I Am The Door

Family Check-up:

What is God teaching you in your quiet time?

Who have you had the privilege of reaching out to this week?

Intro: Who can be saved? Is there anyone who cannot enter into the God's kingdom? Jesus declares himself to be the door and says that all are welcomed who is willing to believe. Jesus is the door into an entirely new and transformed life. This is why Jesus claims that he came to give us life and to give it to the fullest.

Read: Read John 10:7-10

- 1. What did Jesus mean when he called himself the door?
- 2. Jesus calls himself the Good Shepherd. How does this practically impact your life both now and in the future?
- 3. Sheep are unable to live without a shepherd. What has happened in your life when you tried to live your life without a shepherd? How can you get back on track to trusting Jesus as your shepherd?
- 4. Read Genesis 4:1-6. This is one of the first times we read about a door and on the other side is sin crouching to devour Cain. Jesus is a fundamentally different door. What reversal is Jesus playing out by calling himself the door?
- 5. If Jesus is the door, how can you lead people to walk through that door? Who can you pray for today who needs to walk through that door?

Pray: Pray that you would find contentment in being in the flock of Jesus. Take time as a group to pray for the people in your oikos who need Jesus still. Pray for the people who God has placed around you who need him and pray that he would go before you that you could help lead them to that door.
