I. Slide1-3 Announce:

II. Slide4a Intro:

- A. This is about *Church Life*. It's about *how to do Church Together*.
 - 1. May I say, what I'm encouraged about is this 1st church of Crete was messed up. I'm not rejoicing in that fact, I'm just thankful that we get to learn from their mistakes.
 - 2. Slide4b It's about how to excel spiritually as a church family.
 - a) Which Paul ties to *excelling spiritually* in **your own family**.

 And, *excelling spiritually* in **your business life**, And in **your work life**.
 - 3. To oversee a church you want to **choose leaders** who can & are doing it at **home** & at their **job**.
 - 4. But Paul doesn't stop there with just *church leadership*, but...it properly starts there.
 - a) Paul will talk about men/women, young/old, revealing *each* have their vital functions to fulfill *in the church*.
 - b) In a nutshell, CM must be *living examples of* what we **believe**. Paul will display good works as desirable & profitable for **all** believers.
- B. Book Overview: Love what is Good. Teach what is Good. Do what is Good.

C. Why is this book important to *ALL* of us?

- 1. Because some of you might go on the mission field, or plant a church, or be in church leadership.
- 2. Because the church should be important to you, it's Jesus his bride.
- 3. Because most church problems come back to this issue of *failure in leadership*.
- 4. Because everything in this list of qualifications about elders, pertains to every Christian. (even able to *give instruction in sound doctrine*, is discipleship)

- a) So this shouldn't be only relegated to *an elite group* (like the Navy SEALs of the church). See it as a profile of Jesus.
- b) Every dad is a pastor of his kids. Everyone should aspire to be a leader.
- c) And if you are a single lady, <u>this</u> is who you want to marry. You should want to marry a pastor (not nec the **office** of the pastor, <u>but</u> of the **character** of a pastor). Teach that to your younger daughters, *marry this guy here!*
- d) What lady wouldn't want to marry a *hospitable*, *self-controlled*, *one woman guy*, who is a *lover of good*?
- 5. So we should all be praying through each of these areas of your own life.
- D. This book is about *Renovating the Church* (not the building, the people).
- E. A Good Church isn't about having *a good preacher, good worship team, and a good website*. It's about qualified leaders and sound doctrine.
 - 1. Churches usually fail/fall because of a problem in church leadership.

III. Slide5 BOOK INTRO (1-4)

- A. Typical 1st cent letter writing style: Names the **source** (Paul). Names the **recipient** (Titus), & then pronounces a blessing upon him.
- B. (1) Great combo: Bondservant/Apostle. Humility: God's slave. Calling: God's spokesman.
- C. Slide6a Notice truth leads to godliness (nlt) I have been sent to proclaim faith to those God has chosen & to teach them to know the **truth** that shows them how to live **godly** lives.
 - 1. Beliefs determine your behavior.
 - 2. "Theology leads to biography" (If you want to know what will be written about your life, just ask yourself, what am I believing?)
- D. Slide6b (2) God who cannot lie/lit. the unlying God Yep, there are things God can't do.
 - God can't get tired. God can't be unholy. God can't be prejudiced. God can't break a promise. God can't remember sins He's chosen to forget (actually, God can't forget, but it means He chooses to not hold you

accountable for, or re-judge you for). God can't abandon you. God can't stop **thinking** about you. God can't stop **loving** you.

- E. Slide6c God who cannot lie *promised* (promised what? hope of eternal life)
 - Faith is recognizing God's *promises* as actual fact, believing it is true, rejoicing in the knowledge of that truth, and then simply resting because God said it.
 - 2. Faith turns promises into prophecy.
 - Faith does not say, "I see this is good for me; therefore God must have sent it." Instead, faith declares, "God sent it; therefore it must be good for me."
 - a) Slide7a *Faith*, when walking through the dark with God, only asks Him to hold his hand more tightly. Phillips Brooks
 - 4. God, the guardian of truth, cannot lie about this hope of eternal life.
 - a) Because He can't speak a lie, His words can always be trusted.
 - b) Since all of Scripture is spoken by God, all of Scripture must be "unlying".
 - c) Slide7b That might sound like too simplistic of an argument, but that what Paul uses here. "The Bible is God's words. God never lies. Therefore the Bible never lies."
 - 5. Also note for later, Cretans were known for being liars (12).
- F. (4) Pastor Titus was a Greek. Paul won him to Christ (vs.4 a true son, obviously *spiritually* speaking). And then enlisted in service by Paul.
 - He became one of Paul's close assistants & was sent to the churches to represent the apostle. On Paul's 3rd missionary trip, he left Titus in Crete to pastor there.
- G. We'll see next week, apparently the saints on Crete were better at **professing** the faith than **practicing** it.

