"MOVED WITH COMPASSION" LUKE 7:11-17 PASTOR BRIAN BELL
WARM-UP QUESTION: Which is more comforting at a funeral, the music or the stories?
"The Brokenhearted Mother" (Luke 7: 11-12) As Jesus enters Nain, he sees a widow at her own son's funeral, in a society where women had few options to support themselves. What groups of people today are especially vulnerable during tragedies?
"The Tenderhearted Messiah" (Luke 7: 13-17) Jesus is "moved with compassion" and raises this dead son to like without being asked. What does that show about Jesus? What does that mean for people?
Jesus allowed what He saw to move Him with compassion which led to him to action. What gets in the way of people today being moved with compassion? What are ways to have action led by compassion?
REFLECTION QUESTION: Jesus enters into this widow's grief and His act of compassion caused the crowd to glorify God. Have you praised God for His compassion towards you lately? Have you been grateful for the compassion that others have received? Take time to think about His compassion and thank Him for all His acts of kindness this week.

I. Slide1 Announce:

- E. On Mother's Day there is a real *tension* between celebration/honor and sorrow/ hardship. *Rejoice w/those who Rejoice* & *Weep w/those who weep*.
 - 1. To all the Moms: single moms. moms that have lost a child. or if you have lost your mom. maybe you're caring for your elderly mom. or you're longing to be a mom. to the mom whose had an abortion in her past. to the new moms. to the first time moms. to the grandmothers who are raising their grandchildren as moms. to the working moms. to the stay at home moms. to the seem's to be perfect mom.
 - a) All mom's need to reach for Jesus! All mom's need Jesus. Let the Lord simply love you today. Prov.31:31 *Reward her* for all she has done. Let her deeds publicly declare her praise.

II. Slide11 Intro: Moved With Compassion

- A. Our last story was in the larger city of <u>Capernaum</u> (re: a Gentile Centurion, Jesus healed his son from afar). *If you'll strap on your sandals with me* we are going to walk a dusty 25 miles SW to a little village called Nain. (pop. 200)
 - 1. So we go from an influential soldier to a poor widow. She represents Jesus' mission when He said, *the good news will be presented to the poor*
 - 2. The story stresses the adequacy & authority of Jesus' Word.

- 3. At the foot of Nain's slope is the great *Valley of Jezreel*. This was the 1st of 3 miracles Jesus did in *raising of the dead*.
- B. Outline: The Brokenhearted Mother & The Tenderhearted Messiah.
- C. Prayer:

III. Slide12 THE BROKENHEARTED MOTHER (11,12) READ

- A. A dead son a declaration of *despair*. Whether it's the death of a child, or a child that is estranged, or isn't speaking to you, is strung out on __ & not speaking to you.
- B. Slide13 Here 2 processions collide at *Nain's* city gate.
 - 1. In one procession the central figure is **Christ**, in the other a **corpse**.
 - 2. One group is entering the city, the other leaving the city.
 - 3. Here death meets life, disorder meets order, mourning meets ministry
 - 4. In one group joy & gladness, the other sorrow & sadness.

IV. Slide14 THE TENDERHEARTED MESSIAH (13-17) READ

- A. Slide15a A COMPASSIONATE SAVIOR (13)
- B. Now, this all happens *without* any expression of **faith**. Jesus just does it. It's not like the centurion who asked for his help. *That is like our Jesus*.
 - 1. And He still acts this way towards us, Jesus blesses us immensely even when we don't ask him to.
- C. Slide15b He enters into her pain, He enters into her agony. Why? The text says, he had compassion on her.
 - 1. Jesus had all the authority, but he also had compassion. If He only had authority with no compassion, we would *tremble* today.
 - 2. Luke uses the deepest word that he could use (splank-Nee-zoMY) to be deeply moved with your bowels/guts. He feels deeply for her. prod dad/Gd Sam

