- 1. What is Jesus' perspective on the betrayal that is about to happen to Him (v.31-32)?
- 2. What is interesting about Peter's declarations in verses 33-35?
- 3. What is the purpose of Jesus' call for the three disciples to stay awake ("stay here and keep watch with me") in verse 38?
- 4. Jesus is wrestling with impending death on the cross as well as the disappointment and betrayal of His disciples. What do you imagine to be Jesus' emotional state? How would you describe Jesus during these scenes?
- 5. Describe a time in which you either faced the betrayal of people close to you or wrestled with God. How did it impact the state of your mind and soul?
- 6. Faced with Judas and a small army, one of the disciples pulls a sword to stop the betrayal (v.51). As you consider experiences of betrayal in your life story, how have you dealt with betrayal? How have those decisions shaped who you are today?
