Main Point: A Faithful Follower of Jesus Lives in Community

We exist to glorify God by helping people become faithful followers of Jesus.

A Faithful Follower of Jesus Lives in Community.

Community: a group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common; a feeling of fellowship with others, as a result of sharing common attitudes, interests, and goals.

Following Jesus isn't a solo adventure. When you receive Jesus as your Savior you also receive adoption into the family of God.

Hebrews 10:19–25 (CSB)

¹⁹Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have boldness to enter the sanctuary through the blood of Jesus—

²⁰he has inaugurated for us a new and living way through the curtain (that is, through his flesh)—

²¹and since we have a great high priest over the house of God,

²²let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed in pure water.

²³Let us hold on to the confession of our hope without wavering, since he who promised is faithful.

²⁴And let us consider one another in order to provoke love and good works,

²⁵not neglecting to gather together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging each other, and all the more as you see the day approaching.

- Not Neglect to Gather Together (v.25)
