### **WARM-UP QUESTION:**

Would you rather be corrected or confronted by text or by phone call?

### "AFFIRMATION OF CALLING" (1 Cor 1: 1-3)

Paul starts his letter with naming the Corinthians "saints", reminding them they are God's people even though he's about to correct many ungodly behaviors. Why is it good for Christ-followers to be reminded they are saints through Jesus?

### "EXALTATION OF GOD" (1 Cor 1: 4-9)

Paul is thankful for how God is evident in the church despite their flaws: He has saved them for eternity, He has given them spiritual gifts, and in all of it He is faithful. What are ways God has been faithful in our community?

#### "ELEVATION OF HUMAN LEADERS" (1 Cor 1: 10-17)

Paul criticizes the Corinthians for being divided over which leader they followed instead of focusing on the gospel. What tends to distract you from the message of the gospel today? What helps you re-focus on the message of cross of Christ?

### **REFLECTION QUESTION:**

Paul must write a letter to correct many wrong behaviors in the Corinthian church, but God's faithfulness gives him confidence the Corinthians will learn and grow and live out their new identity as believers in many different areas of life. What are strong influences in your life? Are you willing to let God shape how you live? Pray God gives you power to live for Him.

# 1 Corinthians 1:1-17

# Corinthian Christianity: A People In Process

### I. Announce:

- A. Welcome to those Online and in our Additional Seating in the Learning Center.
- B. Slide1 At Risk: Join us for our next *At Risk* TONIGHT from **3:00-5:00pm** in the Agape Room. This month we will be discussing the link between Foster Care and Human Trafficking. This is *such a crucial topic*, so we hope to see you there.
- C. Slide2 Demo Day: Do you own a hard hat? If so, join us on October 27th and 28th from 7am to 4pm. - E. Slide4 Prayer:
- II. Intro: Corinthian Christianity: A People In Process [Akai-EE-a]
  - A. Macedonia and Achaia made up Greece. Corinth was the capital of Achaia.
    - 1. It was the **richest** and **most important city** in Greece. It was also the most corrupt. Corinth was a center for trade.
  - B. Paul *founded* the Corinthian church during his 2nd missionary journey (Acts 18) and *lead the church* there for a year and a half (ad 51,52).
    - 1. When he left, pastor Apollos took over, but there was some *serious problems developing* in the church.
    - 2. He wrote a stern letter that was not successful (1 Cor.5:9) [this is really 2nd Cor]
    - 3. He heard that the church was *divided* (1:11). Then a delegation showed up in Ephesus regarding *specific questions* (3 guys, 16:17).
      - a) 1st Corinth was Paul's response (ad 56).

- C. Slide Book Outline: 1st Paul defines each of the 5 problems; then 2nd he responds w/the the gospel with all 5.
  - 1. Paul helps them to look at *every area of life* (relationships, family, community, work) *through the lens of* the gospel!
  - 2. Divisions sin in the church (ch's.1-4). Sex guy & step mom, temple prostitutes; marriage/single [sexual integrity is one of the ways we respond to Jesus love and grace. your body is being redeemed by Jesus both now, and in the future. So what you do with your body matters] (5-7). Food idolatry (8-10). Public Worship Lord's supper, Sp gifts, Love (11-14). Resurrection (15). Final Greeting special offerings (16).
  - 3. We note a repeated phrase, *Now concerning*, which begins most of the next sections. [ch.7,8,11,12,15,16]
- D. Slide6a How can a church stand in a very pagan society?
  - 1. In 1st Corinthians we have hope & a challenge for *A People in Process*, or ... *A Bride in Rehab!*
  - 2. The Challenge: to reflect *a perfect Savior* in the way we are living, even though we are *imperfect*.
  - 3. The Hope: that one day our struggles will be over and we'll stand *perfected* in the presence of our Savior.
    - a) Slide6b Paul had planted a church in the city, but the city had gotten into the church.1
    - b) Which explains their/our problems: *Don't copy* the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect. Romans 12:2 NLT
- E. Slide7 Maps: Look at Paul's 1st Missionary Journey (Turkey trip).
  - 1. Slide8,9 Paul's **2nd** Missionary Journey (Macedonia call/Europe. Tie in Thes)

- F. Slide10 Note Corinth's: Isthmus (4m wide). Important trade route (explain save 200 mi. of perilous navigation around. 2 options: small vessel lifted onto carts; large vessels unload & reload cargo to go across isthmus). [Tiberius, Nero tried, 1893]
  - 1. It was thus a 2 port town making it the chief commerce center of Greece.
  - 2. In this wealthy city were opportunities for *exotic goods, entertainment, culture, and where sensual pleasures abounded* (Temple of Aphrodite, goddess of *love*, prob why Paul gives here *the greatest ch on Love*).
- G."A bustling hub of world-wide commerce, degraded culture, & idolatrous religion."2
- H. Their Reputation: The Greeks had a verb, Κορινθιάζομαι (Korinthia-zomai), "to play the Corinthian", which was synonymous to be sexually promiscuous.
  - 1. The Red Hot Chili Peppers came out w/a song in 1999, *Californication*. A song about the underbelly of American society (deceit, plasticity, and desperation) under *the gilded face* of the American Dream.

