## This Sunday at CMPC...

This Sunday we come to Revelation 20 in our study of *Revelation: Strength for Today, Hope for Tomorrow*, as Pastor John looks at *The Final Battle*. Revelation 20, especially verses 1-3, is probably the section of Revelation that has received the most study, debate, and diverse opinions of over the last 100 years. But it is also an incredibly encouraging chapter- and we will see why Sunday morning. Then Sunday evening we close out the Lord's Day as the *Kids of the Kingdom* present *From Acorns to Oaks* in the *Covenant Life Center* at 6:30. The children and Mrs. Bradbury and those who serve with her have worked hard- and are talented! So come at 6:30; there will be a finger food reception following the musical. (If you are able to help provide a finger food, it is greatly appreciated!).

Sunday's hymns reflect the battle and victory that we see in Revelation 20. We will gather with the late 20<sup>th</sup> century hymn *Majesty*, Jack Hayford's hymn reflecting on the glory and triumph of Christ. Our hymn of praise will be Martin Luther's 16<sup>th</sup> century classic *A Mighty Fortress is Our God*- reflecting on Satan's defeat by Christ. Our hymn of testimony is *O Church, Arise*, a 21<sup>st</sup> century hymn exhorting the church to continue to pursue victory through Christ. We will then respond to God's word with the 19<sup>th</sup> century classic, *The Church's One Foundation*, a triumphal hymn for the people of God.

Also this weekend: on Saturday, a *Cook-a-Thon* for the *Family Promise* ministry from 9-12- this ministry provides meal for foster families in our area. ## **Preliminary Comments**

- A much discussed/disputed text
  - A text that raises a lot of questions
  - Sincere bible-believing people hold differing views.
- 3 views
  - o A key text for the premillennial perspective; the only place a thousand year reign is mentioned
  - The post-millennial view has things getting better and better as the kingdom of God being ushered in- and this is the last thousand years of Christ's reign BEFORE eternity.
  - o For those who are of the amillennial perspective requires symbolism
    - We've understood the "numbers" to be symbolic
    - Emphasized symbolism- John showing us pictures
      - In this passage itself, dragon is used as a symbol for Satan
      - A chain is mentioned: Satan is a spirit
- Structure of Revelation
  - Premillennialists read Revelation 4-21 as taking place in chronological order (linear)
    - So they see the second coming described in 19.11-21, and so see chapter 20 as sequential to that
  - o Amillennialists see Revelation as seven series of cycles/descriptions of the same event.
    - See ch. 20 as the last of the 7 cycles of judgment
    - The final battle of 20.7-10 seems the same as 16.14-16; 17.14; 19.11-21, THE war; also Ezekiel 38-39

## What Revelation 20 teaches that we all can agree on:

- God is triumphant yesterday, today and forever
- Satan is sentenced to hell where he joins his compatriots the Beast and the False Prophet to be punished forever and ever
- God's people are blessed, resurrected and secure forever and ever

## Some obvious questions.... Or, What for many is problematic...

- IF we follow the amillennial view, in what sense is Satan bound today?
- IF we follow the premillennial view and Jesus has a thousand-year reign on earth, where do all the bad guys at the end suddenly come from? If all of Christ's enemies are destroyed in 19.11-21, who is left to be deceived in 20.3?
- IF we follow the postmillennial view, how does the great battle at the end of the age fit in?

