II. Slide8 Intro: Heaven's HR Dept.

- A. Slide9 "Where Do You (or Have You) Worked?" (raise hand, after each)
 - 1. Medical Field: Who's in the medical field (doctors, nurses, caregivers, therapists)?
 - 2. Education: Teachers, professors, coaches, or school staff?
 - 3. Construction/Trades: Anyone in building, repairs, mechanics, or engineering?
 - 4. Business/Tech/Office Work: Office jobs, business, finance, or tech?
 - 5. Service Industry: Retail, restaurants, hospitality, customer service?

- 6. Public Service: Law enforcement, military, fire, or first responders?
- 7. Agriculture/Outdoors: Farming, landscaping, environmental work?
- 8. Creative/Media: Artists, photographers, writers, or musicians?
- 9. Home/Family Work: Stay-at-home parents, homeschoolers, caregivers?

B. Slide 10 Cultural Setting.

- C. In Paul's day, slavery (Greek: doulos) was a common part of Greco-Roman life. Roughly 1/3 of the pop. of Ephesus would've been <u>enslaved</u> in some way.
 - Most slaves were household servants, not field laborers (as in later Western slavery), and many were educated professionals (teachers, doctors, artisans, accountants).
 - 2. While Roman slavery was still **unjust** and **exploitative**, **it was not race-based** and slaves could often purchase or earn freedom.

D. Paul's Approach.

- E. Paul doesn't endorse slavery; rather, he plants the seeds that ultimately undermine it.
 - 1. He elevates slaves to moral equals: they can serve as unto Christ.
 - 2. He **reminds masters** that they too have a *Master in heaven*.
 - 3. The gospel here is *transforming social relationships from within*, not through revolt but through *redemptive redefinition* both slave and master stand equal before Christ. Gal. 3:28 *There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus*.

F. Application Today.

G. Whether slave or free reminds us that this passage directly applies to the employer/employee relationship (authority, submission, work ethic, and accountability under God).

- 1. It's a theology of work as worship!
- H. Here Paul steps into the real world of work (not a fantasy church world) but the world of *masters and servants, bosses and employees*. And what he teaches here can transform any workplace into *a place of worship*.
 - 1. He tells both workers and leaders: Whatever you do, do it as unto the Lord. In other words you work for Jesus ... and that changes everything!

III. Slide11 1. WORK HEARTILY (5-6)

- A. Bondservants, **obey** your earthly masters with **fear** and **trembling**, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ, 6 not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart,
- B. Obedience ... with fear and trembling respectful reverence, not servile fear.
- C. Not with eye-service don't just perform when being watched.
 - When painting the Sistine Chapel, Michelangelo was asked why he took such care painting details on the high ceiling no one would see.
 He replied, "God will see." [we serve an unseen, but watching Master]
- D. As to Christ reframes all work your boss isn't your ultimate boss.
- E. "The Christian's work is not secular; it's sacred when done for a sacred Master."

IV. Slide12a 2. SERVE WILLINGLY (7)

- A. Rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man,
- B. Good will a willing spirit, joyful cooperation.
- C. The workplace becomes *a mission field* when we work with a gospel heart.
- D. Our attitude matters as much as our output. [isn't just competence it's Christlike character]
- E. Col. 3:23: Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men.
- F. A **janitor** at NASA in the 1960s was asked, "What's your job here?" He replied, "I'm helping put a man on the moon." [he understood his small role in a great mission]

1. Slide12b No task is too small when done for *a great God*. The gospel lifts *the mundane* into the meaningful.

V. Slide13a 3. RECEIVE JUSTLY (8,9)

- A. Knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will **receive back** from the Lord, whether he is a <u>bondservant</u> or is <u>free</u>. 9 **Masters**, do the same to them, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him. [Lead w/fairness]
- B. God is the ultimate rewarder no good deed goes unseen.
- C. Earthly masters are reminded: you also have *a heavenly Master* who shows no partiality.
- D. The gospel equalizes the workplace no favoritism, no threats, no pride.
 - 1. Abraham Lincoln once said, "Nearly all men can stand adversity, but if you want to test a man's character, give him power." [the gospel teaches us to use power to serve, not to rule].
 - 2. If you're a Leader: lead as a servant. If you're a Worker: serve as a leader.
 - a) Whether you're at the **top** or **bottom** of **the org chart**, *you're under Christ's authority*. Whether you work with your **hands** or your **head**, *you're building something eternal*.
- E. "The gospel doesn't <u>erase</u> authority; it **sanctifies** it." John Stott
 - Now, imagine an Ephesian house-church slaves and masters sitting side by side, reading this letter aloud. Paul levels the ground by saying, "You both have the same Master."
 - a) Slide13b The gospel dismantled hierarchy not by *revolt*, but by *relationship*.
