"LESSONS AT THE DINNER TABLE" | LUKE 22:24-38 | PASTOR BRIAN BELL

WARM-UP QUESTION:

What are interesting rules or traditions people have for dinnertime?

"Lesson On Leadership and True Greatness" (Luke 22: 24-30)

The disciples argue over who is the greatest and Jesus tells them that to be great in God's eyes means to serve others. What are ways our culture today makes it hard to be great like Jesus defines it? How can people choose to be great like Jesus defines it?

"Lesson on Failure and Hope" (Luke 22: 31-34)

Jesus warns Peter the devil will be testing him and tells him He has prayed for him, but Peter proclaims he would die for Jesus. What are reasons God allows people to be tested? Why do people often overestimate their ability to handle tests of faith?

"Lesson on Dangerous Christianity" (Luke 22: 34-38)

Jesus tells the disciples that while before they didn't need provisions or swords, but now they should be more aware because following him is going to get more dangerous. How can followers of Jesus be both aware of danger and be a servant to all?

REFLECTION QUESTION:

Jesus shares lessons to his disciples who don't realize what is about to happen to Him; they are focused on their reputation and overestimate their spiritual strength. When you look at your spirituality and faith, have you been focused on yourself? Are you overestimating your strength to handle spiritual battles? Ask God to give you wisdom and discernment so you can hear his lessons for what you are facing in life right now.

Luke 22:24-38 5-14-23

Lessons at the Dinner Table

I. Slide1 Announce:

A. Slide2-6 Jen: VBS. Fellowship Night. C@R. Fostering. Mother's Day.

II. Slide7 Intro:

- A.Let's start this morning w/a picturing **a trip** that you **have to take**. You were told it's going to be *a dangerous journey*, with <u>landmines</u> you will not see, and <u>pits</u> to fall into. But then you were handed **a map** of where all the <u>pitfalls</u> are, where every <u>landmine</u> has been planted, where all the <u>dangers</u> lie.¹
 - 1. So the question I ask you is, How are you going to treat this map?
 - 2. Will you wad it up and stick it in your pocket? Will you ignore it? Will you look at it, but not pay attention to it? Will you reference it occasionally? Probably not because *your life depends upon it*!
- B. We are all on a journey called *life*. Once you were born, you started this journey. And it is a journey you **must take**. You do not have an option, if you are alive you **have** to take this journey *called life*.
 - 1. In this journey called *life*, there are minefields. There are explosive devices and pitfalls all around us. All designed to destroy your life from completing your journey.
 - 2. But God has given you a map, *His Word*. And His Word is designed to reveal to you, *the pitfalls*, so you can make the journey.
- C. What you do with the map will affect what you do on the journey.
 - 1. Will you wad it up and stick it in your pocket? Will you ignore it is there? Will you look at it but not pay attention to it? Will you read it once a week and take your chances on the other 6 days? Or, you can decide that this map is absolutely essential. Because you want to complete this journey, because you don't wanna be killed by what's on the road undetected.

- D. Well, we are still sitting at the last supper table (down to vs.38).
 - 1. Jesus still has a few *Lessons at the Dinner Table* for the disciples. I remember such great discussions growing up around our dinner table of 9. (explain)
 - 2. Outline: A lesson on Leadership and True Greatness.

 A lesson on Failure and Hope. A lesson on Dangerous Christianity.
- E. Prayer: Weeping last for a night, but joy comes in the morning.

