Luke 22:39-42 (CSB)

³⁹He went out and made his way as usual to the Mount of Olives, and the disciples followed him.

⁴⁰When he reached the place, he told them, "Pray that you may not fall into temptation."

⁴¹Then he withdrew from them about a stone's throw, knelt down, and began to pray, ⁴²"Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me—nevertheless, not my will, but yours, be done."

Luke 6:12 (CSB)

¹²During those days he went out to the mountain to pray and spent all night in prayer to God.

A Christian needs prayer like a person needs air.

Luke 11:1-4 (CSB)

¹He was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, just as John also taught his disciples."

²He said to them, "Whenever you pray, say, Father, your name be honored as holy. Your kingdom come.

³Give us each day our daily bread.

⁴And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves also forgive everyone in debt to us. And do not bring us into temptation."

Matthew 6:5–15 (CSB)

⁵"Whenever you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites, because they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by people. Truly I tell you, they have their reward.

⁶But when you pray, go into your private room, shut your door, and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

⁷When you pray, don't babble like the Gentiles, since they imagine they'll be heard for their many words.

⁸Don't be like them, because your Father knows the things you need before you ask him.

⁹ Therefore, you should pray like this: Our Father in heaven, your name be honored as holy.

¹⁰Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

¹¹Give us today our daily bread.

¹²And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

¹³And do not bring us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.

¹⁴"For if you forgive others their offenses, your heavenly Father will forgive you as well.

¹⁵But if you don't forgive others, your Father will not forgive your offenses.

Prayer is simply talking with God.

One of the great distractions of the enemy is to make the simple things of faith confusing.

⁹"Therefore, you should pray like this: Our Father in heaven, your name be honored as holy.

We don't pray to get more from God, we pray to get more of God.

Jehovah Rapha - The Lord Who Heals

Adonai - The Owner of All
