

Why is it so important to find your personal burden and what is the big deal if you don't?

God reveals His purpose for us as He aligns us with the personal burden He places on us.

Alignment matters because it keeps you from pulling in a direction that is opposed to God's direction.

By allowing the Spirit of God to bring the word of God to life in you.

By allowing Spirit filled people to help you to unlearn some of the things that you have learned.

By taking a spiritual leap of faith.

By sensing compassion for those whose lives are broken.

By developing a sense of dissatisfaction within your relationship with God.

A sense of dissatisfaction can become a catalyst for aligning our burden with God's purpose.

A sense of dissatisfaction can also be the catalyst for aligning our burden with a worldly purpose.

Dissatisfaction will eventually lead an individual to a desire that will eventually lead to a decision that will eventually lead the individual to a determination to either to follow God or the world.

Demas, having loved this present world, has deserted me and gone to Thessalonica. 2 Timothy 4:10

Believing that the impossible is possible.

Finding God's frequency and tuning in to it.

Coming to grips with what if I don't do what God is burdening me to do.

Are you positively or negatively dissatisfied with the purpose God has for you?

Negative dissatisfaction begins the moment we question God's love for us.

Now before the Feast of the Passover, Jesus knowing that His hour had come that He would depart out of this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end. John 13:1

Negative dissatisfaction happens as we listen to the wrong voices.

During supper, the devil having already put into the heart of Judas Iscariot, the son of Simon, to betray Him. John 13:2

Negative dissatisfaction occurs as we fail to see the bigger picture God has for us.

Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come forth from God and was going back to God, got up from supper, and laid aside His garments; and taking a towel, He girded Himself. John 13:3-4

Then He poured water into the basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded. So, He came to Simon Peter. He said to Him, "Lord, do You wash my feet?" John 13:5-6

Jesus answered and said, "What I do you do not realize now, but you will understand hereafter." Peter said to Him, "Never shall You wash my feet!" Jesus answered him, "If I do not wash you, you have no part with Me." John 13:7-8

Simon Peter said to Him, "Lord, then wash not only my feet, but also my hands and my head." Jesus said to him, "He who has bathed needs only to wash his feet, but is completely clean; and you are clean, but not all of you." John 13:9-10

For He knew the one who was betraying Him; for this reason, He said, "Not all of you are clean." John 13:11

Negative dissatisfaction develops a stubborn mindset.

When we forget what God has done for us.

So, when He had washed their feet, and taken His garments and reclined at the table again, He said to them, "Do you know what I have done for you? John 13:12

When we refuse to follow His example.

You call Me Teacher and Lord; and you are right, for I am. If I then, the Lord and the Teacher, washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I gave you an example that you also should do as I did to you. John 13:13-15

When we want things our way.

Truly, truly, I say to you, a slave is not greater than his master; nor is one who is sent greater than the one who sent him. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them. John 13:16-17

When we seek to hide our true colors.

I do not speak of all of you. I know the ones I have chosen; but it is that the Scripture may be fulfilled, 'He who eats My bread has lifted up his heel against Me.' John 13:18

When we refuse to listen when God sends a messenger.

From now on I am telling you before it comes to pass, so that when it does occur, you may believe that I am He. Truly, truly, I say to you, he who receives whomever I send receives Me; and he who receives Me receives Him who sent Me. John 13:19-20
