We have been saved not just to avoid evil but to do good

Ephesians 2:10; Titus 2:14

Devotion to God that does not produce social justice and practical mercy is worthless

Amos 5:21-24; Isaiah 58:1-4

Idolatry: Worship of anything other than God; anything which causes us to think less of God

Injustice is the result of idolatry and immorality.

Isaiah 58:6-7

The need for freedom

V6: to lose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free The need for food V7a: Is it not to share your food with the hungry The need for housing V7b: And to provide the poor wanderer with shelter The need for clothing V7c: when you see the naked, to clothe them The need for dignity/respect V9b: (do away) with the pointing finger and malicious talk

God promises revival if our devotion to God produces a passion for social justice and practical mercy
