DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are designed to help you talk about God's word and Pastor Brian's message with friends and family. You of course can use your own questions, but we'd like to give you this tool to encourage Biblical fellowship and discipleship in your circle of relationships. **Enjoy discovering more about Him!**

"MURDER IN THE VINEYARD" | MARK 12:1-12 | PASTOR BRIAN BELL

WARM-UP QUESTION:

What is story or movie that involves a murder mystery that comes to mind?

"The Kindness of God and the Patience of God" Mark 12: 1-5

Jesus shares a parable of an owner who builds a vineyard and provides for it to flourish and leaves it to tenants. These tenants beat and kill servants of this owner, yet he keeps giving them second chances. What does God's provision and patience show about His heart? What are ways God gives second chances to people today?

"The Love of God" Mark 12: 6-8

The owner's son is described as beloved and yet he is sent, knowing how dangerous the tenants are. The tenants kill the son. **How** is the owner sending his son show love to the tenants?

"The Severity of God" Mark 12:9

The owner will destroy the tenants and gives the vineyard to others for the murder of his son. What does delayed judgment show about God? How has God shown you patience and mercy?

"The Triumph of God and the Grace of God" Mark 12: 10-12

Jesus then shows how this parable connects to a prophecy about a stone that is rejected becoming the cornerstone, warning of rejecting Him because He died for His enemies. Have you rejected Jesus as your foundation or are you building your life on Him?

REFLECTION QUESTION:

Pastor Brian summarizes this passage by sharing "The gospel is the story of a Father who kept reaching out, a Son who was rejected and killed, and a God who turned that rejection into the foundation of our redemption". Have you been living as grateful tenant or an entitled owner? What keeps you from receiving God's grace? Thank God for His kindness, patience, love and praise Him for His Triumph and Grace this week.

Mark 12:1-12

Murder in the Vineyard

I. Announce:

II. Slide12 Intro: Murder in the Vineyard

- A. Fruit was the issue last chapter also. (i.e. Fig Tree & Temple cleansing) Continues Theme.
- B. 6 points that form *a nice arc* in this parable from God's Kindness to God's Grace.
 - 1. It's a story of God's relentless love, human rebellion, and the triumph of grace *through* the rejected Son.
- C. Parables: Lk (27) Mt (21) Mark (only 8) [usually conceal truth-they understood this 1 plainly]
- D. When it came to **sinners** Jesus was so *gentle* in talking with them. But ... When it came to the **religious leaders**, He pulls no punches. Because their *bad moralistic theology corrupted* not only themselves, but *all* of their followers.
 - So before they leave the temple mount, Jesus gives *this group* from 11:27 (*chief priest, scribes, elders*—the Sanhedrin interrogators). A quick review of Israel's history & A *warning* of the **consequences** of their **hostile intentions**.
- E. Slide13 *Read* 12:1-12.

III. Slide14 [1] THE KINDNESS OF GOD (1)

- A.God is the landowner who lovingly prepares everything for life and fruitfulness.
 - 1. *Read* Isaiah 5 where Jesus *lifted it from*. He gives every advantage to His people.
 - 2. God is not stingy. He sets us up to thrive. [here He uses it for Israel's rel leaders]
- B. Application: Look at all God has given you—His provision reveals His heart.

IV. Slide15 [2] THE PATIENCE OF GOD (2-5)

- A. Despite repeated rebellion, God keeps reaching out. God doesn't give up easily on His people.
 - 1. Each servant represents a prophet who were *mistreated, ignored, or killed*.
- B. The owner usually received/demanded 1/3 to 1/2 the produce. It was also not uncommon for **rent collectors** to *be treated badly*.
 - 1. Time and again God had sent prophets to Israel to gather fruits of repentance and righteousness but His prophets were *abused, wounded, and killed*.
 - Jer.7:25,26 nlt From the day your ancestors left Egypt until now, I have continued to send my servants, the prophets - day in and day out. But my people have not listened to me or even tried to hear. They have been stubborn and sinful - <u>even worse</u> than their ancestors.
- C. So here we have the *sad rejection* of God's messengers before the *sad rejection* of God's Son and still today the *sad rejection* of Christians living in, or missionaries called to, hard access countries. (some verbal, some w/beatings, some in prison, some death). [as Raul Boza shared yesterday re: the Persecuted church]
 - Look closely at one more way Jesus shows His patient love ... *It could be viewed as a lack of love for His children, OR It could be viewed as such a radical love for the lost.
 - 2. Unheard of for **the owner** to have been **so patient**. But God wouldn't turn His back on the world; He continued sending servant after servant. (What persistent love!)
- D. Application: How many times has God come **knocking** in your life? What does **His patience** tell you about **His heart** toward sinners? How is God patient w/you **presently**?

