- 1. Revival Requires A Revolution (Luke 11:23; Phil 1:20-21 NIV; John 3:30)
 - rev·o·lu·tion: a forcible overthrow of a government or social order, in favor of a new system.
 - · Idol: Anything that we hunger for more than God
- 2. Jesus Is My All and All or My Nothing At All (2 Chr 34:1-4; 2 Kgs 22:10)
- 3. Pride is the Ultimate Idol
 - a. Pride Brokers Deals with the Devil (Ezek 28:16-17; 1Cor 10:20)
 - b. Pride Isolates Us from God's Presence (1Pet 5:5-6)
 - c. Pride Elevates Offense (1Cor 8:1)