III. Slide8 A LESSON ON LEADERSHIP AND TRUE GREATNESS (24-30) Read

- A. Reversing The Worlds Standards
- B. I guess this was the 1st century way to *call shotgun* so you don't have to ride in the backseat.
- C. Slide9a Why would the disciples be arguing over *who was the greatest* when Jesus had just washed their feet and talked about His suffering and death? www, Outlines of OT
- D. Perhaps the arguing grew out of the order of seating at the table. (Sitting at the big table)
 - 1. Seemed Judas was given *the place of honor* at our Lord's <u>left</u>, and John was at His <u>right</u>. [U shaped table, *triclinium*, 3 couches]
- E. Whatever the reason, their <u>attitude</u> was that of the world, where <u>competition</u> and <u>authority</u> are important to success.
 - 1. In the kingdom of God, greatness is measured by *how many you serve*, not *how many serve you*.
 - 2. Dave Thomas, the founder of Wendy's Hamburgers, wrote: "I got my MBA long before my GED. I even have a photograph of me in my MBA graduation outfit a snappy, knee-length work apron. I guarantee you that I'm the only founder among America's big companies whose picture in the corporate Annual report shows him wielding a mop and a plastic bucket! That wasn't a gag; it was a case of leading by example. At Wendy's, MBA does not mean Master of Business Administration. Slide9b It means Mop Bucket Attitude!"

- F. The disciples wanted the glory but not the shame. The crown but not the cross. To be masters but not servants.
- G. It is ok to go for greatness. Well actually, it is *praiseworthy* when we do so.
 - 1. Didn't Jesus say, among those born of women there has not risen one greater than John the Baptist. Jesus was into Greatness!
 - 2. Going after greatness is commended ... it just needed to be redefined!
 - a) Slide9c The motivation determines its character.
 - b) Jeremiah said to his assistant Baruch (Jer's secretary), do you seek great things for yourself? Seek them not. Jer.45:5

 Jeremiah warns Baruch, not against ambition per-se, but against self-centered ambition. Any ambition that centers on and terminates on oneself ... is wrong ambition. [Paul said, do nothing from selfish ambition. Phil. 2:3]
- H. Slide9d Jesus is the **model** for our ministry, and He was a **servant**.
 - 1. In Jn.13:3 Jesus *received all authority* (12:49), *and did what?* He washed feet. [He stooped lower & lower].
 - 2. You may **push yourself** to the **top**, but when you get there, you'll find yourself *farthest from His presence*.
 - 3. See, when you **serve** others, you'll <u>look</u> strangely like God.²
 - a) Would you like the best *dating advice*, *marriage advice*, *ministry advice*, & *employee advice*? Ask yourself (ready) Who can **stoop lower to serve** the other better?
- I. Slide9e When Jesus showed Himself in His post-resurrection appearances, *you not what He seemed to show the most? His scars!* (not some crown, not new clothes, His scars!)
 - 1. e.g. He showed Himself to the 2 Emmaus disciples: *He was made known to them in the breaking of bread*. (*How?* When <u>hands</u> broke bread?) Lk.24:35
 - 2. He showed Himself to the 10 disciples in upper room: *Behold My hands* and *My feet, that it is I Myself.* Lk.24:39

- 3. He showed Himself to Thomas: Reach your finger here, and look at My hands; and reach your hand here, and put it into My side. Jn.20:27
- J. Scars seem to be the authentic marks of faithful discipleship.
 - 1. Who can challenge one's love when they show you the **print** of the nails and the **mark** of the spear???
 - 2. Paul said, for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus.
 - 3. Do you have any servant marks? Maybe camel knees from praying so much? Or, prune hands from washing the feet of others?
 - a) Let's take some marks with us!
- K. The Lord assured them that the greatest glory was yet to come (29,30).
 - 1. So why settle for the *transient glory* of this world?

IV. Slide 10a A LESSON ON FAILURE AND HOPE (31-34) Read

- A. Watch Jesus now pull back the veil on the unseen realm.
- B. The apostles had experienced some great blessings that evening, but **danger** was very near. Warren Wiersbe, With the Word, pg.684.
 - 1. Be on your guard when you have a rich spiritual experience, for Satan is ready to attack. Especially beware when you are deciding who is the greatest!
 - 2. Simon, Simon, behold, Satan demanded to have you, that he might sift you like wheat. And you told him what?:)
 - 3. Jesus starts with *Simon, Simon ... wait* was Peter bragging the loudest? He was the <u>top</u> of the disciple food chain.
- C. To sift you like wheat to test them. (ie.) To put them through **trials** as He did Job.
 - 1. Wheat is sifted so as to separate the tares & the soil from the wheat.
 - 2. In this process of purification, it is *constantly shaken* in the sifter.
 - 3. Slide10b Did you know sometimes God sifts also? Amos 9:8b,9 I will not utterly destroy the house of Jacob, declares the Lord. But behold, I will

