#### "GOSPEL ACTION" | 1 THESSALONIANS 2 | PASTOR BRIAN BELL

#### **WARM-UP QUESTION:**

What are common ways the gospel is shared in our culture today?

#### "Gospel Motives" (1 Thess 2: 1-20)

Paul reminds the people that he and his team shared the gospel out of love and became like family to them. What are the advantages of sharing the gospel through friendships/close relationships? What are the disadvantages?

#### "Gospel Methods and Message" (1 Thess 2: 1-20)

Paul and his team came with boldness as they shared the gospel, a message of what Jesus did for humans through His death and resurrection. Because it is true, pure and without deceit, the gospel can be shared boldly. **How can believers share the gospel both with boldness and in love today?** 

#### "Gospel Oppositions" (1 Thess 2: 1-20)

Paul points out that believers have been hindered in sharing the gospel and persecuted for their faith like Jesus. **Who or what hinders you from following and sharing the gospel?** 

#### "Gospel Outcomes" (1 Thess 2: 1-20)

Paul is so thankful that the gospel was "accepted" by the Thessalonians, and it was "at work" in their lives. What changes in a person's life when the gospel is at work in them?

#### **REFLECTION QUESTION:**

The gospel changes people's lives in a way that changes their character to become more like Jesus, but that also leads to persecution from society and Satan. Have you been suffering for your faith lately? Have you been looking to God to give you endurance and wisdom? Pray that God would continue to make you an imitator of Jesus through all of it.

## 1 Thessalonians 2

## Gospel Action

#### I. Slide1 Announce:

- A. Slide2-5 AL: Perspectives. Missions Prayer. CG. GS.
- B. Slide Baby Dedication (2nd): Sienna & Trey Williams. (Paul & Ashley Williams)
  - 1. Sienna fell off a trampoline and broke her elbow. When they went in to get that taken care of they <u>noticed something else</u>, which presented a *tumor on her brain*. They have been doing <u>different surgery's</u> and <u>chemo</u>, and goes in for an <u>MRI on August 4</u>, would like <u>prayer</u> for that apt.

## II. Slide7 Intro: Gospel Action

- A. Big Idea: When *sharing the Gospel*, check your motive, method, and message.
  - 1. Outline: Gospel Motives. Gospel Methods. Gospel Message. Gospel Oppositions. Gospel Outcomes.
- B. What is the gospel? Why am I being tested? What should be my *motives, methods, and message* when I share the good news? Will I run into oppositions? What outcomes should I expect?
- C. Prayer: Lord, we've seen good ministry behavior, and poor ministry behavior.
- D. Slide8,9 Read all 2:1-20 [change slide after vs.8].

## III. Slide 10 GOSPEL MOTIVES

- A.(7) We were **gentle** among you Paul had the same love for the Thessalonians as a *new nursing mother* delights to care for her newborn.
  - 1. Young believers need *sp parents* to lovingly nurture them in the Lord.
  - 2. We read earlier Paul's ministry was a ministry of *courage and boldness*, but it was also a ministry motivated by love.
  - 3. It's true, love has to be **tough-love** sometimes, but it must **1st** be taught to be **tender-love**.
- B. (8a) Being affectionately desirous of you 1 word, only used here in bible.

- C.(8b) we were ready to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you had become <u>very dear</u> to us.
  - 1. For Paul, it was important that the gospel wasn't only the right words being spoken, but the right life being lived. [RO leader u visit us & eat w/us]
  - 2. Paul points out that his ministry in Thessalonica was not a hit-and-run gospel invasion. Instead, he and his associates were happy to stay, form friendships, and invest in their new friends' lives.
    - a) What are the benefits of so-called "relational" or "friendship" evangelism?
    - b) What are the potential dangers?
- D.(11,12) For you know how, <u>like</u> **a father** with his children, we <u>exhorted</u> each one of you and <u>encouraged</u> you and <u>charged</u> you to walk in a manner worthy of God, who calls you into his own kingdom and glory.
  - 1. Paul was caring/nurturing *like a mom* and motivating/urging *like a dad*. [obviously moms can motivate & urge and dads can care & nurture]

### IV. Slide 11 GOSPEL METHODS

- A.(2) We had **boldness** in our God to declare to you the gospel of God Paul came with a definite aim and he hit what he aimed for.
  - 1. And this *boldness* came right after suffering and being shameful treated at Philippi (Acts 16:22-24). What happened in Philippi?
    - a) Men of the city were *trafficking* a slave girl who had *a spirit of divination*, which *brought them much gain through fortunetelling*. Paul cast the demon out of her. The owners of her stirred up a mob. Paul and Silas were *stripped naked*, *beaten w/rods*, *whipped*, *thrown in jail*, & *their feet fastened in stocks*.
- B. Paul said, they never came with words of **flattery**, nor w/a pretext of **greed** (5). They didn't **seek glory** from people (6). They didn't make demands on them from their position as **apostles** (6).

