Psalm 50 2-09-22

empty religiosity

I. Slidel Announce:

- A.JM11 workshops on web site.
- B. Prayer: First, tonight will you allow any *empty religion* to be confronted in your life? As a bird of prey circles in on its prey. I wonder in which area of your life is God circling in on? What sin lies at your <u>core</u> that He's trying to get to? Is it time to let God all the way into the center?

II. Slide2 Intro: empty religiosity

- A. The first psalm attributed to **Asaph**, son of Berechiah.
 - 1. He was a <u>leader</u> of the *Levite temple musicians*, in David's time.
 - 2. He was a worship leader and was responsible for the cymbals, and he was in charge of music when *the ark of the cov* was brought into Jer.
 - 3. Psalms 50 and 73-83 are affiliated with him, and his descendants were music leaders in the 1st and 2nd Jerusalem Temple.
- B. This describes a courtroom scene. God is *judge*, *witness*, & *injury*.
 - 1. This is an indictment against 2 kinds of *religious sinners*.

 Insincere worshipers (7-15) and hypocritical worshipers (16-21).
- C. Peter develops out this theme in 1 Pet.4:17 *NLT For the time has come for judgment*, and it must *begin* with *God's household*. And if judgment begins with <u>us</u>, what terrible fate awaits those who have never obeyed God's Good News?
- D. Have you ever watched a movie or a TV show of a court room, where the judge is sitting there on his/her bench, taking in all of the oral arguments, thinking, pondering? Then watching the judges facial expressions, you can tell they start getting irritated, they can't hold back anymore, and they speak.

III. SlideX THE JUDGE BREAKS HIS SILENCE (1-6) Read 1-6

- A. This psalm starts with the revelation of His glory!
- B. El, Elohim, yhwh Taken together, the names emphasize *God's supremacy as Creator of the earth and God of Israel*.
- C. In the book of Amos he went from being a *Fig Picker* to *Big Preacher*.
 - His job was to confront their empty religion, oppression of the poor, & total disregard for God's covenant commands. This pronouncement of judgment made him the Not-So-Famous Amos.
 - 2. That's what Asaph does here also ... but actually *this Psalm* is mostly the Father speaking (starting in vs.5). Hear Him! *Worship Him*.
- D.(6) The heavens declare his righteousness, for God Himself is judge! William Temple said, "For to worship is to quicken the conscience by the holiness of God, to feed the mind with the truth of God, to purge the imagination by the beauty of God, to open the heart to the love of God, to devote the will to the purpose of God."
 - 1. Wait, believers being *judged*? Yes, our <u>sins</u> were judged at <u>Calvary but</u> our <u>works</u> will be judged at *the judgment seat of Christ* (bema).

IV. SlideX INSINCERE WORSHIPERS (7-15) Read 7-15

- A. God hates empty religiosity.
- B. Derek Kidner calls this group, the *nominally orthodox* or *mechanically pious*.
 - 1. His first indictment comes against those who offer sacrifices insincerely. Their worship is just empty routine. *They hope to earn God's blessings*.
- C. (8-13) The OT <u>consistently maintains</u> that God does not delight in sacrifices *when* they are <u>only *outward expressions*</u> of religion.
 - 1. Your sacrifices don't match your life's actions.
 - 2. Wow, you can recite scriptures ... so what! ...if you don't live them out.
- D. God does not **need** the things we give Him.
 - 1. Remember in Acts17 where Paul was walking in the Areopagus of Athens and something caught his attention, so he stopped to talk about it. *I found*

