Luke 5:1-11 (NKJV)

¹So it was, as the multitude pressed about Him to hear the word of God, that He stood by the Lake of Gennesaret,

- ² and saw two boats standing by the lake; but the fishermen had gone from them and were washing *their* nets. ³ Then He got into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the multitudes from the boat.
- ⁴ When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." ⁵ But Simon answered and said to Him, "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless at Your word I will let down the net."
- ⁶ And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. ⁷ So they signaled to *their* partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. ⁸ When Simon Peter saw *it*, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord!"
- ⁹ For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish which they had taken; ¹⁰ and so also *were* James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid. From now on you will catch men."
- ¹¹ So when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and followed Him.

Acts 11:25-26

25 Then Barnabas departed for Tarsus to seek Saul. 26 And when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for a whole year they assembled with the church and taught a great many people. **And the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch.**

Lois Tverberg - Listening to the Language of the Bible

Jesus lived in a deeply religious culture that highly valued biblical understanding. Rabbis were expected not only to have a vast knowledge about the Hebrew Bible, but to show through their exemplary lives how to live by the Scriptures.

[After being selected to follow a rabbi], a disciple's goal was to gain the rabbi's knowledge and to become like him in character... When the disciple became mature, he would take his rabbi's teaching to the community, add his own understanding, and raise up disciples of his own.

Disciple of Christ should

- learn from Christ
- become like Christ in character.

As mature disciples of Christ, we should

- take Jesus' teachings to the community
- add our own understanding
- raise up disciples of our own.

Luke 5:2-3

¹So it was, as the multitude pressed about Him to hear the word of God, that He stood by the Lake of Gennesaret.

Disciples of Christ should value hearing the word of God inside and outside of the church walls.

Luke 5:2-3

² and Jesus saw two boats standing by the lake; but the fishermen had gone from them and were washing *their* nets. ³ Then He got into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the multitudes from the boat.

Disciples of Christ should desire to hear the word of God more than they desire to see miracles, signs, and wonders.

Luke 5:4-5

⁴ When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." ⁵ But Simon answered and said to Him, "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless at Your word I will let down the net."

Disciples of Christ should be hearers and doers of God's word.

Luke 5:6-10

⁶ And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. ⁷ So they signaled to *their* partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. ⁸ When Simon Peter saw *it*, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord!" ⁹ For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish which they had taken; ¹⁰ and so also *were* James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon.

Disciples of Christ should desire God's spirit more than material things.

Disciples of Christ are qualified by Christ's invitation, not by their own sense of validation.

Luke 5:11

¹¹ So when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and followed Him.

Disciples of Christ must forsake their old ways to follow Jesus.