H. Titus is advised on how to deal with 2 categories of people: Leaders in the church (5-9)...next week, Legalists in the church (10-16).

IV. Slide8 ORDER AND APPOINT (5-9) READ

- A. We do not know who *founded* the church in Crete, but we do know that Paul *left*Titus there to organize it and deal with the mess.
- B. (5) Key scripture: When an infant church grows up it needs structure & guidance.
 - 1. Structure: Set in order (we'll see what gets set in order in vs.10-16)
 - a) The church body suffers when we *avoid* facing & solving serious problems.
 - b) As long as Christians are in this body of flesh, there *will be* problems in our churches.
 - c) Not if but when these problems arise, the answer is not to <u>hide</u> them, or for officers to <u>resign</u> and find a new church. The answer is to face them **honestly** and **prayerfully** and **settle them** according to *the Word of God*.
 - (1) Slide9a So what do you need to Set in Order? in your physical life? in your spiritual life? in your emotional life? in your marriage? in your dating relationship? in your business practices? in your school life? in your thought life?
 - (2) Slide9b What needs to be set in order at CM? Actually a lot, that we're working on w/our whole staff. We're looking at our next years budget (fiscal/July). Your tithes, God's \$. Our accountability. Looking at all job descriptions, time spent, holes we need to fill (paid vs. volunteer). We always are. Won't stop. above reproach.
 - 2. Guidance: Appoint elders (we'll see in vs. 6-9) [This is what needs to be set in order in *our church*...elders/deacons]
 - a) Note: *Elder*, *overseer*, pastor, shepherd, bishop = all the same. Jesus is the chief Shepherd (the true Senior Pastor), we are all *under shepherds*.
- C. Slide 10a Crete 5th largest islands in Med, 160m long, 37m wide (TJ/Malibu. 8 Catalinas)

- D. Note: 3 basic areas of requirement for *prospective elders*. [*may this also be a prayer list for *your* church leadership team]
 - 1. Slide10b BLAMELESS IN RELATIONSHIPS (6) marriage and family
 - a) (lit.) a one woman man.
 - b) As per our marriages, you can't say, *I want a personal relationship w/God, but not a covenant relationship w/Him.* **God** only relates in terms of <u>covenant</u>.

 And any serious relationship, *like marriage*, does the same.
 - c) As per our children, they should be believing/actually <u>faithful</u> children if the elder is capable of influencing his own children <u>toward</u> Christ with effective spiritual leadership, that suggests the same probability of effective leadership in the church.
 - (1) Doesn't mean that leadership children/young adults have to be perfect. We as leadership families all go through different seasons of our lives. But as you are choosing prospective elders look for men who have their home life & business life in order.
 - 2. Slide10c BLAMELESS IN CONDUCT (7,8) personality and character traits
 - a) 5 Temptations: pride, temper, drink, power, money.
 - b) above reproach/blameless *Philip Towner explained it best, "blameless is more a measure of *wholeness & balance* than of *perfection*. The code examines all dimensions of life for evidence of the Spirit's influence in each part. This kind of balanced *reading* means development toward maturity is *under way*. And Paul felt that *whole* believers were best suited for church leadership."²
 - c) Steward a *manager* of a household or family.
 - (1) Your leadership has a higher accountability.
 - (2) The higher your **responsibility** the higher your **accountability** (i.e. a police officer. A judge. A school teacher)

- (3) Who cares if a pastor is a great communicator if his **home life** or **lifestyle** is a joke?
- 3. Slide10d HOLD FIRM TO THE WORD (9)
 - a) Sound doctrine *hygiene* (*gk*), *healthy*, *whole doctrine*. Teaching that contributes to the sp health of the church.
 - (1) Just as a physician must attack *infection & disease*, so local church leaders must *attack* false doctrine.
 - (2) Slide 10e What a great & natural *segue* from upholding sound doctrine, to those who don't.
- E. Slide11 (9) msg knowing how to use the **truth** to **either** <u>spur people on</u> in knowledge or <u>stop them in their tracks</u> if they oppose it. [figure out: what is true & not true]
 - 1. An elder is a guardian or protector of the truth.
 - 2. One who must understand it, hold it fast.
 - 3. Encourage others by teaching it. Refute those who oppose it.
 - 4. He must be *a capable handler* of the truth.
