Spirit Instincts



Instinct: An innate pattern of behavior in response to certain stimuli.

JUDE 1:10 NLT

But these people scoff at things they do not understand. Like unthinking animals, they do whatever their instincts tell them, and so they bring about their own destruction.

JUDE 1:18,19 NLT

They told you that in the last times there would be scoffers whose purpose in life is to satisfy their ungodly desires. These people are the ones who are creating divisions among you. They follow their natural instincts because they do not have God's Spirit in them.

Spiritual Instincts gives us situational awareness to read a situation and respond in the best way.

Flesh Instincts (Reactive) vs. Spiritual Instincts (Responsive)

Sin often influences our Flesh Instincts (Reactive)

Spirit influences our Spiritual Instincts (Responsive)

ROMANS 8:5,6

Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. The mind governed by the flesh is death, but the mind governed by the Spirit is life and peace.

ROMANS 8:7

The mind governed by the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so.

ROMANS 1:28

Furthermore, just as they did not think it worthwhile to retain the knowledge of God, so God gave them over to a depraved mind, so that they do what ought not to be done.

GALATIANS 5:19-21 ESV

Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these.

GALATIANS 6:7-9 ESV

- 6. Plant yourself in Worship (Closed Hands to Open Hearts)
- 7. Plant yourself in Hunger (Passive to Passion)
- 8. Plant yourself in Repentance (Grieving to Receiving)

CLOSING THE INSTINCT GAP



Maturity is when responding overrides reacting.

EPHESIANS 4:29-30 MSG

Watch the way you talk. Let nothing foul or dirty come out of your mouth. Say only what helps, each word a gift. Don't grieve God. Don't break his heart. His Holy Spirit, moving and breathing in you, is the most intimate part of your life, making you fit for himself. Don't take such a gift for granted.

He is called Holy for a reason.

Grieve: Denotes a pain or sorrow that can only be experienced between two people who deeply love each other.

He is not merely an influence; He is a person, and may easily be sorrowed. Grieving the Spirit is like hosting Him with a nest of thorns.

"Grieving the Holy Spirit produces a lamentable result. In the child of God it will not lead to his utter destruction, for no heir of heaven can perish; neither will the Holy Spirit be utterly taken away from him, for the Spirit of God is given to abide with us for ever. But the ill-effects are nevertheless most terrible. You will lose, my dear friends, all sense of the Holy Spirit's presence: He will be as one hidden from you—no beams of comfort, no words of peace, no thoughts of love—there will be what Cowper calls, 'an aching void the world can never fill."

Do not quench the Spirit.

Quench: To extinguish or choke out a fire.

1 THESSALONIANS 5:19 ISV

Do not put out the Spirit's fire.

Grieving the Spirit comes through sins of commission.

Quenching the Spirit comes through sins of omission.

Repentance is the kindling on the altar of our souls that keeps the flame of the Spirit from being extinguished.

LEVITICUS 6:12 NASB

The fire on the altar shall be kept burning on it. It shall not go out, but the priest shall burn wood on it every morning.

2 CORINTHIANS 7:10

Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death.

More repentance leads to fewer regrets.

Renewal happens when the sorrow of the Spirit meets the sorrow of my sin.