#### Satan Captured! ... 1-3

- Context: Babylon as the City of Man is judged
  - The Beast has been taken down
  - o The False Prophet has been taken down
  - One last enemy is on the loose: Satan himself- the Dragon.
    - Humanity is not safe as long as he is on the loose!
- An angel has a key to the abyss (bottomless pit is an unfortunate translation because it suggests to us that Satan is out of reach if he is chained there)
  - Note in 20.7 the word prison is used
  - Unable to deceive the nations
    - The Gentiles!
    - Flow of Biblical history: If we wonder why there were so few converts during the Old Testament (Rahab, Ruth, Nineveh), perhaps this is it: Satan kept them blinded, Psalm 107.10; Isaiah 9.2
      - Adam and Eve were deceived by the great deceiver, Satan himself.
        - A king and queen who could have ushered in a state of blessedness for all their descendants.
    - We also understand Satan worked overtime on Israel/Judah to lead them astray and cause them to constantly rebel
      - Hence the exile/struggles after their return
- Is Satan bound symbolically today?
  - Given the symbolism of Revelation, perhaps this is symbolic of restraint on Satan
    - After all, how do you chain a spirit?
    - Meaning is he restrained from wreaking all the havoc he could if he had total freedom
  - o Matthew 12.22-29 (Mark 3.20-29): Jesus came to bind the strong man
    - Word for bound in Matthew 12.9 is the same as the word in Revelation 20.2
  - Jesus saw Satan fall from heaven
    - Revelation 12.7-12: we saw Michael/angels battle Satan at the cross, and throwing him out of heaven and down to earth
    - Luke 10.17-18; John 12.30-32
    - II Thessalonians 2.1-12
- Satan, then is bound through the death and resurrection of Jesus, Colossians 2.15
  - He is still active, I Peter 5.8; he is controlled like in Job
- The gospel has/will advance to all the nations
  - During the church age, he is unable to deceive the elect among the peoples of the world and prevent people from being saved and God's church being built.
- Until God's appointed hour, Satan is unable to deceive the pagan nations into gathering together for a final assault on the church.
  - o Satan then is released to rally the nations of the earth for one last attack on the people of God.

## The Number 1000

- If the binding of Satan does refer to our situation today, obviously this number becomes symbolic
- Ten and three are both ideal numbers, and 1000 and 10 x 10 x 10, hence an ideal period of time
- The finite time between the first and second advents of Christ
- As that time comes to an end, Satan is released "for a little while" for the final attack

## Reigning With Christ, 4-6

- Who? Martyrs and other believers reigning with Christ
  - o Beheading was an attempt to keep a person out of eternity
  - Not unbelievers
- Where?
  - Premillennial see this reign on earth during the thousand years, assuming that 4-6 follows 1-3 sequentially in time
  - With exception of 2.13 for Satan, all the rest of the thrones in Revelation are in heaven
  - Martyrs are right now reigning in heaven with Jesus
    - Cf. Ephesians 2.6-7
- John encourages us: the enemy is contained, and the martyrs are reigning with Christ, even those who are beheaded!
- Is verse 5a parenthetical? Probably so to answer what happens to unbelievers
- What is the first resurrection? The believers raised spiritually to life to reign with Christ
- The second death has no power over those who are part of the first resurrection
- A second death implies there was a first death; hence, we consider the first death our bodily death and the second death the sentence of hell
- The 1<sup>st</sup> resurrection is spiritual, the 2<sup>nd</sup> is the resurrection of the body
- 20.4-6 is essential to answer the question about the martyrs to assure God's people of what happens to those persecuted for their faith

#### The Defeat of Satan, 7-10

- Satan released, cf. 20.3
- Deceive the nations to follow him
- The final battle
- The nations gather and surround God's people
- Once again, no actual battle is described, as in chapter 19.
- Lined up for battle/God wins
- Satan sentenced for all eternity

## The Final Judgment, 11-15

- A final judgment scene
  - o God is on his throne
    - Compare it with Daniel 7.9-10; Matthew 25.31-46; Psalm 7.6-8; 47.8-9
- Injustice never escapes God's eye
  - o All evil will be eliminated
- Premillennialists divide the judgment: Believers before the 1000 year reign, unbelievers after
- Sky flees, cf. 6.14
- Book of life: God knows his sheep, John 10.3, 27
- Lake of Fire...
  - Satan and friends
  - o Death and hades!

## So What About Us?

- No matter your view, we agree on more than we disagree on
- We understand the flow of history better: Genesis 3.15
- Why the gospel did not penetrate the Old Testament world
- Why the gospel did penetrate the New Testament world
  - Why the gospel explodes today!
  - Why Muslims are coming to Christ!
- Strength for today: no matter what happens to us, we will be with Jesus
- Hope for tomorrow: Jesus triumphs and we spend eternity with him
