> What would you say is the source of her disappointment? What tends to be the source of your disappointment?

Disappointments occur when we encounter an unrealistic, unmet, or unresolved expectation that manifests itself in our relationships or our life circumstances.

Was her disappointment based on unrealistic expectations? Was her disappointment based on unmet expectations? Was her disappointment based on unresolved expectations?

She simply took her disappointment to the right physician.

There is no such thing as a life without disappointments.

After hearing about Jesus, she came up in the crowd behind Him and touched His cloak. Mark 5:27

Our disappointments will either bring about a crisis of belief in Jesus or a myriad of excuses.

For she thought, "If I just touch His garments, I will get well." Mark 5:28

Our disappointments can draw other people to Jesus.

Immediately the flow of her blood was dried up; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction. Mark 5:29

Immediately Jesus, perceiving in Himself that the power proceeding from Him had gone forth, turned around in the crowd and said, "Who touched My garments?" Mark 5:30

And His disciples said to Him, "You see the crowd pressing in on You, and You say, 'Who touched Me?" Mark 5:31

And He looked around to see the woman who had done this. Mark 5:32

Our disappointments can allow our fears to become our silent lunch.

But the woman fearing and trembling, aware of what had happened to her, came and fell down before Him and told Him the whole truth. Mark 5:33

Our disappointments might offer another person a divine appointment.

And He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace and be healed of your affliction." Mark 5:34

While He was still speaking, they came from the house of the synagogue official, saying, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the Teacher anymore?" Mark 5:35
