

Discipleship Pastor's Report for the year 2022

This year has felt like the first in three years where we are able to build towards something without the legs of any endeavour getting the legs kicked out from it. Our leadership has been excited to see renewal in every area of our church and our efforts in discipleship have followed that heart. A number of new initiatives have started and others refined as we seek to see our church and its members grow more fully into the image of Jesus.

Our online efforts have continued to grow. Our weekly teachings are still engaged by people from home as a way to connect with our church while they are not able to come in person for a variety of reasons. Our podcast viewership/listening audience has continued to grow as well. By our best estimates, the podcast has outgrown our weekly church attendance and has a connection to many outside of our church itself. This expression of conversation seems to engage our time in ways that traditional expressions of church have not. We were even featured in Faith Today magazine amongst two other churches in Canada who are utilizing the medium of podcasts.

We have had a few different iterations of long form teaching nights, all at varying degrees of engagement. We had two Doughnuts and Discussion nights with people in conversation about the purpose of the church. We also hosted a night examining What Is the Bible. I learned a couple lessons on how to host such evenings for future reference and look forward to what opportunities for deeper teaching 2023 will continue to bring.

Youth has continued to see a consistent community of teens after 2 years of ups and downs due to changing rules and regulations. We have a group of incredible and dedicated leaders who care so well for our students. Our youth would not be able to be disciplined in this way without the love the leaders share.

Book club has completed its second year in our church and examined books from all sorts of topics and authors. We were able to host conversations on subjects such as Parenting, LGBTQ hurt in the church, prayer, Biblical Womanhood and more through this group.

I am so thankful for this church and the consistent willingness to abandon comfort or habit when necessary for the pursuit of imaging Jesus as we become love. I look forward to what Jesus wants to continue in the life of this church. Living Springs continues to give me hope for the "C"hurch's renewal in Canada.

Associate Discipleship Pastor's Report for the year 2022

This is my first Pastor's Report! My role at the church encompasses Kids' Ministry, Women's Ministry, Community Events to help connect the people of Livings Springs, and Outreach to go beyond our church to reach the community of Airdrie.

First of all let me say how much I love the staff at the church. Wednesdays are one of my favorite days because we all gather for staff meeting. I love these people. They make ministry a joy and I am very thankful for Doug, Kyle, Blake, Laura, Donna, and Kielan.

Kids' Ministry is only as successful as it is because of the volunteers who make it happen each week. We have 50-60 kids each Sunday and it takes a minimum of 19 volunteers each week to make it work. The Kids' Ministry team is incredible! I cannot say enough good things about them. Their commitment to this ministry and to the children of this church is unmatched. Thank you to everyone who preps crafts and lessons and name tags, and to all the volunteers in the nursery, preschool, K-3, and Grade 4 and 5 classes. You are the ones who make the kids feel loved. You are the reason they want to come back.

The Women's Ministry Team is an amazing group of creative, loving, praying women who work together to provide the opportunity for women to connect with each other and to God with many events this year. We were able to have three Brunches, a Games Night, co-host a Retreat at BP Church in Calgary, have our annual Mini Golf and Dairy Queen night, a Bonfire, partner with Purses of Hope to provide twenty-nine packed purses for homeless women in Calgary, and facilitate two Bible Studies. A special thank you to Candice Thain who runs Mom's Time Out each week as well. The WM team and Bible Study leaders do a great job at loving and encouraging the ladies of Living Springs.

Part of my job is providing opportunities for our church family to connect to each other. This year we had a Skating Party in July, some after church Barbeques, a Christmas Party, and Newcomer Nights. It's a beautiful sight to see our church family visiting, laughing and making connections with each other. A special thank you to everyone who made baking and helped with decorating the church for Christmas. The church looked (and tasted!) amazing!

We love to also go beyond the people in the church and help the families in our community, whether that is providing necessities or opportunities for families to have some laughter and fun together. This year we had a Parking Lot Bingo night with 80 people signed up in the summer. Our annual Halloween Scavenger Hunt had over 200 registrants which meant all hands on deck for packing the bags of candy for all the kids. Thank you to everyone who donated treats for the bags, and for all the hands who helped package and hand them out. In December we were also able to provide all the ingredients for an awesome breakfast and dinner for twenty one families with our Christmas Hampers, and at the last minute we were able to go on a shopping spree to give every child Christmas gifts as well. We could not have done this without the help of the Living Springs family, so thank you for everyone who donated to this ministry that brings hope and joy to families that are struggling.

I am looking forward to another year partnering with everyone who volunteers their time, effort, and skills as they pour out their hearts for the people who call Living Springs home and those beyond our door.
