- [1. God's character is revealed in the metaphor of light & dark] John 1:4-5; 1Th 5:5; Eph 5:8; 1Jn 1:5-6
- [2. God's character is revealed in the concept of holiness] Exod 33:18, 29; 2Cor 3:7-18; 5:21; Heb 10:14;
 - Holy (Hb: "qodesh"): apartness, set-apartness, separateness, sacredness
 - · Holy represents God's person, presence, purity and power
- [3. God calls us to a life of holiness] 2Tim 1:9; Col 1:22; Eph 4:17-19
 - Beware: You're dancing with the devil and two-timing Jesus
 - Even though you have power and authority over the enemy, you can't defeat the demons you enjoy playing with
 - [illustration of a mousetrap: we try to get as close to the cheese as we can, believing the trap will never hurt us.]
- [4. God's grace does not excuse sinfulness; it enables holiness] Rom 6:1-2; Isa 35:8; 2Cor 3:18; Rom 1:3-4; 1Pet 1:2 NIV & NLT; Rom 15:16
- [5. The Spirit stirs up hunger for (and brings about) holiness] Gal 5:16-18; Heb 12:14; Acts 2:1-4; Isa 6:3-8 NIV

[clip from Beauty and the Beast: beast becomes human] Seraphim: fiery ones
