A Practical Study



- Begin with Scriptures that are easy to understand
- Let the Bible interpret and prove the Bible
- Understand the context
- Understand the original language
- Understand the time frame in history when the book was written
- Base your study on the Scriptural knowledge that you already understand

Ask, what does the Scripture clearly say?

Ask, what does the Scripture not say?

Ask, who wrote it? And, to whom was the book written?

Ask, who is speaking? And, to whom are they speaking?

Don't bring your own personal assumptions and preconceived notions into your understanding or conclusions.

Don't form conclusions based on partial facts or insufficient information, or the opinions and speculations of others.

Don't allow your personal opinions or convictions, regardless of how strong they may be to guide your study. Scripture must be your standard and guide.

Understand the difference between Prescriptive and Descriptive.
