Colossians 1:15-29

1. Kevin opened his sermon by explaining how, in our world, “there’s a pervasiveness in our culture that something seems wrong.” In what ways have you noticed/experienced this?
2. In the theme of alienation, it drives us to seek a solution. Where do you look for answers/wisdom?
3. The preeminence (greatness; supreme authority) of Jesus Christ was the subject of our passage. What difference does his sovereign reign mean to you?
4. Because Christ died for us on the cross, we’ve been brought back or reconciled to God. How does this change the way you think/live/act? And are you living in alignment with that?
5. The passage mentions how we used to have “evil behavior” (Colossians 1:21b). How have you seen changes in the way you act since following Christ?

6. Kevin provided insight into our own “mental maps,” ideas, and intentions for our lives. This could lead us to the “illusion of control,” which was also preached. What would it look like for you to yield your life under Christ’s control?

7. Lastly, the allegory of the Christian life and quote from Eugene Peterson was referenced; “A long obedience in the same direction.” Where do you find yourself on this journey, and how can this group be praying for you?
