#### "THE MODEL OF FAITH" | LUKE 7:1-10 | PASTOR BRIAN BELL

# **WARM-UP QUESTION:** What comes to mind when someone says "centurion"? "A Faith for the Whole World that Made the Messiah Marvel" (Luke 7: 1-10) This centurion wasn't Jewish or a disciple, yet Jesus applauds his faith. What does that show about Jesus? What does that mean for people? "A Faith Filled with Love and Full of Humility" (Luke 7: 1-10) This Roman military leader, motivated by love for his bondservant, does not demand or argue for Jesus to heal but asks humbly. How does humility relate to faith? "A Faith in Jesus to Heal With A Word" (Luke 7: 1-10) The centurion believes Jesus has the power to heal from a distance with just a command. What are ways to show that kind of belief in Jesus this week?

#### **REFLECTION QUESTION:**

This Roman military leader was publicly praised by Jesus for his model of faith because of his humble approach and belief that Jesus had the power. When you look at your own life, do you ask Jesus for mercy or believe you've earned His blessings? Do you believe Jesus has power today? Pray for God to give you humility and faith in His authority.

### The Model Of Faith

#### I. Announce:

- A. Slide1-4 A.L: CK Summer Camp. Sun Prayer. REAL. Starting Point. Fresh Faith.
- B. Slide 5 B: *National Day of Prayer* is this Thurs, **May 5**. 1st, join us for *Pray at the Pole* at 12 noon-12:30. (flags between City Hall/MPD). Also a free community event for *National Day of Prayer* is meeting here in the Sanct that eve from 7-9pm.
  - 1. I've asked Jen Bursch to come up and talk about the Assembly Bill, AB 2223. Jen is not only a dear friend, but is our Attorney that understands the complexity of laws and how they are written. She is the managing partner at Tyler & Bursch and has practiced Constitutional Law since 2006. I thought she would be best to help us understand AB 2223.
- C. Slide6a/b,7 Jen: AB2223. And Baby Bottle Campaign.
- D. Prayer: [Ex. Dir.]
- II. Slide8 Intro: The Model Of Faith (not just a model, the model of faith)
  - A.Look at the very end of ch.7, where there is a question that we can place over the whole chapter, *who is this?* 
    - 1. In this chapter, Luke **paints** a beautiful <u>portrait</u> of our <u>compassionate</u> Savior, through a series of encounters that Jesus has.
      - a) Compassion has been defined as, your pain in my heart.
      - b) He's going to heal a man *physically* because God cares for the whole person. And that's why we today should be about *acts of mercy*. [not that He always heals]
    - 2. We see Jesus really is for the whole world. It doesn't depend on your **social status**, or your **race**, or your **works**. You may think this morning that *This Jesus isn't for me*, but He is for **you**.
    - 3. What we see in this chapter is **faith** appearing in *very surprising places*.
      - a) The Good News is for: a gentile soldier, a grieving widow, for a doubting prophet, a sinful women, and for a demon possessed woman.

- b) The Good News is for those: disturbed by sickness and confronted by death, for those troubled by doubt, & for those that are stricken by guilt.
- 4. Who is this Jesus? This week and next, we'll see that He is *The God over sickness and death*. [Every story is about an individual, who loves *another person*]

## III. Slide9 THE MODEL OF FAITH (1-10) READ

- A. Slide 10a A FAITH THAT MADE THE MESSIAH MARVEL (9) When Jesus heard these things, he marveled at him, and turning to the crowd that followed him, said, "I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith."
- B. In our story today we have such *a model of faith* from a gentile soldier.
- C. It's interesting, the story isn't really about the healing but about the centurions faith. Because, look how it ends (*read* 10), the healing is like an *afterthought*. They returned to the house, and he was healed. The story is more about **his faith**, *a faith that turns heads*.
  - 1. He marveled & turned to the crowd It's an Applauding Faith.
  - 2. I love that Jesus turned around to the crowd. He's in awe of this Gentile's Faith. (check that out, did you hear that?)
    - a) He esteems his faith *higher* than any of His own Jewish people.
- D. Slide 10b How will you make the Messiah Marvel at your faith in Him, this week?
- E. Slide 11 A FAITH FOR THE WHOLE WORLD (2) a centurion (100 men under his authority)
- F. A centurion sending a delegation to Him was odd: We have a wealthy man, dealing with a poor man. A Roman citizen, asking something of an Israeli citizen.
  A Gentile, asking a Jew. A powerful centurion, asking a meek carpenter.
  A mighty man of war, asking of the *Prince of Peace*.
- G. Faith in unexpected places. This **faith** that Jesus highlights here, is not from the religious establishment, but from a gentile/centurion/Roman or Syrian soldier. Faith in unexpected places.
  - 1. My Story: communist soldier that walked up to me in the Airport.