V. Slide16a [3] THE LOVE OF GOD (6-8)

- A. The phrase *beloved son* echoes Jesus' baptism and transfiguration (Mark 1:11; 9:7).
 - 1. God doesn't send His Son out of **obligation**, but out of **love**.
- B. Jesus stands in succession to the great prophets of old, BUT is distinct from them.

- Slide16b (Spurg) If you reject Him, He answers you with tears. If you wound Him He bleeds out cleansing. If you kill Him, He dies to redeem. If you bury Him, He rises again to bring res. Jesus is love made manifest.
- 2. Jesus enters the vineyard knowing **He will** be <u>rejected</u> (in only 3 days).
- C. Jesus was God's ultimatum; nothing remains when Christ is refused.
 - 1. Slide16c God the greatest Giver so loved the greatest motive the world the greatest need - that He gave the greatest act - His only Son the greatest gift - that whosoever the greatest invitation - believes in Him the greatest opportunity - should not perish the greatest deliverance - but have eternal life the greatest joy.
- D. Application: The cross wasn't an accident ... it was *love in motion*. Have you truly received the love of the Son?

VI.Slide17a [4] THE SEVERITY OF GOD (9)

A.Rejection has consequences. God's judgment is real—but it's never rash. It comes after **long-suffering mercy**.

1. Jesus is warning the religious leaders—and all who reject the Son.

- B. The leaders actually answered the question themselves *condemning themselves*.
 - 1. It's in Mt.21:41 <u>They</u> said to Him, He will destroy those wicked men miserably, and lease his vineyard to other vinedressers who will render to him the fruits in their seasons. Here in Marks account He repeated their solemn verdict. [fulfilled only a few decades later].
- C. Slide17b Application: Don't confuse God's **patience** with *permission*. Judgment delayed is still judgment coming.

VII.Slide18 [5] THE TRIUMPH OF GOD (10,11)

- A. Though rejected, Jesus becomes the very foundation of salvation.
 - 1. God turns the world's worst evil into His greatest good.
 - 2. You can't stop God's plan—you can only receive it or resist it.

- B. Jesus now changed the metaphor from **vineyard** to *building*. The picture is of builders who **threw aside** a particular stone as they built, which turns out to be **vital** to the whole building.
 - 1. Ever set aside **a puzzle piece** that seemed *useless* to you in the beginning, but then when you found it, it completed the puzzle?
- C. Application: The gospel is not about <u>avoiding</u> God's judgment, it's about <u>standing</u> <u>on</u> the Cornerstone, Jesus. Is He <u>your</u> foundation?

VIII.Slide19a [6] THE GRACE OF GOD (12)

- A. They knew Is.5. They heard this prophecy that He knew they were going to kill him.
- B. Even after this direct confrontation, Jesus *doesn't* destroy them! He keeps walking the road to the cross.
 - 1. **The grace of God** is that the *rejected* Son dies for <u>the very ones</u> who *rejected* Him. That still can include *these religious leaders* & includes us.
- C. Wow, what love and patience oh and kindness, and triumph, and grace ... and severity as the *only other* option.
 - 1. Slide19b The gospel is the story of a Father who kept reaching out, a Son who was rejected and killed, and a God who turned that rejection into the <u>foundation</u> of our redemption.
- D. Application: There's still grace for those who've *rejected* Jesus. The story isn't over. Grace is still available—receive it today.