- also an altar with this inscription: 'To the unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. 24 The God who made the world and everything in it, being Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by man, 25 nor is he <u>served</u> by <u>human hands</u>, as though he <u>needed</u> anything, since he himself gives to all mankind **life** and **breath** and **everything**. Acts 17:23-25
- 2. (10-13) Mine It's like me walking in your house, grabbing something on your shelf, and saying, *hey I wanted to give this to you*! ;(
- E. And yet in all good relationships they are built on the 2 legs of **trust** & **need**. In marriage, in church, we need each other (one another vss.).
 - 1. Now it is different with God/human connection. He is all sufficient, thus He doesn't *need* us, but we absolutely **need** Him & must **trust** Him.
 - 2. **Need** not needy. Like Tim Keller says, *if you add 2 vacuums to each other, you only get a bigger stronger vacuum, a giant sucking sound!*).
 - 3. Adam & Eve thru sin broke the perfect *connection* with God. This caused separation from God, from self, from others.
 - a) Can we restore this *connection* through learning more about God, no! Through being moral enough, no! Through ritual? no, through relationship. Through pomp? no, through love. Through feeling entitled? no, through thankfulness. Through memorizing scripture, doing my daily devotions, not cussing, sinning less? no, through relation & connection. [tethered to Christ, and on the wifi of the HS]
- F. A sacrifice of thanksgiving (todah) there is a specific type of *thanksgiving* sacrifice (Lev 7:12), but here it signifies that *God prefers an attitude of* thanksgiving over sacrifice. [an attitude of gratitude]
- G.(14,15) We need to give Him spiritual sacrifices of: *Thanksgiving, obedience, and prayer*.

- 1. When you give online or drop \$ in the boxes in the back, are you giving God something that isn't already His? Who gives you the strength to work? Who protects you to and from work? Who gives you the skills to work?
- 2. God doesn't give us Thanksgiving and then say, Give it back to Me.
 - a) Illust: When Julian was 1st able to sit up, I would roll the ball to him, he rolled it back to me.
- 3. God wants us to give Him what He has not given us. Those sacrifices that originate *in our hearts*. *Thanking* Him, *obeying* Him, *praying* to Him.
 - a) When we bring these sacrifices, we glorify the Lord.
- 4. So often we receive from the Lord without returning thanks and praise.
 - a) **Thank** Him for what He's doing for you. **Obey His** word. Bring your **problems to** Him.
 - b) These are all opportunities He could use to bring glory to Himself.

V. SlideX HYPOCRITICAL WORSHIPERS (16-21) Read 16-21

- A. Here they did not fulfill the covenant/promises they made with God.
 - 1. You profess one thing *and* practice another. Or, as Paul said in Titus, Such people claim they know God, but they deny him by the way they live. 1:16 NLT
- B. They are guilty of theft, adultery, deceit, and slander. (18-20)
- C. (21) They thought that *God's silence* meant *escape from punishment*, but they were wrong.
 - 1. Eccl.8:11*NLT When a crime is not punished quickly, people feel it is safe to do wrong.*

VI. SlideX WRAP UP FOR BOTH GROUPS (22,23)

A. Posers heed the warning of vs.22. Repent or I'll tear you apart!

- 1. Enemies are often compared to lions in the psalms. Like lions, they wait eagerly for a chance to *attack and destroy* their prey.
- 2. Lions were considered one of the mightiest animals.
- 3. Psalm 7:1,2 O Lord my God, in you do I take refuge; save me from all my pursuers and deliver me, 2 lest like a lion they tear my soul apart, rending it in pieces, with none to deliver.
- B. Religious w/o Relationship, accept the admonition.
- C. Remember, God could declare everyone guilty. Instead, He offers a reprieve.
 - 1. "We leave the world with God or with nothing."
- D. What caricature of God would you draw of Him here?
- E. Do you **need** God <u>today</u>? **What** do you need Him <u>for</u>? Sure you agree you need Him for <u>salvation</u> ... but what about for your <u>sanctification</u>? For your <u>every</u> day? For your <u>whole life</u>? To be a <u>whole person</u>?
- F. Heb.13:15,16 nkjv says, Therefore by **Him** let us <u>continually</u> offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name. 16 But do not forget to <u>do good</u> and to <u>share</u>, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased.
 - 1. May we be like human sunflowers always seeking to face the light.
 - 2. Notice the expectation ... that it is to be *continually* practiced. Constant spiritual activity.
 - a) There is nothing occasional about the true-Christian life ... it is continual.
 - 3. The fruit of the lips ought to be the **overflow** of the **full heart**.¹
 - a) The ancients argued that a **thank-offering** was *more acceptable* to God than a **sin-offering**. For when a man offered a sin-offering he was trying to *get* something for himself, while a thank-offering was **the** *unconditional* offering of a grateful heart.
 - 4. A. W. Tozer said, Gratitude is an offering precious in the sight of God, and it's 1 that the poorest of us can make & be not poorer, but richer for

having made it.
