• Myth: Untrue story, rumor, imaginary or fictitious object or individual

Acts 8:1-21

- Prescriptive vs Descriptive:
- A passage is *descriptive* if it is simply describing something that happened; a passage is *prescriptive* if it is specifically teaching that something *should* happen.
- Too many people want to leverage their Spirit gift for their own gain rather than the Kingdom's gain

Myth #1: Only Super saints and elite Christians have miraculous spiritual gifts (1 Cor 12:7-11; Rom 12:5-6; 1 Pet 4:10)

Myth #2: God gave you only one gift you will ever experience (1 Tim 4:14; 2 Tim 1:6; 1 Cor 12:1; Rom 1:11)

Myth #3: Because the Holy Spirit gives the gifts, I can't desire others (1 Cor 12:29-31; 14:1, 12-13)

Myth #4: I only need to function in my gifts and not worry about other ones

Myth #5: Miraculous gifts were only to authenticate the apostles or until the Bible was written (Heb 2:3-4; 1 Cor 13:8-12; 1 Jn 3:2)

Myth #6: The only gifts that God will give are the ones specifically mentioned in the Bible (cf. 1 Cor 12; Eph 4; Rom 12)