### III. Slide11a AFFIRMATION OF CALLING (1-3) Read.

- 2) Exaltation of God 3) Elevation of Human Leaders ]
- A. Before Paul digs into the different issues, he 1st: Affirms their Calling, Expresses Thanks, Exalts the Faithfulness of God.
- B. Slide11b Called to be saints *called* found in (vs.1,2,9,24,26).
  - 1. They were not living like saints, but they were saints.3
  - 2. Believers, we are saints hagios/holy/pure. One separated from the world & consecrated to God. (Easton Bible Dict) Not just called to be saved, but to be holy
- C. (2) This side of heaven, wherever you go, we live in *a world tainted by sin*. The work of **sanctification** is *an ongoing daily project*.
  - 1. Sanctified the process of a believer becoming more like Christ in thought and action.
- D.(4) I give thanks thanksgiving was a common feature in ancient letters.

1. Despite their immorality, Paul is thankful that they've *come to Christ* and are at least *staying engaged with the Christian community*. This provides the opportunity for God to work **in** them and **through** them.

### IV. Slide12a EXALTATION OF GOD (4-9) Read

- A.(4) Paul was always *brought to prayer* for those he loved.
- B. Slide12b (7) Paul thanks God for *the gifts* God has given the Corinthian believers. They received *all* the spiritual gifts. CM we're not lacking *any* spiritual gift (stir yours up!)
- C. (8) Paul thanks God for *the guarantee* God gave the Corinthian believers.
  - 1. How? Oh just that He'll sustain you to the end referring to their/our eternal security:)
- D.(9) Paul exalts the faithfulness of God. God is faithful.
  - 1. NLTHe has invited you into partnership with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.
  - 2. We were called into the *Fellowship* of His Son *Koinonia*, having everything in common w/Jesus. We're in partnership w/Jesus. [actually, a trinitarian-experience]
    - a) **Your** interests are His your mind & its thoughts, your body & its purity, your spirit & its graciousness.
    - b) His interests are yours His glory, the wonder of His person, the majesty & greatness of His Power.
- E. Slide12c \*Alan Redpath said, "All He has is at your disposal now. And His desire is that all you have should be at <u>His</u> disposal now ... and always."

## V. Slide13a ELEVATION OF HUMAN LEADERS (10-17) Read

- A. Paul addresses 2 of the numerous Problems confronting the Corinthian church in the rest of the chapter, we'll just take 1 of them this morning. They were **elevating human Leaders** (10-17). [next week] They were **elevating human Wisdom** (18-31)
- B. The Corinthian letter exposes the tragedy of *low-level Christian living!* (Redpath)
- C. Slide13b (10) Msg I'll put it as urgently as I can: You **must** get along with each other. You **must** learn to be considerate of one another, cultivating a life in common.

- D.(10) United they should be unified in their **purpose** and **behavior**, but the opposite is happening.
- E. (11) Quarreling among you likely based on *personalities* rather than theological disputes.
- F. So 4 Fan-Clubs started up: the Paul-Party, the Apollos-Party, the Cephas-Party, and the Christ-Party.
  - 1. Well which man was most important in the church? Paul was the founder. Pastor Apollos is incredibly intelligent. Cephas is the #1 apostle. Or Christ?
  - 2. Paul is asking ... are you following the man or the message?
- G. There always emerges **a group** who swings *too far* the other way in their self-righteousness, of listening to *NO human leadership*.
  - 1. Because of these **3 groups** paying *excessive attention* to an individual leader, it automatically produces a **4th group** who *rights their wrongs* with a strong dose of anti-authoritarianism built into them: *'Who needs leaders anyway? Christ is our leader. He is the head of the body. We depend on him alone and we go straight to him. He tells us what to do and, when we wait on him, he lets us know his will.'4*
- H.(13) Is Christ divided Paul's rhetorical question challenges the Corinthians regarding the *divisions* within their congregation.
  - 1. Since Christ is one with His body, the Corinthian church should be united.
  - 2. He also may be critiquing them for ranking Christ among *other church leaders*, when Christ actually serves as **head** over the entire body.
- I. Paul was not minimizing baptism, but rather was putting it into its proper perspective, because the Corinthians were making too much of it.
  - 1. In Calvary it would sound like this: I went to church in the Tent was baptized by pastor Chuck at Pirates Cove while wearing *bell-bottoms*.

- Was Paul crucified for you? (13a). Were you baptized in the name of Paul? (13b) For Christ didn't send me to baptize, but to preach the Gospel.
  - a) Traditional Religion says, I give God a good record and in response to that ... He blesses me.
  - b) Christianity says, God gives me a perfect record in Jesus Christ as a free gift. I'm a sinner, I only receive it when I admit I'm a moral failure, and then He gives me this acceptance. And now, I live for Him out of gratitude.
- J. Slide13c (17) Msg God <u>didn't</u> send me out to collect **a following for myself**, but to preach the Message of what he has done, collecting **a following for him**. And he <u>didn't</u> send me to do it with a lot of fancy rhetoric of my own, <u>lest the powerful</u> **action** at the center Christ on the Cross be trivialized into mere words.
- K. Paul's primary charge was to preach the gospel, not with words of eloquent wisdom.
  - 1. Brilliantly persuasive eloquence may win a person's mind but not his heart. Whereas the unadorned words of the gospel, though seemingly foolish by human standards, are made effective by the Spirit of God.
  - 2. We, like Paul, are <u>under orders</u> to preach the gospel, and so to preach it that <u>in no way</u> do we *detract* from the cross of Christ.
  - 3. So, what do we do? Well we make much of our Creator, the Architect, the Designer, Our Savior. We follow the way of the Jesus. Because He is the way of eternal life, the way of Love, the way of forgiveness, and the way of care & kindness. [we give Him preeminence!]