2. You never know where you might find Jesus' grace shining, or in whom.

### H. Slide12a A FAITH FILLED WITH LOVE (1-5) a bond-servant

- I. Not only sick but at the point of death.
  - 1. Some of you this week are in the same place as this centurion, somebody you know and love and maybe caring for *is dying soon*.
- J. In an age where we love *control*, it's hard for us to talk about **death** because we *cannot* **control** it. *We can <u>postpone</u> it sometimes, but we cannot defeat it.* 
  - 1. So we try to joke it off and use phrases like, *kick the bucket, pushing up daisies,* or mystify it by simply saying, *passing away.*
- K. Slide12b Do you have a philosophy of life that will cope with your death?
  - 1. Jesus is the only one that holds power over death.
- L. Slide13a A FAITH FULL OF HUMILITY (6) I am not worthy. I did not presume to come to you
- M. This is a shocking expression coming from a leader in the Roman occupying force.
  - 1. But the man is truly an Officer and a Gentleman.
- N. Opinions concerning this Gentile Roman Centurion:
  - 1. Slide13b **The Jewish elder's opinion:** 1) He's worthy/deserving. 2) He loves our nation. 3) He built us our synagogue.
    - a) We learn that this man is *loving*, thoughtful, & benevolent.
    - b) In the synagogue we visit in Capernaum, it dates back to the 4th century, but under its floor is the original foundation from the 1st century *this guy paid for*.
    - c) Here, this soldier laid an important *faith* foundation 2000 years ago, that still exists. Oh, and it was *pre-Jesus doing anything for him*.
    - d) But let's get back to *the religious leaders* telling Jesus to heal his servant *because* ... *You owe him!*

- (1) Religious peoples religious mind set: Think they if they do something **bad** that they owe God. Think they if they do something **good**, God owes them.
- (2) But we don't *pay God back*, Jesus does! And God doesn't owe us anything, He gives us grace.
- e) Slide14a We can never deserve His blessings but we can ask for them in faith.
- 2. His opinion of himself: I am not worthy/sufficient that you should enter under my roof (diff word: meant he could not entertain Jesus as Jesus ought to be entertained) I did not presume/worthy to come to you. (same word elder's used).
  - a) Slide14b Bernard of Clairvaux said, Justice seeks out only the merits of the case, but pity only regards the need.
  - b) "God sends <u>none</u> away empty <u>but</u> those who are **full of themselves**."
- O. There is always 2 ways to approach Jesus on merit and on mercy. Your choice!
  - 1. Most people think that they are *OK* because they are somewhere in between *Mother Teresa and a serial killer*.
  - 2. That's why this guy is **a model of faith**, because he realizes he can only come by mercy and not merit.
- P. Slide15 A FAITH IN JESUS TO HEAL (7) say the word
- Q.It's his **faith** that believes that Jesus can heal.
  - Not, come to my house and pray to the father to heal, but that Jesus
    could do it. 2ndly, Jesus can heal from afar. Today you do not need to see
    Jesus to ask for healing either, he can heal from afar.
- R. Slide16 A FAITH IN A WORD OF JESUS (7,8) authority
- S. We should all come to Christ like this man: 1) w/a Confession of **Humility**, *I am not worthy*. 2) w/a Confession of **Faith**, *Say the Word*.

- 1. He didn't need to go. He didn't even need to utter a word (we don't have any recorded here).
- T. End: Do you know this Jesus? Do you approach him in humility? Do you remind him of your merits, or ask him for his mercy? Do you believe he has this kind of authority?
  - 1. Some people have a hard time with the idea of just faith itself.
  - 2. Some think if I'm a rational person I can't be a person of faith.
  - 3. Some think that these operate in completely different realms.
- U. Some mischaracterize the Christian faith by calling it blind trust.
  - 1. But that's not Christian faith. We believe there is sufficient evidence for faith. It still takes faith, but it's <u>not</u> a leap into the dark ... It's a leap into the light. The centurion had sufficient evidence in the work of Jesus to believe in him. And that's what we do.
- V. How will you make the **Messiah Marvel** at your faith in Him, this week?
