This Sunday in our series *Revelation: Strength for Today, Hope for Tomorrow* we once again look at the final five verses of chapter 20 and the first four verse of chapter 21 as Pastor John considers *The Final Exam and Eternity*. This is also the Sunday we honor the 2023 graduates. Then on Sunday evening we end the Lord's Day with Pastor Ben looking at Luke 14.12-24 from our series *Luke: Being Certain About the Story*.

Then we will respond to God's word with a hymn from 1787, *On Jordan's Stormy Banks*, that's also been put to a new tune, this one from the 21st century. The words of all these hymns are so rich! Drink deeply from them as you prepare for worship.

- A final judgment scene: Jesus is on the throne
 - o Throne: a dominant idea in Revelation
 - o Compare it with Daniel 7.9-10; Matthew 25.31-46; Psalm 7.6-8; 47.8-9
 - o Sky flees, cf. 6.14
- Injustice never escapes God's eye
 - o All evil will be eliminated
 - o Frees us from seeking revenge
- We will be held accountable
 - o Our sins
 - Our fruit produced by the Holy Spirit
- Book of life is the determining factor, meaning it is all about grace
- Lake of Fire...

Eternity, 21.1-4

- 21.1-8 introduces what new realities 21.9-22.5 will elaborate on
 - 21.9-22.5 A visionary description of these new realities
 - 21.1-8 gives the positive reward side in contrast to the judgment in 20.11-15
- This world is not all there is
 - God has put eternity our hearts, Ecclesiastes 3.11
 - God destines us for an end beyond the grasp of reason. Thomas Aquinas, (c. 1225-1274)
 - A. W. Tozer said: "Let no one apologize for the powerful emphasis Christianity lays upon the doctrine of the world to come. Right there lies its immense superiority to everything else within the whole sphere of human thought or experience We do well to think of the long tomorrow."
- A new heaven and a new earth, 21.1-4
 - First is gone!
 - o The sea- a place of chaos- is gone!
- The Holy City
 - The New Jerusalem
 - Came down from heaven
 - Metaphor: described as a bride adorned for her husband
 - Randy Alcorn: "Just like the Garden of Eden, the New Earth will be a place of sensory delight, breathtaking beauty, satisfying relationships, and personal joy."
- First announcement
 - A loud voice from the throne

- o Intended to encourage God's people
- Immanuel Principle
 - Walking in the garden... fiery pillar/cloud... tabernacle... temple... incarnation... Holy Spirit... Now God is truly with us
 - God's dwelling place with us
 - O We will be his people, he will be our God
- What's up with this new situation?
 - No more tears
 - No more death
 - o No more pain
 - o Former things are gone
- Spectacular: a future far more glorious and wonderful than we can imagine: That's why he describes what is not there.

- What John shows us here gives us great strength to live today and great hope for what is to come.
