## **Because we have an Unrivaled Power**

*2 Corinthians 4:7-9*

Hard pressed - but not crushed

Perplexed - but not in despair

Persecuted - but not abandoned

Struck down - but not destroyed

When chaos says 'but why' ... God's power says 'but not'

## **Because we have an Unrivaled Promise**

*Psalm 91:1-2*

God IS Our Refuge, IS Our Shelter, and IS Our Safety!

It's possible to be physically evacuating but spiritually occupying

God's Promises cancel fears propaganda

## **Because we have Unrivaled Provisions**

*Acts 2:44-45, 2 Corinthians 8:1-3*
