- 1. Can you think of some examples of the principle: The smallest things make the biggest difference?
- 2. Read vv. 31-33. Describe the scene Jesus portrays. Why does he use the metaphor of sheep and goats?
- 3. What strikes you about the King's words to the sheep (vv. 34-36) and the goats (vv. 41-43)? What do each of these six acts have in common?
- 4. What strikes you about the response of the sheep (vv. 37-39) and the goats (vv. 44-45)? Why do you think they were both unaware of what they did or didn't do?
- 5. Look carefully at v. 40. Who are the "least of these brothers and sisters of mine"? What does this tell is about our relationship with other believers? What about our relationship with non-believers?
- 6. What are the respective eternal destinies of the sheep and the goats? (see. 34, 41, 46).
- 7. Discuss the conversation Mark shared between him and the King at the judgement. Can you imagine and share a similar scene between you and the King?
- 8. How did God speak to you through this text and message?
