Psalm 65 4-27-22

A Hallelujah Harvest

A. Song: Great Things.

II. PRAISE (1) Read vs.1

- A. David was a great soldier, but also a great musician, a great singer, & great saint. Whatever your occupation (or desired occupation) become a great singer and great saint.
 - 1. In spite of *difficulties* and *problems and* even *dangers*, we have come to Praise the Lord tonight!
- B. This is a Harvest Psalm, a Hallelujah Harvest song. It's for believers who want to thank God for His *goodness* and *care* during another year.
 - 1. Hear the sounds of **Springtime**, feel the spray of **Rain**, enjoy all the **flowers** busting forth.
 - a) Whether you are up on the temple mount (1-4), or in His vast dominion (5-8), or among the hills & valleys (9-13).
- C. Praise is due to You, O God in Zion ... Praise is due to You, O God in Murrieta.
 - 1. (lit.) Praise waits silently for you. Or (LXX) Praise is fitting for you.
 - 2. Praise God for all He is, and *has done* (place your thoughts there this evening, as we worship Him in this next song)

 In His beautiful name. His Wonderful name. His Powerful name.
- D. Song: What A Beautiful Name.

III. PRAYER and PURGE (2,3) Read vs.2,3

- A.PRAYER (2) O You who hear prayer
 - 1. *Praise* & *Prayer* belong together. The more we *pray*, the more answers we have to *praise* the Lord for.
 - 2. Tonight, right now, He hears you. Believe it.
 - 3. But sometimes, we can't pray because sin is in the way.

- 4. See, The <u>more</u> we praise the Lord, the <u>more</u> we see how **needy** & **dirty** we are, & so we come for purging, confessing our sins to God. Warren Wiersbe
- B. PURGE (3) When *iniquities* prevail against me, You atone for our *transgressions*.
 - 1. Atonement the means of *reconciliation* between God and people.
 - a) It's the *process* by which **2 parties** (typically estranged) are made *at-one* with each other. *At-one-ment*
 - b) It emerges in the OT as *part of the sacrificial system*. Then reframed exclusively around *the person and work* of Jesus Christ in the NT.
 - 2. The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, & abounding in steadfast love & faithfulness, keeping steadfast love for thousands, forgiving <u>iniquity</u> and <u>transgression</u> and <u>sin</u>. Ex.34:6,7
 - a) forgiving (to lift or carry) <u>iniquity</u> and <u>transgression</u> and <u>sin</u> (or *wickedness*, *rebellion & sin*; 3 categories of unrighteousness).
 - 3. Transgression (rebellion) is the most defiant of sins. John Mackay defines it as a "willful violation of the terms of the covenant, involving not merely disobeying a rule or regulation, but betraying the **relationship** one has with the covenant King."
 - 4. The point? God is willing to forgive any and all kinds of sin.
- C. Communion: At this time you are invited to the table to *pick up the elements*, return to your seat and partake when you are ready.
- D. Song: Run To The Father

IV. PRESENCE and POWERFUL (4-8) Read vs.4 only

- A. PRESENCE: Choose to approach God. (4)
- B. Now that we've taken care of our sins, blessed is the one You choose and bring near, to dwell in your courts.
- C. This is what God desires for all of us. *To approach* Him, to dwell with Him, to be satisfied with Him. How do we do this? By praise, prayer, and purging of sins.

- 1. Then we will draw near to Him, as He draws near to us.
- 2. Our God is easily approached. We run into some men and women who are *not* approachable. But Jesus, *showing us the heart of His father*, was the most approachable of men. Mothers were comfortable to bring their little ones to him. *Prostitutes, adulterers, tax collectors and thieves* were comfortable around Him.
- D. *Read vs. 5-8* POWERFUL: You answer us. You are the Hope of all the earth. You are strong. You are powerful. (5-8)
- E. (8b) You make the going out of the morning and the evening to shout for joy.
 - 1. Msg **Dawn** and **dusk** take turns calling, "Come and Worship."
- F. 2 Songs: Nothing Else. Gratitude.

V. PROVISIONS (9-11) Read vs.9-11

- A.PROVISIONS: Rain down from You. Your Goodness/bounty. Your Abundance.
- B. (9a) You **visit** the earth God is <u>always</u> **present** and **active**, nevertheless He has decisive times of drawing near either *to bless* or *to judge*.
 - 1. You visit the earth and water it reminder for you and I to pray through our winters for rain (just heard, starting June water once a week?).
- C. (11) You cover the earth with Your **bounty** reminds me of table grace growing up. "Bless us oh Lord & these thy gifts, which we are about to receive, of **Thy bounty** through Christ our Lord." [something given in generous amounts; generosity, liberality]
- D.(11b) Your wagon tracks overflow w/abundance Picture of *a farm wagon* going down the road, piled high with vegetables, right up to the edge, and even dropping some of its contents on the wagon tracks.¹
 - 1. Has your God been *bountiful* in <u>your</u> life? like with: plenty of air to breathe, keeping your heart beating, mind thinking, ears listening, eyes seeing, friends encouraging, basic needs supplied. [then can we worship

Him as a Good Good Father?]

- A. The creation, the pastures, hills, meadows, & valleys, join in shouting and singing for joy.
 - 1. It's April Showers bringing forth May Flowers (England, 1500s poet Thomas Tusser)
 - a) (or *March* showers bringing *April* Flowers here in the States)
- B. Song: Reason I Sing.
- C. *Baptism Classes: kids & parents. (courtyard rm 111)
- D. Keywords: gifts, goodness, hope, Joy, sin, thankfulness, worship.