- a) Why is it significant? because you know we will suffer some *dark days* in each our lives (or, a *Dark Night of the Soul*¹). And Jesus shines in the shadows.
- b) You may have come in today w/pain so deep. So wounded by trauma. And you come into our church service and you feel *unlike everybody else*. You're not unlike everyone else, *everyone needs the touch of Jesus*.
- c) And there is not a wound that <u>I have</u>, that <u>He</u> does not know about, and that <u>He</u> cannot heal.
- D. Slide15c What did Jesus' heart snag on? *A mother* ... who lost her <u>only son</u> ... after losing her husband/widow. [the 2nd time she was robbed of her provider & protector]
 - 1. A mother is what caught His heart ... not nec the dead son.
- E. Instead of *a flash-back* I wonder if Jesus was having a *flash-forward* to his <u>own mother</u>?
 - 1. Mary would experience these *same feelings & deep hurts*, but He will not be able to stop that process (of His mother's sword).
 - 2. The lady's **son** would've been her means of support. This, a day of no *Soc.Sec., retirement account, pension, life insurance.*
 - a) One writer put it, "Though her life ended, her existence continued."
 - b) It's in this moment that Jesus enters into her sadness. He enters into the most Slide15d agonizing day of her life. Remember, He had been sent *to heal the brokenhearted*.
 - 3. Jesus and his team could've done what we all do when a funeral procession goes by, we pull over. Jesus instead, stops all of the cars, walks up to the hearse, and says, Young man, I say to you, arise.
- F. Slide15e Do not weep Wait, what? (Ps: if you're at a funeral, don't say that!).
 - 1. We don't make light of grief, and healthy Christian' *grieve*. We actually are told to join them, *weep with those that weep*.
 - 2. But Jesus says it here, because He anticipates doing something about it.
 - 3. It was a declaration of compassion.

- G. Slide15f Note Jesus reacted by: Seeing, feeling, speaking, & acting.
 - 1. Seeing Look for opportunities. (don't be so absorbed in ... you!)
 - 2. Feeling Allow your heart to feel. (don't become callous to *others* needs/hurts)
 - 3. Speaking Speak Up. (don't allow the crowd to muzzle you)
 - 4. Acting Do good, do something. (don't only be touched on the inside. True sympathy must be put into action). Feelings must become touch or they will soon evaporate.²

H. Slide 16a FUNERAL CRASHER (14,15a)

- I. Jesus spoke to the dead & he heard.
 - 1. See, the dead are alive (spiritually) they're just detached from their body.
 - 2. Jesus, a sympathizing friend, a living reality, a powerful Lord.
- J. Slide16b I say to you, arise a declaration of power over death.
 - 1. Here, <u>Death</u> is swallowed up in **victory**. O <u>death</u>, where is your **victory**? O <u>death</u>, where is your **sting**? 1 Cor.15:54,55
 - a) Here is a precursor to His final mission *to abolish death*.
- K. Jesus knew just how to ruin a perfectly good funeral.
 - 1. He never attended nor officiated 1 funeral service, that we know of.
 - 2. This funeral procession turned into a Walk for Life.
- L. Slide16c Then the deadman sat up and began to speak. *That's just freaky*. What did the pallbearers do? And, I wonder what he said?
 - 1. "Hey, let me down! Get me out of this box. Mom, I promise to be good!" Maybe his 1st word was ... ema/mother.

M.Slide17a A HAPPY MOTHER (15b)

N. And Jesus *gave him* to his mother (it was about *her*) - another display of compassion.

- Slide17b Even death is in the reach of Jesus' power. So why doesn't
 Jesus raise a bunch people right now? The same reason He didn't do it
 in the gospels.
 - a) We only have 3 cases where this happens in Luke's Gospel. Why doesn't he Slide17c raise up a bunch of people? Because it is <u>not</u> time yet. Listen, but soon it will be! Soon it will be friends. Soon we will hear get up Andrew, arise; Get up Angie, arise. We are resurrection people.
 - b) 1 Thes.4:16 For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And **the dead** in Christ <u>will</u> rise first.
- O.Do not despair. He may not raise your love one back to <u>this world</u>, but Jesus' promise is still true today, *he who believes in me, though he may die*, *he shall live*.
- P. Slide 18 A GOD VISIT (16,17)
- Q. What is the response of the people of Nain?
- R. Then fear came upon all, and they glorified God -
- S. A great **prophet** has arisen among us.
 - They were probably thinking about the prophet *Elisha*, who did this miracle just over the hill from them. This happened many years back, and was recorded in the Jewish writings of 1 kings 17.
 - 2. Actually both Elijah and Elisha raised someone from the dead, both praying to the Father for this. The difference with Jesus is He didn't pray to a *higher power*, as **He was the higher power**. He just says 1 word, arise, and he rose. Because he is more than a prophet, He is the divine son of God.
- T. God has visited His people They didn't realize how accurate they were.
- U.Don't miss the fact: again, nothing is mentioned about the **mothers faith**, or lack thereof. Nothing is mentioned of any lesson after this to the crowds following Him. It wasn't even prompted by the crowds to prove His divinity.

- 1. It was solely from the well of divine compassion. Someone *broken*, *hurting*, *weak*, *frail* ... moved the heart of God!
- 2. Billy Graham said, *The God who has everything...wanted me*.
- V. Slide19 God hath not promised sun w/o rain, Joy w/o sorrow, peace w/o pain;

 But God hath promised strength for the day, Rest for the labor, light for the way.