- command, and **shake** the house of Israel among all the nations as one **shakes** with a **sieve**, but no pebble shall fall to the earth.
- 4. Results of the sifting/shaking: Judas was <u>separated</u> from them; Peter was to <u>deny</u> him; and the other disciples were to <u>flee</u>.
- D. Satan already controlled Judas, but he had to ask for permission to sift the disciples.
 - 1. Jesus uses a fan, and sifts to get rid of chaff; but the devil uses a fan and sifts to get rid of wheat!
- E. *Have you considered My servant Job?* That word *considered* reveals the watchful eye of Satan, ever watching the saints. Searching for **the weak link** in the <u>chain</u>, the **weak door** in the <u>fortress</u>, to *break in, rob, and destroy*.
 - Of course he <u>couldn't</u> touch a flea on the back of one of Job's camels, unless God allowed it.
- F. You is plural, after *Simon*, *Simon*. He was addressing **all** of them, Peter being the leader.
- G.Jesus said, but I have prayed for you when the devil comes knocking, let Jesus answer the door. Why are we always trying to talk to the devil or rebuke him? Don't talk to the devil about God. Talk to God about the devil.

H. Slide11a-d Lessons:

- I. [1] Peter was clueless to the attack but Christ knew every detail about Peter's denial
 - 1. There isn't a single detail of <u>your testing</u> that Christ doesn't already know about. Job 31:4 *Does He not see my ways, And count all my steps?*
- J. [2] Peter didn't know he needed help, Jesus knew.
 - 1. Peter's answer showed that he comprehended neither the serious events fast approaching, nor the reality of his own weakness.
- K.[3] **Peter** needed reassurance, when you have returned to me.
- L. [4] **Peter** needed to be re-commissioned, *strengthen your brothers*.
 - 1. The last section, serve others. Now, strengthen others.

M.Cooperate with God's character building process!!!

- 1. God doesn't enjoy seeing <u>your faith</u> come under attack ... but, He does long to see <u>your faith</u> *mature*.
- 2. He longs to see you become *more like Christ*.
- 3. Christ's comparison of Simon's test to a farmer sifting wheat, pointed to the **positive outcome** of <u>the process</u>.
 - a) You can't make bread out of wheat until *the hull* has been parted from the grain. That's why *sifting* has to take place.
- N. Faith should not fail [ek·lay·po]: where we get our word *eclipse*.
 - 1. Your faith won't be eclipsed Peter, because Jesus prayed.
 - a) Eph.6:16 above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one.
 - 2. And his faith didn't fail, Nor his love, his courage is what failed.
 - a) Peter was a courageous man, but he would <u>fail</u> just the same, because of his self-confidence. Had he heeded the Lord's warning, he would have *spared himself* a great deal of sorrow and shame.

V. Slide12 A LESSON ON DANGEROUS CHRISTIANITY (35-38) Read

- A.Last bit of instructions in the upper room (Jn. Ch's 13-17).
- B. This is unique to Luke. He is *prepping them* for His arrest now only moments away.
- C. (35) On their <u>earlier</u> mission, the disciples went w/o provisions, and depended entirely on the hospitality of their hearers. Shepherd's Notes, pg. 82.
 - 1. His promise to them was that they would not lack Psalm 23:1.
 - 2. On their <u>new</u> mission, brought about by Jesus' death, they must be equipped and be prepared to face **hostility** and **persecution**.
- D.(36) Bring your wallet, backpack, & Roman short sword standard equipment out on the road where robbers pose a threat to life itself. (eg. Good Samaritan story)

- a) Carry a sword not for offense, but for defense.
- 2. Not a command to resist, but a picturesque warning of dangerous times ahead. Search the Scriptures; Stibbs; pg.33.
- E. (38) It is enough Enough already! You took Me literally and missed the point.
 - 1. He wasn't inventorying the disciple's arsenal. Had that been the case 2 swords wouldn't have been enough, and He would've said, buy more!
 - 2. So Jesus concludes the conversation, after they *failed to grasp His meaning in the sword metaphor*.
 - 3. And I've gone too long this morning ... it is enough!
