* of sin).
- C. (7) God Himself is righteous & those who receive His life, *necessarily manifest the same feature*.
- D.(8) Another reason Jesus came ... to destroy the works of the devil.
  - 1. This is one of the aspects of sin that needs constant attention.
  - 2. To commit wrong is not merely *to break a Divine law*, but to deny the entire purpose of Christ's coming.
    - a) If Christ was about *destroying the works of the devil*, what are we doing **rebuilding** the works of the devil, *by sinning*?
- E. (4,6,9) Does not sin we know what it doesn't mean (see 1:8)
  - 1. John is saying *practicing sin* is no part of the Christians experience, & if anyone indulges this *habitual practice* (w/no repentance), it is clear proof that he has not seen Christ *nor had a personal or permanent experience of Him*.
  - 2. He cannot go on *living in sin*.
    - a) The assertion that a man who is truly *born of God* can at the same time *live in sin*, is ludicrous, as some false teachers were propagating in John's time.
- F. It's not only ADOPTIVE Love & LIKENESS Love & PURIFYING Love & RIGHTEOUS Love ...

# VII.Slide5g [5] IT'S FAMILY LOVE (10)

- A.(10) Wow what an awful contrast between *children of God & children of the devil*.
  - 1. How about a category "C"? Nope.
  - 2. These were even our Masters words, *You are of your father the devil,* and the desires of your father you want to do. (Jn.8:44)
- B. The radical distinction between these 2 groups, consists in 2 great facts: *doing* righteousness & loving your brother.
  - 1. The 1st test is towards God. The 2nd test is towards man.
- C. Children of the devil are easy to spot, for *they act like their father*. In the same way it should be easy to identify the Children of God for *they practice the righteousness of their Father*.
  - 1. Our Lifestyle Reveals Our Family Identity. And a Lifestyle Of Practicing Righteousness Involves, *Loving The Brethren*.
- D.It's not only ADOPTIVE Love & LIKENESS Love & PURIFYING Love & RIGHTEOUS Love but also, FAMILY Love.
- E. Slide6 Frederick Martin Lehman, Poem Lyrics & Composer, 1868-1953.
- F. Could we with ink the ocean fill, And were the skies of parchment made, Were every stalk on earth a quill, And every man a scribe by trade, To write the love of God above, Would drain the ocean dry.
  Nor could the scroll contain the whole, Though stretched from sky to sky.
  - 1. The **1st 2 stanzas** are Lehman's own work, but this **third**, by his own account, he heard in a camp meeting sermon. They were apparently lines that had "been found penciled on the wall of a patient's room in an insane asylum after he had been carried to his grave". They were words of a translation of an Aramaic poem, "Haddamut", written in 1050 by Rabbi Meir of Worms, Germany.
  - 2. Take a few minutes to *Re-read this. Contemplate this. Meditate on this ...* as Dani comes up.