## V. Slide12a GOSPEL MESSAGE

- A. What is the Gospel? [lit def. good news, good story]
  - 1. The gospel is what has been done for us by God in Jesus.
    - a) The gospel is **God's story** of *His character, His is love, His grace*; wrapped in **Jesus's story** of His *death, burial, and resurrection*.
  - 2. The gospel is the startling news that ... what **God** <u>demands</u> from us, **He provides** for us.
  - 3. The gospel is not only *the gateway into* the Christian life, but also *the pathway of* the Christian life. (8)
- B. Slide12b (3) For our **appeal** does not spring from <u>error</u> or <u>impurity</u> or any attempt to <u>deceive</u>.
  - 1. The Gospel didn't have its source in **error** (the facts are true)
  - 2. The Gospel is not **impure** (Christianity didn't have any *immoral rites* & *rituals* like the <u>cults</u> did)
  - 3. The Gospel wasn't **deceitful** (no <u>lying</u> to get people into the kingdom. The ends don't justify the means, or *The morality* of the <u>means</u> is more important than the **desirability** of the <u>end</u>)
- C. Slide12c (4) We have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel -
  - 1. Own this! You and I have been approved and entrusted with His Best News for others. Charles Hodge said it this way, Every member of God's family has the right and the obligation to make known this great salvation to his/her fellow humans.
    - a) Entrusted this gospel treasure is not ours. It did not originate with us. It is not a rough draft. It needs no editors. Our responsibility is simply to *believe it*, *cherish it, apply it, guard it, and proclaim it*. And Paul insists that this gospel stewardship must be accompanied by pure motives and open methods.
- D.2 more things about the Word of God (or *The Gospel of God*)
  - 1. Slide13a **1st**, God delivered His Word through ordinary men in terms we can understand.

- a) 2 Pet.1:20,21 Knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation (origin). 21 For no prophecy was ever produced (never came into being) by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit (carried along = a nautical term, to be borne along, a ship carried by winds. The prophets raised their sails, and the Holy Spirit filled them, & carried their craft along in the direction He wished)
- 2. Slide13b 2nd, The Word of God changes people & makes them different
  - a) 2 Tim.3:16,17 *All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching* (what is right), *for reproof* (what is not right), *for correction* (how to get right), *and for training in righteousness* (how to stay right), *that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.*

## VI.Slide14a GOSPEL OPPOSITIONS opposed and hindered

- A. The BIG IDEA in (13-16): the dynamic power of God's Word produces *godliness* in believers that provokes *persecution*. This leads to 2 very different outcomes: Endurance for believers (13,14). Wrath for the persecutors (15,16).
- B. Remember 2 things: Opposition is permitted by God (Job). Opposition is His method of training (to overcome trouble, and to rise above it).
- C. Slide14b Why Does God Test Us?
  - 1. To **Expose** what's in our hearts. (Deut.8:2 And you shall remember the whole way that the Lord your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, that he might humble you, **testing you** to know what was in your heart) [God knew, they didn't know]
  - 2. Slide14c To Refine us. (Ps.66:10 For you, O God, have tested us; you have tried us as silver is tried) [increase heat. refine precious metal. dross removed]
  - 3. Slide14d To Mature us. (James 1:2-4 Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet **trials** of various kinds, for you know that the **testing** of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be <u>perfect</u> and <u>complete</u>, lacking in nothing.)

- a) Illust: In Savannah Georgia, they have those *Savanna oak trees, w/Spanish moss hanging from their branches*. They all lean in the same direction and are twisted. Why? They lean towards the Atlantic.
  - (1) The strong winds that come off the ocean **buffet** the tree. And the trees of **learn to lean** against the wind. And they become **strengthened** because of that.
  - (2) That's the way it is with **us**. We are going to lean into the things that buffet us ... but it will make us *stronger* for it.
- D. Slide15 **Suffering** for the gospel was the calling not just of the apostles (1,2) but also of the whole congregation (14).
  - 1. The Thessalonians' opponents were not enemies from *foreign lands* but were *their own countrymen* (14).
  - 2. Have you ever suffered <u>relationally</u> or <u>socially</u>, <u>perhaps even <u>physically</u> for your Christian faith? Or from your <u>Christian-countrymen</u>?</u>
- E. (16) Paul says that **the Jews** who killed Jesus and who protest to *thwart gospel* advance are "[filling] up the measure of their sins."
  - 1. This depicts a period of *recurring sin* that eventually reaches a breaking point and induces God's judgment.
- F. (15) **Oppose** all mankind -
- G. We've already seen opposition from: the **state** (2), from **society** (14), and now from **satan** (18).
- H.(18) Satan **hindered** him *enkoptō* literally means *to cut up*. It could be used to describe *an army destroying an enemy's road*, consequently hindering their travel.
  - 1. In which ways, as you look back on your week, have **you** been *hindered*?

# VII.Slide16 GOSPEL OUTCOMES hope, joy, crown, and YOU (our glory & joy)

A. Their preaching had **immediate** and **impressive** consequences, and a **permanent change** took place in the lives of the believers.

- 1. (13) They had an **appetite** for the word of God (*received* and *accepted*), and they **put it to work** immediately (*works in you*).
  - a) received refers to the ear, accepted it refers to the heart.
  - b) A **rabbi** was asked a question by a **pupil**, referring to Deut. 6:6 *And these words that I command you today shall be <u>on your heart</u>. "Why is it said this way?" the pupil asked. "Why are we not told to place them <u>in</u> our heart?" The rabbi answered that it is not within man's power to place the divine teachings directly in his heart. "All that we can do is place them on the surface of the heart so that when the heart breaks ... they will drop in."*
- B. What is our **hope** or **joy** or **crown** of boasting before our Lord Jesus at His coming? Is it not **you**? For **you** are our **glory** and **joy**.
  - 1. CM **YOU** are my hope, and joy, and crown, and glory, at the 2nd Coming of Christ:)
- C. Keywords: motives, methods, message, opposition, outcomes.
